Central and western Nebraska is the best place to fly kites. Each year the Callaway Kite Flight celebrates the winds of Nebraska and creativity. This event is held over Labor Day weekend and welcomes professional kite flyers as well as kids flying their first kite ever. It is a beautiful site to see with

the rainbow of kites in the sky. You will see kites of all sizes and shapes. My children loved the kites that would drop candy over the field. They would get so excited to see them flying and then run out and fill their pockets with candy. This event is so much fun for all ages.
