TEAMS SHINE AT STATE 4-H HORSE BOWL COMPETITION

The Boone-Nance County Intermediate 4-H Horse Bowl team of Tinsley Neidhardt, Josie Rother, Lora Sonderup, Luke Sonderup, and Dorothy Smith outlasted all their competitors to capture the Champion Intermediate 4-H Horse Bowl title during Nebraska State 4-H Horse Stampede.

The State 4-H Horse Bowl competition was held on the UNL East Campus. The Boone-Nance County intermediate members competed in a field of 9 teams.

Competing in the Senior Division, finishing third, and receiving a purple ribbon was the team of Aidan Choat, Hunter Olnes, Abby Addision, Kate Maricle, and Maddie Kuta. The youth were tested on their knowledge of nutrition, feeds, anatomy, physiology, endocrinology, parasites, genetics, breeds, breed associations, judging, show rules, tack and equipment.

SHOWSTOCK MANAGER OPEN

For livestock exhibitors that are planning to enter beef, sheep, goat, or swine exhibits at the Nebraska State Fair, Showstock Manager is now open. Animals should be tagged and a DNA sample submitted to the Extension Office by June 15. EID tags and DNA envelopes are available at the Extension Office. Any retags should be reported to the Extension Office.

You will also need to obtain a Premises ID from the Nebraska Department of Agriculture at https://nda.nebraska.gov/adt/premises.html. If you have made nominations in the past, you will still have an account, and your Premises ID will already be listed.

If you are new to this process, any animal that you MAY take to the Nebraska State Fair should be nominated. If they are not nominated on Showstock Manager, they will not be able to go to State Fair.

The Great Plains Livestock Judging Circuit is a lineup of contests held throughout the state giving youth the opportunity to perfect their skills in preparation for the Nebraska 4-H Premier Animal Science Event (PASE). Qualifying youth must attend a minimum of two contests in addition to the PASE livestock judging contest in order to be eligible for awards and scholarships. The top 5 individuals in the Senior and Intermediate divisions will be recognized as part of the All-State Team during the Grand Drive at the Nebraska State Fair.

STATE FAIR UPDATE

The age of eligibility in 2024 will be <u>8 years of</u> <u>age before January 1</u> of the current year for all inperson State Fair events (livestock, contests, fashion shows, contests) and other state competitions (Fonner Park State 4-H Horse Expo, PASE, Premier Communications Event). Please check information on each specific event as it becomes available.

PROJECTS

ANIMAL PROJECTS

If you are new to 4-H and are interested in showing animals, there are several options. If you are a Clover Kid (age 5-7 as of January 1), you can bring a small pet or two. Or you can bring a bucket calf.

Older 4-H members can also bring market beef, breeding beef, feeder calf, sheep, swine, dairy, goats, cats, dogs, poultry, rabbits, or small pets.

- Animal IDs An animal must be owned by the exhibitor who enters it, and identified to the Extension Office by May 15 to be eligible for the County Fair. ID forms are available at the Extension Office, or online at https://extension. unl.edu/statewide/boone-nance/4-h-animalscience-information/. Ear tags are also available.
- Poultry do not need to be ID'd.
- Cats and dogs only need a vaccination record from the Vet showing that they are current on vaccinations.
- YQCA 4-H members ages 8 and older that are exhibiting beef, dairy cattle, meat goat, dairy goats, sheep, swine, rabbits, or poultry will also need to complete YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals) training or testing prior to the County Fair.
- Instructor-led training will be offered at the Nance County Extension Office on Friday, April 26 at 6:30 pm, and at the Boone County Extension Office on April 27 at 10:00 am, or can be completed online. A coupon code for \$3.00 is available at the Extension office to cover the cost of the inperson training, or to apply to the online cost. Please call the Extension Office for a coupon code, then sign up for the appropriate class at https:// yqcaprogram.org.
- Entry forms for animals for the Boone County Fair will be due in the Extension office on Wednesday, June 26.

For information on how to get started in an animal project, contact your 4-H Club Leader or the Extension Office.







HORSE PROJECT

The Horsemanship Advancement Levels program is designed to serve as a guide for instruction and evaluation of each member's progress. County exhibitors must complete Level 1 testing after 2 years (two fairs) in the horse project by June 1, 2024.

Horses must be identified to the Extension Office by May 15 in order to be eligible for county fair exhibition. These forms are available at Extension Office, or online at https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/boone-nance/4-h-animal-science-information/. The Horse Show will combine 4-H exhibitors from Boone and Nance Counties vying for awards.

Dates for the State 4-H Horse Expo will be July 13-17, 2024. State 4-H Horse Expo entrants must also complete their Level testing by June 1. 4-H members age 8 - 9 will be able to participate in Level I and Level II classes at the State 4-H Horse Show. Members 10 years and over will be eligible to compete in any Level, as long as they have completed the corresponding Level testing.

CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS

The Boone County 4-H Council will be accepting applications for camp scholarships through May 1, 2024. Scholarships can apply to any 4-H camp, and can be completed online at https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/boone-nance/4-h-clubs-materials/, or pick up an application at the Extension Office.

Applications should be returned to the Extension Office by May 1.

TRACTOR & EQUIPMENT SAFETY TRAINING

Federal law prohibits children under 16 years of age from using certain equipment on a farm unless their parents or legal guardians own the farm. Certification received through this course grants an exemption to the law allowing 14- and 15-year-olds to drive a tractor and to do field work with certain mechanized equipment. Certification is earned by completing a Hands-On Safety Day with written test (Certification Day 1), then completing the Tractor and Equipment Safety Training with driving exam (Certification Day 2). Successful completion of Certification Days 1 and 2 will result in certification for 14 and 15 year old youth to be employed on farms and ranches.

Youth under 14 years of age can attend Certification Day 1 if accompanied by an adult. They will not be able to drive equipment, attend Day 2, or become certified. Students under 14 must still register, but will not be charged the registration fee.

ENROLL IN 4-H TODAY

All 4-H members and volunteers must enroll for the 2024 4-H year. The website to enroll or re-enroll is https://v2.4honline.com. Step-by-step instructions for enrollment for new and returning members can be found at https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/boone-nance/4-h-enrollment-information/.

If you are a returning member or family, log in with your email address and password. If you have forgotten your password, you can choose "Reset Password".

If you are a new member, you can set up your account, add each 4-H member in the family, and choose a club or clubs, and projects. Projects <u>should be</u> selected if families would like to receive additional information regarding project-specific reminders, such as upcoming deadlines. If you forget to select a project, you will still be able to enter it at the fair.

Members can be updated/added through June 15. Keep in mind that it will not be necessary to update all the projects for in 4-H Online for the Boone County fair. The entry forms for static exhibits are to be turned in by June 14, and will contain all the pertinent information.

If you are taking a <u>shooting sports project</u>, be sure to select the Boone County 4-H Shooting Sports Club as one of your clubs, and then select the project areas. If you are taking the <u>horse project</u>, be sure to select Levi's as a club and then the horse project.

If you plan to attend 4-H camp or participate in any state event or activity, you must complete the health section. All other 4-Hers may skip over the health information. Then complete the consent section.
