Pie & Decorated Cake Auction

5:30 p.m. July 27 at 4-H Exhibit Building

The Buffalo County FCS Project Action Team will sponsor a Pie and Decorated Cake Auction at the 2023 Buffalo County Fair. The top two junior and senior decorated cake and pie entries in the "Discovering Pies" and "Cooking 401" project areas will be eligible for auction to the highest bidder.

To be eligible, youth must be an enrolled 2023 Buffalo County member, 4-H age of 8-18, enrolled in the "Discovering Pies", "Cooking 401" or "Decorated Cake" project areas, and have met all project entry criteria and deadlines. In addition, the pie or cake must be sold by the 4-H owner who entered it. If the 4-H member is not present for the auction, they are not eligible to participate. Only <u>one</u> item per 4-H member is eligible for auction.

One-half of the money raised per pie/cake will go to the pie owner and the other half will go to the Buffalo County 4-H Council scholarship fund and the FCS Project Action Team in order to fund local FCS programs. To ensure success in selling your pie, talk to businesses, family members or other interested people. Extend a personal invitation to the auction and explain its importance.

Attention exhibitors who win awards

Grand/Reserve Champions, Champion/Reserves, and Outstanding winners will be responsible for placing their order online by August 7th. Each winner will be receiving an envelope, with instructions, after they have won their class. There will be options to pick one award. <u>If the winners don't select and place an order, they will NOT</u> <u>receive an award.</u>

Attention Breeding animal exhibitors

If you are exhibiting breeding animals at the Buffalo County Fair, you will need to provide a copy of the animal's registration papers to the Extension office OR you will be required to present the papers at check-in time in order to exhibit the animal in its breed class. If no papers are presented, the animal will only be eligible for a Commercial class. We will be glad to make a copy if you stop in or you can email a copy to jenny.kreikemeier@unl.edu.

Premise IDs needed to show at fair

Any new members, or anyone that has moved, showing a Market animal will need to have a premise ID. How to register static exhibits

All non-animal exhibits are called static exhibits. To exhibit in the 4-H project areas, members MUST have pre-entered the project online by the July 7 deadline. Every exhibit will need to have a static tag which will be tag that is visibly displayed with your project. Static tags can be picked up at the Extension office any time. Static tags will also be available at check in, but it's easier to have them filled out ahead of time. You will also need to create your own label to place on the bottom or back side of your exhibit with exhibitor name just in case your static tag gets separated from your project. 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Update

A Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Leader Update Session is scheduled for Saturday, August 19 at the Sportsman Club near West Point. The early bird deadline to register is August 9th with a discounted price of \$30. Late registration fee, after August 9th, is \$50. Fee includes program materials and lunch on Saturday but does not include lodging. The update is for enrolled adult or apprentice volunteer instructors who received their training in 2017 or before. These are an update for existing instructors, NOT a training for new instructors. Discipline updates will include rifle, shotgun, archery, and pistol. 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Certification

A Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Certification Workshop is scheduled for August 19-20 at the Sportsman Club near West Point. Volunteers will have the opportunity to become certified as an adult (21 years and older) or apprentice (14-20 years old) leader. Rifle, pistol, shotgun, and archery will be offered. The registration fee is \$85 per person for initial certification or those individuals adding an additional discipline except for Apprentice Instructors. The registration fee for Apprentice Instructors (14 to 20 years of age) is \$75 for this workshop. The late registration fee is \$150 for both levels. This fee includes meals, supplies and program materials. There are a series of four National 4-H Shooting Sports online modules which individuals MUST complete prior to the training to become eligible for certification.
