Tell us all about your 4-H experience! Through the 4-H Public Speaking Contest, youth can write speeches or a PSA and deliver them to an audience. Clover Kids and beginners can say the 4-H pledge, read a poem or share a short story.

Following are the categories:

Speech

Write and deliver a speech with 4-H as a major part of it.

- Clover Kids (5-7) May recite a poem, chant, read or tell a story
- Beginner/Novice (8-11 First Time) Never competed in a contest before (except for
- Clover Kid). May recite a poem, read or tell a story,
- Junior 10 and under (under 3 minutes)
- Intermediate 11 13 years (3-5 minutes)
- Senior 14 18 (5-8 minutes)

<u>PSA</u> - a PSA is a Public Service Announcement. It's like an advertisement for 4-H. The scoring is based on the content and the delivery, but not on appearance or gestures. In fact, you get to deliver the PSA "behind the scenes."

PSA's must promote 4-H. This year, the tagline Opportunity 4 All must be included. PSA's are 60 seconds long and you may use sound effects. PSA's follow the same age divisions.

Additional Information:

- You can do BOTH a PSA and speech.
- Youth 10 and older 4-H age are eligible to compete at the State Contest in June.
