#### **EXHIBITING ANIMALS AT COUNTY AND STATE FAIR**

- June 14 DNA for breeding or market animals going to State Fair are due. DNA envelopes are available at the Extension Office. Please return to Extension Office by June 14 at 4:00 pm, as the 15th is on Saturday.
- June 15 Nominations due for State Fair Livestock entries online. Go to https://showstockmgr. com and enter any animal you are considering exhibiting at the State Fair. Nominations are not required for Rabbit and Poultry, but Rabbits must have an ear tattoo.
- June 26 County Fair Livestock Entry forms due by 4:00 pm. These forms give us all the information we need for Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat, Rabbit, and Poultry, and the number of stalls needed for Horse entries. Please list the class numbers for poultry.
- July 1, 5:00 pm Nominations for Aksarben Stock Show are due online for exhibitors also going to State Fair and FFA shows. The DNA that is submitted for State Fair and FFA will be used for Aksarben, but the nomination will need to be done at https://aksarbenstockshow.com. (If you are ONLY going to Aksarben, you will need to get a DNA envelope there). More details on their website.
- July 5 YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals). If you were unable to attend one of the Instructor-Led classes, you can complete the online class at https://yqcaprogram.org. Be sure to bring your certificate to the Extension Office, or email a copy by July 5. Livestock exhibitors ages 8-18 before January 1 are required to take this class.

# June 14 - Entry forms for fair exhibits due in the Extension Office by 4:30 pm.

- This is for static exhibits, Horse events, cat, dog, and small animal exhibits. Please use the paper forms to complete your entries. The forms are available at the Extension Office or online at the above website.
- June 14 Fashion Show narrations are due at the Extension Office. Forms are also available at the Extension Office or online.
- June 25 Fashion Show, Clothing Construction Interviews (schedule will be sent to families), Horticulture Judging Contest, Favorite Foods Review, Presentation Contest, Live Animal Presentations, Music Contest. See Fairbook for schedule. This is earlier than in previous years.
- July 2 Check in all exhibits except Foods, Flowers, & Horticulture in the morning. Judging of these exhibits will take place in the afternoon. Bucket calf record books due. Booths will be completed.
- July 5 Foods, Horticulture, and Floriculture interview judging. Entry time based on interview schedule that will be sent to families.

### SHOWSTOCK MANAGER OPEN

For livestock exhibitors that are planning to enter beef, sheep, goat, or swine exhibits at the Nebraska State Fair, Showstock Manager is now open. Animals should be tagged and a DNA sample submitted to the Extension Office by June 15. EID tags and DNA envelopes are available at the Extension Office. Any retags should be reported to the Extension Office.

You will also need to obtain a Premises ID from the Nebraska Department of Agriculture at https://nda. nebraska.gov/adt/premises.html. If you have made nominations in Showstock Manager in the past, you will still have an account, and your Premises ID will already be listed.

If you are new to this process, any animal that you plan to take to the Nebraska State Fair should be nominated. If they are not nominated in Showstock Manager, you will not be able to exhibit them at the State Fair.

### **AKSARBEN NOMINATIONS**

<u>New for 2024.</u> If you are planning to go to the Aksarben Stock Show, there is an additional step for the process - Online Nomination. This can be done at https://aksarbenstockshow.com, where you can find the link for online nominations.

4-H and FFA families will only need to submit one DNA envelope but will now have to submit the online nomination in two different databases.

## **MORE EVENTS**

## **TRACTOR & EQUIPMENT SAFETY TRAINING**

Federal law prohibits children under 16 years of age from using certain equipment on a farm unless their parents or legal guardians own the farm. Certification received through this course grants an exemption to the law allowing 14- and 15-year-olds to drive a tractor and to do field work with certain mechanized equipment. Certification is earned by completing a Hands-On Safety Day with written test (Certification Day 1), then completing the Tractor and Equipment Safety Training with driving exam (Certification Day 2). Successful completion of Certification Days 1 and 2 will result in certification for 14 and 15 year old youth to be employed on farms and ranches.

Youth under 14 years of age can attend Certification Day 1 if accompanied by an adult. They will not be able to drive equipment, attend Day 2, or become certified. Students under 14 must still register, but will not be charged the registration fee.

Summer Schedule: June 7 - O'Neill (Day 2 only) June 11 & 12 - Grand Island June 13 - Hastings (Day 2 only)

Those attending a location that only offers Certification Day 2 must complete Certification Day 1 at another location, OR complete the virtual module <u>before</u> attending Day 2.

## IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO JOIN 4-H!

Members can be updated/added through June 15 to be eligible for county and state fair. The website to enroll or re-enroll is https://v2.4honline.com. Step-bystep instructions for enrollment for new and returning members can be found at https://extension.unl.edu/ statewide/boone-nance/4-h-enrollment-information/.

If you are a returning member or family, log in with your email address and password. If you have forgotten your password, you can choose "Reset Password".

If you are a new member, you can set up your account, add each 4-H member in the family, and choose a club or clubs, and projects. Projects <u>should</u> <u>be</u> selected if families would like to receive additional information regarding project-specific reminders, such as upcoming deadlines. If you forget to select a project, you will still be able to enter it at the fair.

Keep in mind that it will not be necessary to update all the projects in 4-H Online for the Boone County fair. The entry forms for static exhibits are to be turned in by June 14, and will contain all the pertinent information.

If you are taking the <u>horse project</u>, be sure to select Levi's as a club and then the horse project.

If you plan to attend a 4-H camp or participate in any state event or activity, you must complete the health section. All other 4-Hers may skip over the health information. Then complete the consent section.
