

The Diamond Clover Award Program encourages youth to engage in a variety of programs, projects and activities that will enable youth to acquire skills and abilities that will prepare them for success in the future. The Clover Kid Record Book is designed as a beginning record keeping tool for 4-H members 5-7 years of age. Every Clover Kid completing a record book and turning it in by September 25 to the Extension Office will receive a \$5 incentive provided by the Butler County 4-H Council. Nebraska 4-H Annual Achievement Application for Awards and Recognition

The Nebraska 4-H Achievement Application is a standard application form used for the selection of county and state award winners, including Nebraska delegates to National 4-H Congress and National 4-H Conference, as well as Nebraska 4-H Foundation scholarship award recipients. To serve as a delegate for National 4-H Congress or Conference, youth must turn ages 15-19 during the calendar year in which the trip occurs. If you are interested in being considered as a delegate for these national experiences, you will make the designation on your application.

APPLICANTS

• All youth, aged 8-18, are encouraged to complete this application for acknowledgement of your annual achievements in 4-H and to be eligible for county and state level awards.

COMPLETING THE APPLICATION

- The application is designed to be completed electronically. Limit responses in the "My Experiences" section to a maximum of three pages, single-spaced, 12 point font. A fourth page is allowed for those applying for the National trips.
- In the selection process, significant accomplishments in your 4-H experience, leadership, community involvement and career spark (potential career choice) are given more consideration than number of projects completed.
- Please do not send a list of your awards. You may include selected awards as part of the "My Experiences" section of the application.
- Creativity is encouraged; use bullet lists, photos, infographics, etc. to help tell your 4-H story.

APPLICATION SUBMISSION

- Submit the following elements via email (butler-county@unl.edu) to Butler County Extension by September 25. Applications can also be submitted via mail or drop-off.
- The completed application will include:
 - An "About Me" page
 - The "My Experience" answers (3 page maximum)
 - Additional responses required for national experience applicants only (1 page maximum)

NATIONAL EXPERIENCE APPLICANTS

- National 4-H Conference is held in March in Chevy Chase, Maryland. This is the premier
 national civic engagement opportunity for 4-H members across the country. Delegates not
 only learn while at the conference but also have the opportunity to practice and apply in a realword setting their newly developed and refined skills. For more information, visit National 4-H

- National 4-H Congress is held in late November in Atlanta, Georgia. This program is an educational experience designed to make an impact. Youth will expand their skills, engage with other 4-H members and be inspired to make an impact in their club, community, country and world. For more information, visit National 4-H Congress | Nebraska 4-H.

TO BE A DELEGATE

- Applicants must:
 - Turn age 15-19 during the calendar year in which the trip occurs to be considered.
 - Not have been a delegate to the program in which they are applying.
 - Be able to miss one full week of school and/or work to attend the program.
 - Be a participant in the Nebraska 4-H Program in any delivery mode.
 - Be dependable and punctual.
- If selected, delegates will:
 - Participate in an orientation and complete pre-program assignments.
 - Check and respond to email and other online information regularly in preparation for the leadership experience.
 - Participate fully in the program.
 - Carry out follow-up responsibilities designated by the 4-H program.
 - Make public appearances for 4-H.
 - **Expenses:** The Nebraska 4-H Foundation provides partial scholarships. Delegates will be responsible for travel to and from the airport from home, meals to and from the leadership experience location, optional tours and souvenirs they wish to purchase.

COMPLETING YOUR APPLICATION

- One additional page is allowed for delegate applicants.
- As you complete your application, remember that while participation in 4-H programs, leadership and community are important, the information you share when you return from the leadership experience is equally important.
- You are encouraged to submit the application electronically. A selection team will screen
 applications. Applicants may be contacted for additional information.
- Chosen delegates may be required to travel to an airport that is not the closest to them due to chaperone location and cost restrictions.
- Following the county review, make revisions if needed and submit the applications for state review by January 15.
 - If you did not previously submit an application to Butler County, you are still eligible to submit by January 15 for all considerations of the state level award and scholarships.
 - All applications for state awards and delegate selection should be submitted via email to: 4HAchieves@unl.edu. Files should be labeled with the applicants last name, first name and county. For example, MeuschAlieshaButler.


