4-H ENROLLMENT NOW OPEN!

Each year, you (members and leaders) must re-enroll in the 4-H program. Access the enrollment form at https://v2.4honline.com. If you are a returning member, enter your email address and password. If you have forgotten your password, click "Reset Password" to receive an email with a link to set a new password. Do not create a new profile if you have registered before!

For NEW members! We can't wait for you to join us! Please visit https://v2.4honline.com. If you have never enrolled in 4-H using 4-H Online, select "Don't have an account?" Select your state, "Nebraska 4-H Youth Development", and your county. Each household will have a profile, and individual members will be added under one profile. Choose a club or clubs. If taking a shooting sports project, be sure to select the 4-H Shooting Sports Club as one of your clubs, and then select your project areas.

NEW FOR 2023-24: <u>The list of projects in 4-H Online has been condensed into project areas.</u> Where there were over 200 projects, there are now only about 50 project areas.

If enrolling in Horse and Shooting Sports, those areas have not changed. You are required to select these clubs and projects due to the consent forms that are required.

Clover Kids will only have the option of selecting "Clover Kids" as a project in 4-H Online.

<u>All Members</u> will be able to bring <u>any exhibit</u> from <u>any project area</u> to the fair, even if they did not list it in 4-H Online. This means they will not need to decide on all the projects they want before they enroll. They will still be able to take exhibits from any project area to the fair by listing them on the entry form in June.

Projects should be selected if families would like to receive additional information regarding project-specific reminders, such as upcoming deadlines.

If your 4-Her plans to attend 4-H camp or participate in any state or national events, you must complete the health section. All other 4-Hers may skip over the health information. Then complete the consent section.

4-H VOLUNTEERS

INTERESTED IN BECOMING A 4-H VOLUNTEER?

Volunteers are the heart of 4-H. Whether you choose to start your own club or be a project leader on a special project, or serve as an activity worker at the county fair or other 4-H activities, your time and effort are valued as necessary assets to the program.

4-H Clubs that may need volunteers are marked with an asterisk (*): *Roone County 4 H Shooting Sports

- Club organizational leaders and project leaders will enroll as an active volunteer in 4-H online.
- All volunteers must sign the Activity Worker Guidelines and Volunteer Code of Conduct every year, as a part of the enrollment process.
- ALL NEW club volunteers must be screened prior to service, and complete a screening as a <u>direct</u> <u>volunteer</u> every 5 years.
- Club volunteers should complete at least two hours of training annually.

Volunteers not enrolling in 4-H online <u>will</u> need to complete the volunteer screening for <u>indirect</u> <u>volunteers</u> every year. This can be done by completing the Activity Application for the Indirect Volunteer at <u>https://ssp.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/</u> <u>SV_3KOb7BzT4uwj3cW</u>

If you are considering starting a new 4-H Club, the best place to start is the Extension Office in your county. The office staff will give you materials and information you need to organize a 4-H club.

Contact the Extension Office if you are interested in becoming a 4-H volunteer.

HOW TO ENROLL AS A VOLUNTEER

If you are a returning 4-H volunteer, you will need to enroll in 4-H Online at https://v2.4honline.com. Every 5 years, we need to go through a screening process with DHHS. Fortunately, Boone County is not on the list this year. Only the new volunteers will need to do the screening process.

If you are a volunteer that is affiliated with a Club, you will choose Club Volunteer, then either Organizational Leader or Project Leader. Parent helpers do not need to enroll as volunteers.

If you are a new club volunteer, please also select Program Volunteer, then Selected for Required Screening.

If you are a county volunteer (not associated with a club) you will choose Program Volunteer, and County Volunteer. This would be for 4-H Council members and other volunteers that may assist with the fair, but are not attending 4-H meetings.

CLOVER KIDS PROGRAM

The Clover Kids program can be a rewarding and fulfilling experience for parents, leaders, and club members. The joy of being a part of a 4-H program is helping young people grow and develop physically, emotionally, socially and intellectually as they "learn by doing". As a partner in the Nebraska Clover Kids program you are helping in the positive development of youth so they become competent, caring and contributing citizens, intent on "Making the Best Better."

There are also resources for Clover Kids, ages 5-7 (as of January 1) at https://4h.unl.edu/clover-kids. The program offers a variety of educational and recreational experiences in non-competitive environments. These opportunities are ideal for developing confidence, creativity, and competence during this stage of youth development. Clover Kids can join a 4-H Club, join an after school program, exhibit at the county fair, and attend workshops. Projects range from cooking, crafts, gardening, pocket pets, and bucket calves for example.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

NEBRASKA 4-H FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Nebraska 4-H Foundation offers 4-H members the opportunity to apply for scholarships. The Nebraska 4-H Foundation awards up to \$22,000 worth of scholarships each year to 4-H'ers from across the state.

To apply for scholarships, 4-H'ers must submit the Nebraska 4-H Achievement Application for statelevel review by January 5th. Youth must follow the application instructions available on the Nebraska 4-H Achievement Application webpage at https://4h.unl. edu/achievement-application. If applying for multiple scholarships, only one Achievement Application should be submitted.

The following requirements apply to all scholarships awarded by the Nebraska 4-H Foundation unless otherwise noted. Additional scholarship-specific eligibility requirements may apply.

Must be a current high school senior, graduating in Spring of the current year and attending college in the Fall of the current year or a current Freshman at an accredited university (see specific scholarship school regulations).

Must have completed one (1) year of 4-H and be current 4-H member unless otherwise stated in the scholarship-specific eligibility requirements listed below.

ENGLER SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is available due to the generosity of The Paul and Virginia Engler Foundation. Paul is a native Nebraskan who through vision, hard work, sweat equity and tenacity built an exceptional career as an entrepreneur, industry leader, and dedicated advocate for building bridges for the next generation to cross.

The Engler program began in 2010 with \$20 million gift over 10 years from the Paul F. and Virginia J. Engler Foundation. The Engler program awards approximately 80 scholarships annually. Over \$2,000,000 has been invested in students over the lifetime of the program. Students also can reapply each year during their undergrad time at UNL.

For academic year 2024-2025, the application will open on 10/1/23 and close on 1/15/24 at midnight. The only requirements to apply for an Engler scholarship – declare a CASNR major and have participated in 4-H or FFA. Awards range from \$1000 to \$4000 per school year.

The scholarship is only a small component of the value available to you through engagement in the Engler Agribusiness Entrepreneurship Program. Find the application and information about available courses and camps at <u>https://englerjourney.com</u>.

LIVESTOCK ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM 2024

We are excited to announce the fourth year of the Nebraska 4-H Livestock Achievement Program. This additional opportunity for enrolled livestock project youth is designed to promote all educational aspects of 4-H livestock projects including selection, production, leadership, and exhibition by recognizing youth striving to improve in their livestock project knowledge and leadership.

The program recognizes Members of Excellence across all 4-H livestock project areas, including: beef, sheep, meat goat, swine, dairy cattle, dairy goat, rabbit, and poultry.

The program consists of three levels that require 4-H members to plan and report a broad range of age-appropriate and project-related accomplishments. For each level, the Livestock Achievement Program provides a list of accomplishments from which 4-H members choose their goals. Each accomplishment is worth a specific number of points. Juniors, ages 8-9, submit pictures, poster, presentation, and other learning activities to receive the distinction of Junior Member of Excellence, no point value. Intermediates, ages 10-13, must complete 100 points worth of activities to receive the distinction of Intermediate Member of Excellence. Seniors, ages 14-18, must complete 150 points worth of activities to receive the distinction of Senior Member of Excellence. The Plan and Reports, linked on the webpage, show examples of the project related accomplishments they can choose, or they can identify their own with approval of their local educator.

Applications/Sign up are due June 15th through the application form link on the website. Plan and Reports, as well as Project Records will be due August 1 via the completion form on the website.

Youth completing the achievement program and receiving member of excellence recognition in the various species will be recognized during the Parade of Champions, 4-H weekend at the Nebraska State Fair.
