Buffalo County 4-H Shooting Sports preparing for winter season

The Buffalo County 4-H Shooting Sports club is planning their BB Gun, Air Rifle and Air Pistol season. The programs will begin in November, with start dates to be determined, in the Buffalo County Extension building from 6:30-8 p.m. Mondays will be Novice BB Gun, Air Rifle and Air Pistol and Tuesdays will be all BB Gun and split between Novice and Intermediate members. BB Gun members can choose whichever night works better for them throughout the season. For instance, if a school program falls on your chosen night, you are encouraged to attend the other evening. The age range for BB Gun is 8-15 years old. Parents must be in attendance at each meeting. **The club's organizational meeting is at 6:30 p.m. October 22 at the Buffalo County Extension building.** This is a great time to find out about the program and ask any questions you may have.
