



4-H Enrollment

Enrollment Deadline May 1st



The 2018-2019 4-H year has begun, youth and volunteers can enroll in 4-H by going online to <https://ne.4honline.com>. To enroll, sign in with the email address that was used last year to login to your family profile and enroll. If you forgot your password, select the "I forgot my password" button. If new to 4-H, create a family profile, that lists all the members of your family involved in 4-H, by selecting the "I need to setup a profile" button. These instructions are on the website listed above, and the Buffalo County 4-H website: buffalo.unl.edu.

The annual enrollment fee for Clover Kids is \$5. Clover Kids are youth ages five to seven, as of January 1, 2019. The annual enrollment fee for traditional 4-H members is \$10. Traditional 4-H members are youth ages eight to eighteen, as of January 1, 2019. There is a family enrollment fee maximum of \$30. Payments in the form of cash or check can be dropped off or mailed to the Extension Office. Payments made online are done through this website: squareup.com/market/buffalo-county-4-h-council.

Make sure to select all project areas you want to work on during the 4-H year. In years past the projects from the previous year have rolled over, that is not the case this year. Each members account has been cleared, so you will need to make sure to select ALL project areas when enrolling.

Attention Volunteers

In 2019, **all** Buffalo County Volunteers must complete the online volunteer screening.

You will receive an email from DHHS after enrolling in 4-H online with steps on completing your volunteer screening. You will have 30 days to complete the volunteer screening starting the day you receive the email from DHHS.

2019 County/State Fair

For the 2019 Buffalo County Fair, Nebraska State Fair, all 4-H Market Beef and 4-H Market Hogs will require an 840 EID tag. 4-H Market Sheep and 4-H Market Goats will be using the scrapie tag for identification in 2019.

In addition to the EID tag, hair samples for DNA will again be required for market beef, market swine, market lambs and meat goats to be exhibited at State Fair in 2019.

For the 2019 Buffalo County Fair **ALL** Market Hogs will be tagged, with EID tags, **PRIOR** to county fair.

Fair Premium Book

The premium book will **not** be printed, but will be available online at extension.unl.edu/statewide/buffalo/fair-premium-book/. Changes to the premium book are still being

made. Or you can stop by the Extension Office and we can print the areas needed.

Animal Identification Forms

All county fair animal identification sheets can be found online at extension.unl.edu/statewide/buffalo/livestock-resources/, or can be picked up at the Extension Office. ID sheets are due to the Extension Office by June 1. ID sheets are needed for horse, swine, breeding beef, feeder calves, goats, bucket calves, dairy cattle, sheep, rabbits, and poultry.

Premise ID Needed

Any **new** members showing a Market animal will need to have a premise ID. To obtain one, please call 402-471-2351 and you will be asked the address where the livestock are being housed. Please call 308-236-1235 or email elizabeth.cast@unl.edu and give us your premise ID number.

Quality Assurance Certificates

ATTENTION ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITORS!

In order for the 4-Hers to access YQCA online training their enrollment in 4-H Online must be active. You can find the online YQCA course at yqca.learnrow.io.

When the 4-Her completes the online training they will need to print off the completion certificate and bring it to the Extension Office or email the certificate to Elizabeth at elizabeth.cast@unl.edu. All certificates must be turned in by **Friday, June 14th**.

State Fair Nominations

Again, this year, exhibitors interested in showing at state fair will need to do online nominations. Those showing **ANY** market beef animals must nominate their animals online at showstockmgr.com. Payment must be submitted to be eligible to show at state fair. **Market beef is now \$7 an animal.**

All other market animals (swine, sheep, and goats) have until **June 15th at 5 p.m.** to turn in their DNA envelopes to the extension office and nominate their animals online at showstockmgr.com. Payment must be submitted to be eligible to show at state fair. **Nominations for all market animals will be \$7 per animal.**

Anyone interested in showing breeding animals (beef, sheep, goats) will need to nominate their animals online at showstockmgr.com by **June 15th at 5 p.m.** Payment must be submitted to be eligible to show at state fair. **Nominations for all breeding animals will be \$2 per animal.**

Show off your party planning skills with this unique pre-fair contest open to all ages! Plan a menu suitable for an indoor or outdoor meal.

Individual County Division:

Members prepare one food item from the menu at home and bring it along with selected table service, two display cards and your own card table/eating area.

The food may be an individual serving or for family service. Recipes may be from any source. The table service will include dishes, flatware and table linens for two place settings plus centerpiece. Paper plates are acceptable. The display cards should be approximately 4 inches by 6 inches. Print or type the situation and complete menu on one card, and the recipe on another.

Display will be set up independently of adults. Members will be asked two or three questions concerning the preparation, menu or choice of table service. Dress should be appropriate for category.

Culinary Challenge Team Division:

Teams of two and ages 10-18 must use the challenge ingredient: DAIRY and table presentation interview must incorporate technology. All other guidelines follow the individual division of the Culinary Challenge contest. Culinary Challenge Team winners advance to state, if they meet eligibility requirements.

The Nebraska Youth Range Camp consists of a dynamic curriculum that appeals to students with a wide array of interests including, but not limited to, rangeland management, conservation, ecology, animal science, and

wildlife. With nearly 50 years to perfect and evolve this curriculum, every student, no matter what prior experience they have, will learn substantial information that will help them become more aware of Nebraska's most prevalent land use. Rangelands cover nearly 50% of Nebraska and approximately 60% of the United States. These numbers convey the dominance of this land use, but recently there has been several political issues regarding the management of these rangelands which further emphasizes the reason it is imperative for us to educate the youth so we may enable them to become proficient and effective leaders in resource management as well as educated voters. The students that attend this camp will be actively involved with lectures, field activities, hand-on experience, and recreational leadership and team-building activities that are all led by up to 20 of Nebraska's most respected and dedicated leaders, teachers, and professionals from various agencies, colleges, and universities. Each student will be sent home with a binder that is filled with educational materials. Must be 14-18 years old. Applications can be found online at nesrm.org/YouthRangeCamp.html.
