The Box Butte County Fair **BB Gun & Air Rifle Shoot** is open to Shooting Sports members who have been in a club with a certified instructor and have attended safety sessions and practice shoots. Fair registration forms must be in the Extension Office by **July 1, 2020**

The Box Butte County Fair **Trap Shoot** is open to members who have been in the Box Butte Blasters Trap Club with a certified instructor and have completed the Hunter's Safety Course, meet the requirement age (11 years old by January 1), attended safety sessions, and practice shoots (**one practice shoot attendance is required to participate in the county fair shoot**). Fair registration forms must be in the Extension Office by **July 1, 2020**

All firearms will be inspected prior to the shoot by judges who will have the final say on all questionable firearms. Unsafe firearms will be disqualified, not the 4-H member. 4-Hers will be allowed to borrow another firearm. Pickup time will be announced on fair day.

Shooting Sports instructors will have the authority to set safety rules and regulations the day of the shoot and may disqualify any participant who endangers the safety of their fellow shooters or spectators.

Dress Code. To shoot at the Box Butte County Fair, 4-H Shooting Sports members are required to wear:

- a. Blue Jeans
- b. 4-H Council approved t-shirt
- c. Appropriate shoes
- e. Eye protection is mandatory

Division H990, Shooting Sports (BB Gun & Air Rifle)

Competition BB Gun will be held in accordance with NRA 5-meter BB Gun rules most recent addition. Target range will be 5 meters. Equipment and guns must meet NRA requirements (aperture sights allowed). Telescopic sights will not be allowed. The course of fire will be four positions (standing, sitting, kneeling and prone), 10 shots each position, for a total of 40 shots. The target will be a standard 5-meter BB gun target.

Competition Air Rifle will be held in accordance with CMP 10-meter sporter air rifle rules most recent edition. Target Range will be 10 meters. Equipment and guns must meet CMP requirements (aperture sights allowed). The course of fire will be 3 positions (standing, sitting and prone). 10 shots each position, for a total of 30 shots. The target will be a standard 10-meter air rifle target.

Division H990, Shooting Sports (Trap Shooting)

The competition Trap Shoot will be held at the Alliance Trap Club.

Age divisions are determined by the 4-H age as of January 1 of current year.

Intermediate Division – Targets will be a total of 50 shots. (50 singles at the 16-yard line)

40–50	Targets = Purple
25–39	Targets = Blue
0–24	Targets = Red

Senior Division – Targets will be a total of 100 shots (100 singles at the 16-yard line)

85–100	Targets = Purple
60–84	Targets = Blue
0–59	Targets = Red

Special Awards will be given to the Reserve Champion & Grand Champion Shooter in each division. The Reserve & Grand Champion in each division will compete in an additional 25 round shoot with top score being the Overall Champion. In the event of a tie, first one to miss a target loses. There will be a special award given for the Overall Champion.

STATIC EXHIBITS FOR SHOOTING SPORTS

4-H Shooting Sports requires youth to be under the direct leadership of a certified 4-H Shooting Sports Leader in either shotgun, rifle (bb gun), archery, pistol, black powder/muzzleloader, and/or hunting skills.

No firearms can be entered as an exhibit, nor live ammunition; however, information can be shared through pictures. Classes 004-009 can be entered by anyone in the conservation and wildlife area.

***D347001 - Shooting Aid or Accessory** - (SF169) - Any item which helps the shooter/hunter better perform their sport, examples: rifle sling, kneeling roll, arm guard, shotgun vest, target boxes, shooting stick, etc. Include your design, or plans you adapted, what the item is and used for.

***D347002 - Storage Case** - (SF169) - Any item with the purpose to safely hold a firearm, bow, ammunition, and/or arrows. Examples: soft sided shotgun case, quivers, firearm safe, include your design, or plans you adapted. Explain how the storage case is used.

***D347003 - Practice Game or Activity** - (SF169) - Invent or adapt an activity to practice or teach a project skill. Include pictures of youth playing the game, testimonials of 4-H members who played the game, what skill is being worked on, and directions for the game. Explain how you came up with the game or adapted it to fit the needs of your group members.

***D347004 - Science, Engineering, Technology Advancements of Shooting Sports, Conservation, or Wildlife Essay or Display** - (SF161) - Choose a specific area of shooting sports and share how it has advanced. Include a timeline and photos or illustrations. Keep your topic narrow and manageable. Essays are limited to 1000 words and should be on 8 ½ x 11 paper.

***D347005 - Healthy Lifestyles Plan** - Include a shooter's (hiker's, camper's, angler's) diet and exercise plan, and how the 4-H member will benefit or improve from following the plan. Ideally, the 4-H member would follow the plan and include some journal entries about adaptations or improvements made while following the plan.

***D347006 - Citizenship/Leadership Project** - (SF258) - Share a display on a citizenship project or leadership project the 4-H member took on individually or with a group to improve some aspect related to 4-H Shooting Sports, Conservation, or Wildlife. Examples could be range development, conservation planting to attract wildlife, a camp, or 4-H recruitment event. Include who benefitted from the project, what the 4-H member's role was, and any results.

***D347007 - Career Development/College Essay, Interview or Display** - (SF161) - Research opportunities for careers related to this area or opportunities for college majors or college activities to help discover using project skills beyond a person's 4-H career. Essays are limited to 1,000 words and should be on 8 ½ x 11 paper. Interviews need to include a picture of the interviewee in their work setting, questions asked, and a transcript of answers.

***D347008 - Community Vitality Display** - (SF161) - Explore the difference shooting sports, conservation, fishing, and hunting make in keeping Nebraska vibrant especially in rural areas. Present facts and research in an interesting way for the public to learn from.

***D3347009 - Ag Literacy-Value added Agriculture Interview or Research Project** - Explore how traditional ag producers are adding value to their production agriculture operations through conservation efforts, hunting, raising pheasants, shooting sports related tourism, etc. Present findings in an interesting way for the public to learn from.
