4-H LIVESTOCK NEWS

LIVESTOCK IDENTIFICATION PROCESS

- County Fair Exhibitors will need to submit Livestock Identification affidavits to the local Extension Office by May 15, including Horses.
- State Fair Exhibitors showing ANY and ALL Beef, Swine, Sheep, and Goats will need to complete an online nomination at https://showstockmgr.com/ by the June 15 deadline. Detailed instructions can be found at https://4h.unl.edu/livestock-id
- DNA envelopes will need to be submitted to the local Extension Office by June 15. This WILL include ALL BREEDING livestock, MARKET livestock, and FEEDER CALVES.
- Exhibitors will be required to complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) for the enrolled livestock projects any time prior to your event at County Fair, or by August 10 for State Fair.
- Visible EID tags will be required for all the following animals showing at State Fair/AKSARBEN: Market Beef, Market Swine, Breeding Swine, Feeder Calves.
- For any animal with an 840 EID tag, the owner will be required to obtain a Premise ID.
- A tattoo will serve as the official identification for Registered Breeding Beef.
- Commercial Breeding Beef may be identified with a tattoo OR EID tag.
- Scrapie tags are required for the ALL Sheep and Goats.
- Rabbits and Poultry are not required to be nominated; however, Rabbits will be required to have an ear tattoo for State Fair by August 10.
- 4-H Bucket Calf and Dairy Goat projects do not have a class option at the Nebraska State Fair.
- 4-H and FFA youth participants will declare in which youth organization they will show their animal projects by August 10.
- TAGS and DNA ENVELOPES ARE AVAILABLE AT THE EXTENSION OFFICE.

2023 TRACTOR SAFETY TRAINING FOR TEENS

Nebraska Extension and Central States Center for Agricultural Safety and Health at the University of Nebraska Medical Center, College of Public Health, have announced plans for the annual "tractor safety" training courses scheduled at 5 sites across Nebraska in late May and early June. Students will complete the first day of the course either by attending a hands-on event in North Platte or Grand Island, or online through the Extension Foundation Campus website.

The hands-on events will take place on May 22 in North Platte and May 30 in Grand Island. After successfully completing the hands-on event or the online course, and testing, the required driving test will be offered at six locations across Nebraska May 23 through June 8, 2023.

Teens 14 or 15 years of age who work on farms, or others who are interested in learning about safe farming practices, are encouraged to register for the certification course. Students under age 14 are not eligible for certification but the hands-on events are open to everyone in the community. Children under 14 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.
