I am not a mother myself, but I was thinking how it is important to expose our children to different places, things, and opportunities. It can seem daunting and challenging even thinking about packing up your family for a vacation in another state or even just a couple of towns over, but the challenges, memories, and exposure you are giving your children by doing this can help their development. By exposing your families to places and people outside of their normal, you are setting them up to thrive in a unique environment, helping them better their problem-solving skills, and help them improve their interpersonal and communication skills all while making memories that will last a lifetime.
