



## **GENERAL RULES**

Only those 4-H members enrolled in Box Butte County 4-H program by April 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year shall be eligible to exhibit in the County Fair and receive premiums, rosettes, or awards, or participate in any 4-H related auctions. Exhibiting at the County Fair is not the purpose of 4-H projects. The purpose of 4-H is to give youth and adults opportunities to acquire knowledge, develop life skills, and strengthen values that enable them to become increasingly self-directing, productive, and contributing citizens. 4-H projects, fair exhibits, and fair participation are simply tools that contribute to the 4-H mission.

4-H and FFA members must have been enrolled in the project area and exhibit only those items that comply with their projects. The guidelines set forth in this handbook are implemented to further the success of each exhibitor, their animal projects, and the animal show as a whole. Guidelines that are not followed will cause for disqualification of the exhibitor and the animal for that class.

**For any missed deadlines, 4-H enrollment, Ownership Affidavits, YQCA Certificates the exhibitor will need to present to the 4-H Council during a meeting as to why they missed the deadline. Upon the approval of the 4-H Council to allow the exhibitor to participate in the project, the exhibitors' name will be added to a "One-Strike" list. If the exhibitors' name is on the list for any other missed deadline the exhibitor will not be allowed to participate in whatever was late in the current year's fair.**

### **AGE DIVISIONS**

Unless otherwise indicated in the specific rules for each area, classes are divided into three age divisions (Junior, Intermediate, and Senior). The age breakdown is as follows: Junior 8-10, Intermediate 11-13, and Senior 14 and up. All ages will be determined as of January 1st of the current year. In areas where classes are divided into two age divisions (Junior and Senior), the breakdown is: Junior 8-11 and Senior 12 and up. All ages will be determined as of January 1st of the current year.

Please note that exhibitors who will participate in State Fair are responsible to check a State Fair Book to determine their eligibility. Exhibitors whose presence is required for exhibiting at State Fair (judging contests, etc.) must be 10 or older as of January 1st of the current year.

### **SUPERINTENDENT RESPONSIBILITIES**

Superintendents in each division will be responsible for:

1. Cage assignments
2. Barn Meeting with all exhibitors
3. Show order
4. Showmanship Contest
5. Recording of official placements along with 4-H staff
6. Sale order
7. Assisting of the clean-up of the Little Red Barn

Superintendents will have rule books and will answer most questions associated with projects. Any specific problems or complaints should be directed to the Superintendent committee and Extension staff and presented in writing so an inspection can be made at the fairgrounds.

The Box Butte County 4-H Council will serve as the fair 4-H rules committee, and reserves the right to change classes and requirements where necessary. **Any suggestions for improvement, complaints, or protests must be signed and submitted in writing on the NEW "Care to Share" forms before the August 4-H Council Meeting to be considered. The forms can be picked up in the 4H Office at the fairgrounds during fair week.**

## COUNTY FAIR REGISTRATION

The fair registration deadline is **July 1**. Please remember that all exhibits, except for gardening and flowers, must be pre-registered. This includes all animals, clothing, cooking, cake & cookie jar auction exhibits, etc. If you have any questions, please contact the office. In the event a policy is not covered in this handbook, the question shall defer to State Fair Rules.

## COUNTY FAIR ENTRY OF ANIMALS

Check the master schedule published with the fair book for entry times and show dates & times. Exhibitors showing dogs or cats need to be at the fairgrounds at least a half hour before the show is scheduled to begin. All Rabbit and Poultry exhibits need to enter at south entrance to the Red Barn to be health checked by a superintendent before they may enter or be housed.

## DRESS CODE

Required dress code for showing in both showmanship and animal classes at the Box Butte County Fair:

1. 4-H members in poultry, rabbit, and cat will be required to wear blue jeans, 4-H Council approved **long** sleeved T-shirt, and close toed shoes.
2. 4-H members in dog and small pets will be required to wear blue jeans, 4-H Council approved T-shirt, and close toes shoes.
3. FFA members will be required to wear a sleeved FFA polo shirt or official FFA dress.
4. In **All Species**, 4-H and FFA members will be dropped a ribbon placing for improper attire.



All exhibitors in **beef, dairy cattle, dairy goats, meat goats, sheep, swine, poultry and market rabbits** must have received YQCA training through the national organization, “Youth for the Quality Care of Animals prior to **June 1** of each year. Completion of training will be certified by the YQCA organization. Any exhibitor who **DOES NOT** complete the YQCA requirement on or before **June 1** of each year is **INELIGIBLE** to show or sell livestock at the Box Butte County Fair.

*Youth will be REQUIRED to complete their YQCA tests through the YQCA organization. If you took a written test through the Extension Office, these will be grandfathered in within your respective age level. If you plan to exhibit Swine or Beef at the State Fair, you will need to complete the YQCA tests to obtain a YQCA certificate number.*

**JUNIORS:** Ages 8-10 as of January 1 of the current year

**INTERMEDIATES:** Ages 11-13 as of January 1 of the current year

- f. Provide the certificate that will be available after all 3 modules are completed to the Extension Office in hard copy or email the PDF to [astevens4@unl.edu](mailto:astevens4@unl.edu).

**SENIORS:** Age 14-18 as of January 1 of the current year

- d. You will only have ONE CHANCE to pass this test with an 80% or better.
- e. If passed, this certification will last through the end of the youths' age level.
- f. Provide the certificate that will be available after all 3 modules are completed to the Extension Office in hard copy or email the PDF to [astevens4@unl.edu](mailto:astevens4@unl.edu).

## **ANIMAL PROJECT ID**

All rabbit project animals which will be exhibited must be individually identified, listed on the appropriate Ownership Affidavit and on file in the Extension Office on or before June 1 for all other species each year. The Ownership Affidavits are online at the Box Butte County 4-H website: <https://go.unl.edu/qfi7> or available at the Extension Office. Cat and Dogs need to submit their vaccination records (using the appropriate forms, found here: Cat: <https://go.unl.edu/d3un> and Dog: <https://go.unl.edu/w8pd> to the Extension Office by July 1<sup>st</sup>. Poultry and Rabbit exhibitors must complete the pre-entry form by July 15.

## **SMALL ANIMAL ROUND ROBIN**

The Overall Champion Showman of each species (cat, dog, poultry, and rabbit) will represent that species in the Round Robin Showmanship Contest, unless that person has won the Round Robin Trophy in the past. In that event, the Reserve Overall Champion Showman of that species will be the representative in Round Robin unless that person has won the Round Robin trophy in the past. If the Reserve Champion cannot be present or is ineligible for Round Robin, then the next highest point purple ribbon showman will represent that species in Round Robin. If the next highest point purple ribbon showman cannot be present, then that species will be represented by the animal only.

If the same exhibitor is Overall Champion of two species, he or she will choose which animal to show. Then the Reserve Champion or the next purple of the other species will be the representative in the Round Robin. Showmen will be allowed five (5) minutes at each species before proceeding to the next station. Scoring for each species will be done on a score sheet specific for each species. The score sheets are then collected and accumulated by a tabulator. Accumulative total points will be used to determine the Round Robin Champion. In case of a tie, the participants will answer the same question at each station until the tie is broken.

Dress Code: Round Robin Showmen will be expected to comply with the most restrictive of the dress codes listed under each species.

## **RED BARN RULES**

1. Coaching of exhibitors is strictly prohibited. The exhibitor is responsible for presenting their animal on their own merit. Anyone that is accused of coaching will be given one oral warning from either the superintendent of that species or Extension Staff. After one warning they will be asked to leave the show and the exhibitor will be dropped a ribbon placing.
2. Anyone interfering with the judge will be given one oral warning from either the superintendent of that species or Extension Staff. After one warning they will be asked to leave the show.

3. Any exhibitor observed cursing, displaying inappropriate behavior or if Extension Staff receives a public complaint, Exhibitor will first receive a warning. If problem continues they will be dropped a ribbon placing and if poor behavior continues they will be dismissed from the show.
4. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their own animals. All animals need to be fed and watered every night. There are a limited number of feed/water pans available. Exhibitors are encouraged to provide their own feed pans and water pans or bottles. A community feed supply will be available if you choose to feed it.
5. Each exhibitor is responsible to clean under their own pens. All exhibitors with shared pens will be assigned at least cleaning one shift. All exhibitors who have animals housed in the Red Barn during county fair must help clean the barn on the final Sunday of the Box Butte County Fair. Failure to do so will result in the 4-H/FFA member's being assessed a \$50 fee. Any animal not receiving proper care (feed, water, etc.) will be cared for by the specie superintendent after a verbal warning has been given and consulting the superintendent committee. The exhibitor will be assessed \$50 per day with payment being paid when the animal is checked out and before leaving the fairgrounds.
6. All exhibitors are required to attend a barn meeting held as scheduled. If you are planning on selling rabbits and/or poultry in the livestock auction on Saturday, you will also need to attend the livestock sale meeting as scheduled.
7. All exhibitors are responsible for hosting the Red Barn at least once during the fair week. Length of shift will be determined by the barn superintendent at fair-time. Length of shifts depends on the number of exhibitors participating in the county fair.
8. Exhibitors MUST be present at the show to exhibit their animals and to sell their animal. Exhibitors are responsible for checking in their own animals, you cannot have a substitute person. If a member cannot check-in or show their animal during fair week, they will not be allowed to participate.
9. In the case an exhibitor has more than one entry in a class; the exhibitor is responsible for finding a current Box Butte County 4-H or FFA member to show one of the animals for them. The additional showman must be a 4-H or FFA member. No parents will be allowed to show for the exhibitors.

## **GENERAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

Under no circumstances may animals under quarantine be exhibited. Only animals not showing signs of infectious or contagious disease will be allowed to show. Animals with lice or mites will not be allowed to exhibit and will not be allowed to remain on the premises.

Poultry being sold within the state do not have to originate from a NPIP-participating flock or be tested for pullorum typhoid. Poultry exhibited do not have to originate from a NPIP-participating flock or be tested prior to the exhibition. Some counties will be randomly selected to test birds that do not have documentation stating they were purchased from a NPIP- participating flock. It is highly recommended that you purchase your birds from a NPIP-participating flock, receive documentation from the seller (proof of purchase) and present that to the superintendent at county fair. Note that the current status for pullorum typhoid may change at any time.

Small Animals are required to have all need vaccination according to their species (example ferrets).

## **LIVESTOCK SALE**

4-H and/or FFA members may sell a maximum of two (2) animals at the annual livestock sale. If you exhibit both 4-H and FFA projects, only two animals total may be sold by each individual. This includes meat rabbits and poultry.

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be paying attention to the sale order and be ready with their animal upon their turn to sell. We do not want to disrupt the sale flow. Exhibitors not ready will be dropped to the end of the sale order.

Exhibitors wanting to sell poultry or rabbits will need to attend the Livestock meeting Wednesday night (see scheduled). All possible sale rabbits and birds must be weighed at the time of entry.

Exhibitors must inform Superintendent which animals they are selling in the 4-H & FFA Livestock Auction at the end of each respective show. Sale cards will be distributed at the Livestock meeting, and need turned into the office at the end of each respective show. No white ribbon animals will be sold.

Exhibitors must sell their own animals in the sale.

Members must wear Official 4-H dress or FFA dress when selling animals in the sale (See the dress code section for additional information).

The Box Butte County Fair 4-H and FFA Livestock Auction will be a Retained Ownership Option Auction. This offers an option to exhibitors in which ownership may be retained. The exhibitor must complete the sale card and clearly mark the animal as a retain ownership animal and turn them in after their respective shows. This will be listed in the sale bill and the buyer therefore knows the ownership will remain with the exhibitor allowing the exhibitor to show the animal at other shows if they so desire or keeping it as a part of their flock or herd.

Animals that go through a change of ownership sale are not eligible to show at State Fair or Aksarben.

Blank thank you notes and sale cards can be picked up at the Barn Meeting at the County Fair or they will be available at the 4-H fair office.

Livestock checks will not be mailed to exhibitors until a written, addressed and stamped thank you note has been submitted to the Extension Office. The thank you notes should not be sealed and may be randomly checked for content.

## Rabbits

Rabbits entered in sale must be from the meat classes and be a commercial breed. The minimum weights and ages for the rabbits are as follows:

Single Fryer, 3 ½ to 5 ½lbs and under 69 days of age  
Meat Pen Fryer, 3 ½ to 5 ½lbs and under 69 days of age  
Roaster (over 5 ½ pounds and under 1 year of age)  
Individual Stewer (4-8 pounds, over 12 weeks of age)

## RELEASE OF ANIMALS

All rabbits or birds sold in the Livestock sale, and purchased by a resale buyer may be released Saturday, of fair week after the Red Barn closes for the night. All other animals (not sold) will be released on Sunday, of fair week between the hours of 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. If an exhibitor removes a 4-H or FFA animal from the fairgrounds early, the exhibitor will not be allowed to show livestock the following year in Box Butte County. Permission for early removal of an animal may be granted by superintendents in cases of illness, injury, and funerals. Small animal superintendent must consult with other animal superintendents in deciding for early removal. Posters and displays will be displayed in the Red Barn and released on Sunday.

The superintendents shall have the right to have an animal removed from the fairgrounds if said animal is determined to be a safety of health risk to the public, exhibitors, other animals, or itself. It shall be the consensus of the superintendents on the removing such an animal. If said animal is dismissed because of a health risk, it shall be supported by a veterinarian opinion.

## CLEANING OF CAGES

All exhibitors are responsible in helping clean the Red Bard after all animals have been released. Failure to clean all cages at the Box Butte County Fair will result in the 4-H/FFA member's livestock sale premium checks to be withheld.

Exhibitors must be present for clean-up by **8:00 AM on the last Sunday of the Fair.**

# POULTRY

## Number of entries per exhibitor

4-H/FFA member is limited to a barn limit of six entries. (A Pair is considered one poultry entry.)

## Breeds

To be eligible for breed exhibition, the poultry exhibit MUST be a fair representation of one of the breeds listed in the American Standard of Perfection 2015.

## Minimum Weights

Minimum weights are according to breed standards listed in the American Standards of Perfection 2015.

## Exhibits will be shown by type

Each type will be divided into the appropriate classes, breeds, and varieties. If there are less than five, varieties will be combined and shown by breeds. If less than five exhibits of a breed are entered, the Superintendent reserves the right to combine breeds to provide for an orderly show. The Type, Class, Breed, Variety, and Age and Sex (Cock, Hen, Cockerel, Pullet) for all birds must be given to the Superintendent at check-in. Entries Must Be 4-H/FFA Project Birds. All poultry exhibited must be grown in a 4-H/FFA member's project.

## Poultry Showmanship

### Basis for judging:

Showmanship is based on grooming and training of the bird and the appearance and behavior of the exhibitor. Exhibitors are encouraged to present their bird to the judge. Presentation of the bird is up to the individual showman. Showmanship scores will be based on the criteria listed on the showmanship score sheet. The excellence of the bird is not considered in scoring. The judge may or may not ask questions of the exhibitor at the close of the routine. Exhibitor must wear 4-H Council approved long-sleeved T-shirt and blue jeans. FFA members will be required to wear advisor approved dress code. Overall Champion Showmen will be determined by total points. If there is a tie, oral questions will be given to break the tie.

*To conform to State Fair and Round Robin guidelines, poultry showmanship presentations shall not exceed 5 minutes. Points will be deducted for presentations exceeding the 5-minute limit.*

## RABBIT

### General Rules

ALL RABBITS EXCEPT FRYERS MUST HAVE PERMANENT ID NUMBERS OR NAMES TATTOOED IN THEIR EAR WITH AN APPROPRIATE TOOL. (Permanent market numbers written in the ears of rabbits are NOT permanent ID numbers. ID numbers or names along with class information must be supplied to Superintendent at time of entry.

### Number of Entries

A barn limit of six rabbits may be entered by one exhibitor. Market Pens of 3 rabbits will be considered as one rabbit entry.

### Rabbits will be shown by breed

All rabbits must be a part of the 4-H/FFA member's project.

### Rabbit Showmanship

All exhibitors are encouraged to enter rabbit showmanship. Basis for judging: showmanship is based on grooming and training of the rabbit and the appearance and behavior of the exhibitor. Exhibitors are encouraged to present their rabbit to the judge. Presentation of the rabbit is up to the individual showman. Showmanship scores will be based on the criteria listed on the showmanship score sheet. The excellence of the rabbit is not considered in scoring. The judge may or may not ask questions of the exhibitor at the close of the routine. The excellence of the rabbit is not considered in scoring. ARBA rules will be used as guidelines for Rabbit Showmanship. Overall Champion Showman to be determined by total points. If there is a tie, oral questions will be given to break the tie.

*To conform to State Fair and Round Robin guidelines, rabbit showmanship presentations shall not exceed 5 minutes. Points will be deducted for presentations exceeding the 5-minute limit.*

## **CATS**

### **CAT SHOWMANSHIP**

Exhibitors are limited to one entry in a showmanship class. Exhibitors will be given a score for showmanship based on handling of the cat. The total showmanship score also includes points earned from a cat knowledge test. The knowledge test is given to exhibitors prior to presentation of the animals. After finishing your showmanship presentation, the animal will then be judged.

*To conform to Round Robin guidelines, cat showmanship presentations shall not exceed 5 minutes. Points will be deducted for presentations exceeding the 5-minute limit.*

# CAT SHOW

## Number of entries

Cat exhibits will be limited to two animals per exhibitor.

## Age of Cat

Cats must be four months of age or older. Cats under four months of age will not be accepted.

## Combining of Classes

The Superintendent may combine cats and kittens into one class. Short hair and long hair will still be shown separately.

## Presentation of Cat

The exhibitor must present the cat to the judge. Animals must always wear a collar or harness with a leash attached. Exhibitor must always secure end of leash to their wrist. Bring a carpet sample for your cat to stand on. After finishing your showmanship presentation, the animal will then be judged. If showing more than one cat, the second animal will be judged after showmanship classes are finished.

## Cage Requirements

Exhibitors must furnish their own travel cages, feed, water and litter (secure homemade travel cages are acceptable). **Animals will be placed in 19" x 24" by 19" high joined cages or one larger, provided by the superintendent, after check-in.** Bring towels or material and clothespins, clips or pins to cover sides and top. Towels or rugs work well for bottom.

## Health & Vaccinations of Cat

Cats should be free of fleas, ticks, ear mites, ring-worm, any internal and external parasite and infectious disease. A veterinarian will be performing required veterinary checks on each cat entering the show. If a cat shows the possibility of being contagious, it will be considered a danger to the other cats in the show and will not be allowed to show. Cats that pose a danger to others will not be allowed to enter the building. ALL DECISIONS by the VET ARE FINAL. If a cat is disqualified due to the vet check, the 4-Her may perform in the showmanship part of the cat show, using another exhibitor's cat and are still able to place in showmanship, but are not eligible to receive grand or reserve champion. Exhibitors should also fill out the cat knowledge test.

Cats are required to have current rabies, distemper, panleucopenia, viral rhino tracheitis, calici virus and feline leukemia vaccinations.

**Proof of vaccinations must be sent in with fair registrations using the provided 4-H vaccination form: <https://go.unl.edu/d3un>. The vet requested all forms be uniform! You NEED to turn in this form by July 1 to the Extension Office!**

If the cat is not declawed, the claws must be clipped. No expectant or nursing mother cats may enter. Any cat not meeting these health requirements will not be judged and will be asked to leave the show.

# DOGS

## General Rules

Procedures described in 4-H 420, Guidelines for Nebraska 4-H Dog Shows published by the Nebraska Cooperative Extension Service will be followed in the County Fair 4-H Dog Show and State Fair 4-H Dog Show.

## Vaccination

All dogs must be immunized with DHL, Parvo, and Rabies. **Proof of vaccinations must be sent in with fair registrations using the provided 4-H vaccination form:** <https://go.unl.edu/w8pd>. Please be sure to fill out the form to completion

## Arrival Time

All exhibitors should check in at their assigned ring 30 minutes prior to judging.

## Number of Entries per Exhibitor

An exhibitor may make no more than two entries. For example, an exhibitor may make two entries in obedience or, one entry in obedience and one entry in showmanship.

## Disqualified Dogs

Females in season will not be permitted to be shown. Lamé or crippled dogs will not be permitted to show if it is determined by a show superintendent that it is affecting the health of the dog. Overly aggressive dogs may be disqualified at the discretion of the judge or superintendent.

## Age of Dog

A dog that is exhibited at county fair must be six months or older.

## Show Schedule

The 4-H Dog Show will be held in the Livestock Arena at the time listed in the fair schedule.

## Ownership

The State Dog Committee recognizes that neighbors/friends allow kids to work with their dogs when the immediate family cannot/will not outright own a dog. As long as the youth does the management/training with the dog(s), that meets 'ownership' standards. In the State Fair Dog Show, under P. - substitutions, it is inferred that a dog can be from another household other than the exhibitors.

## Baiting

Baiting with food or a toy is not permitted and is cause for disqualification. Handlers may use baiting action without food or toys. The judge has the authority to disqualify violators.

## Other Dogs & Puppies

Non-entered dogs and puppies are not allowed in the Livestock Arena/Barn area.

### **Advancement in Obedience Classes**

The following applies to progression within obedience classes-- Dogs receiving either purple ribbons or trophy in obedience class at a previous County Fair, must advance to the next obedience class. Experienced Handlers are those showing for the second year or more at any dog show, including AKC, fun matches, etc.

Handlers and beginning dogs may show only one year in Division A. If continuing as a team, both must advance to Division B.

Dog and Handler in Division B or higher must advance to the next obedience class upon receiving a purple ribbon or class award, except Open Obedience may repeat the class once.

There is no limit on the number of years a dog may be shown in the Utility Class.

Dogs with AKC degrees will show as follows: "CD" degree must show in Graduate Novice or higher; "CDX" or "UD" degree must show in Utility.

A dog will stay in its highest attained class. A 'new' handler will enter such class.

### **DOG SHOWMANSHIP**

Each class will be judged on handler's appearance 10%, grooming and conditioning of dog 20%, coordination of the dog and handler 50% and general knowledge 20%.

Showman will be allowed to compete in a division each year based on their age.

**Junior Showmanship- (8 - 10 years old as of Jan. 1 of the current year)**

**Intermediate Showmanship- (11 - 13 years old as of Jan. 1 of the current year)**

**Senior Showmanship-(14 - 18 years old as of Jan. 1 of the current year)**

### **OBEDIENCE CLASSES**

**Beginning Novice Classes:** All exercises must be performed on a six-foot long leash. Dogs must heel including figure 8; come on recall; stand for examination; long sit for one minute and long down for three minutes. The leash will be held by the handler.

**Beginning Novice Division A-** Handler and dog being shown are both in their first year of county, district, state, 4-H or any other dog show experience. Dog being shown may not have completed an AKC "leg" toward a CD degree.

**Beginning Novice Division B-** Handler **OR** dog is beyond first year of competition.

**Beginning Novice Division C-** Handler **AND** dog is beyond first year of competition.

**Novice Class Divisions-** Dog must heel on leash including figure 8; heel free; stand for examination off leash, come on recall off leash, long sit for one minute off leash and long down for three minutes off leash.

**Novice A-** exhibitor and dog is in first year of Novice Class competition.

**Novice B-** exhibitor and dog is beyond first year of Novice Class competition.

**Utility-** The dog will perform five exercises; the signal exercise, the scent discrimination exercise with leather, and metal objects, the direct retrieve, directed jumping, and the group stand for examination. Exhibitors must supply their own scent articles and gloves for the directed retrieve.

### Presentation of Small Animal

The exhibitor must present the animal and poster or display to the judge. Animals will be presented in their cage or environment. The judge may request an animal to be removed and presented if needed. Exhibitors are required to provide their own food, water, and litter for their animal.

*The Box Butte 4-H Council adopted the following Code of Ethics on June 17, 1997 on the advisement of the Fair Board. Exhibitors showing market animals must read, sign, return and follow this code of ethics*

**INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS  
NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS**

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall always deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structure classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

**The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:**

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules.
  - a. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animals either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the

time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

- b. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animals shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of the Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.
