

Tech Changemakers



4-H Online Enrollment is Open

Online enrollment is now open to enroll or re-enroll your 4-H'er(s) for 2023. 4-H leaders, along with Council members, are also required to enroll or re-enroll for the new year.

The enrollment website is **Sign In** (4honline.com). Google Chrome and Firefox are the recommended web browsers to use when enrolling online.

Annual enrollment fee for 2023 will be \$10 per 4-H'er. Payment is required at the end of the enrollment process.

Nebraska State Fair

With each new State Fair season, brings new possibilities and opportunities for 4-H families in Nebraska. The opportunity for 4-H to continue having its own weekend allows more flexibility for new events, entry limits, schedules, and space. We want to continue to take advantage of that!

As part of that process, we continue to explore age eligibility requirements for State Fair participation. After garnering user input, researching data from other events/shows/states, and looking that overall impact on youth development, the decision has been made to change the age of eligibility in 2023 to be 9 years of age before January 1 (of the current year) for all inperson events (livestock, contests, fashion shows).

2023 4-H, Communication Event

New in 2023: We will be joining Platte and Colfax Counties for the 4-H Communication Event! See the new date and location below.

Previously known as the Speech, PSA & Presentation Contest has a new name with a new contest added for 2023.

The Communication Event will include Speech, PSA, Presentation, and now a Video Communication contest. This event is scheduled for Sunday, March 26 at 4:00 pm at the West Education Center at Central Community College, Columbus.

The new Video Communication Contest is where 4-H youth may use a phone, laptop, or tablet to create a 60-90 second multi-media piece around a theme. County contest winners will have the opportunity to showcase their video at the State 4-H "Premier Communication Event" in June.

Nebraska State Fair Nominations

NEW: All 4-H/FFA **BREEDING** livestock, **MARKET** livestock and **FEEDER CALVES** will now be required to submit a DNA sample/envelope to be eligible to exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair. These envelopes will accompany the online nomination. Envelopes are due on June 15, 2023 and can be picked up at the Butler County Extension Office. Questions? House 4-H Program

NEW: Participation in a **District 4-H Horse Show will NOT be required to participate in the State 4-H Horse Show. This means that Districts will no longer be held - being replaced by the clinics.** Learning opportunities will be provided to horse program youth from the State 4-H Horse Program throughout the summer in the form of workshops and clinics in preparation for the State 4-H Horse Show. Keep watch for more information as it comes!

NEW: The speed/game events at the Butler County Fair 4-H Horse Show will be split into three divisions instead of two. Divisions are: Junior (8-11), Intermediate (12-14) and Senior (15-18).

Butler County Feeder Calves

Any Feeder Calf Heifers or Steers that plan to be exhibited MUST be born between January 1, 2023 through April 2023.

Beef and Swine Ear Tags

NEW: Beginning this year, beef and swine **county** ear tags will cost \$1/tag to purchase. This change is due to the swine identification process changing. EID tags for State Fair for both beef and swine are \$2.50/tag to purchase.

Swine Identification and Weigh-In Process

NEW: Swine will now be required to have tags in their ear by the **June 15 ID Sheet Deadline.** This is to streamline the weigh-in process during the Butler County Fair Weigh-In.
As stated above, tags will be \$1/tag for county tags. **Ear notches will NOT be accepted as a form of identification for swine moving forward.**

State fair, Livestock Nominations

State Fair Nominations will be online again this year and nominations are now open via www.showstockmgr.com. State Fair tags and DNA envelopes are available at the Extension Office. The deadline for ALL online nominations and DNA envelopes returned to the Extension Office is June 15.

youth for Quality Care of Animals - yQCA

Quality Assurance will be offered through the program YQCA, Youth for the Quality Care of Animals again this year! Aliesha Meusch will be offering <u>face-to-face sessions</u> at the Highway 92 Building and is available to conduct training at club meeting as her schedule allows. The deadline for quality assurance is <u>June 15</u>. <u>Certificates are due to Aliesha in order to have a comfirmation training was completed.</u> **NEW:** There will be no reimbursement for YQCA this year! If you can't attend in-person, you can attend a surrounding county or complete the training online.

Registering for quality assurance will be online at https://yqca.learngrow.io, using the Family 4-H Online login information for active youth. If you are in both 4-H and FFA, please register through the 4-H login option. Face-to-face sessions cost \$3 and online sessions cost \$12. This is paid online when you register. Youth will need to register online prior to coming to the face-to-face session. Face-to-face sessions will last at least one hour.

2023 Special Agronomy Project

The Nebraska Extension Special Agronomy Project gives 4-H members an opportunity to experience a crop that is grown, was grown or has the potential to be grown in Nebraska. Youth participate by receiving seed and resources to grow the crop, research traits of the crop and determine the viability of that crop in the part of the state they live. The project allows 4-H members interested in agronomy to grow something fun, new, and different.

The focus of the 2023 Special Agronomy Project is Tepary Beans. Tepary beans can be used like dry edible beans, forage, or hay. To participate in the Special Agronomy Project, enroll in the project through 4-H Online or call your local extension office to reserve seed by February 15. Find more information about the project by visiting Special Agronomy Project.

There are three ways to complete this at the county or state fair. First, an educational exhibit that can be in a poster format can include what you learned. Secondly, let your creativity go wild and create a video-type presentation explaining what you have learned, showing the growing process, etc. Finally, you can enter the crop itself. To do this, cut 6 stalks at the ground level and bound-together with supporting information about the project. For project specifications and details, be sure to go to the Nebraska State Fairbook at

The Nebraska 4-H Horse Stampede offers a variety of 4-H horse contests that do not require live animals, including public speaking, demonstration, quiz bowl, art, and photography contests. Youth have the opportunity to display their equine knowledge through these contests both as an individual and as part of a team. The 4-H Horse Stampede is held annually at the UNL Animal Science Complex in Lincoln, Nebraska. This year's event will be held **Saturday, March 25, 2023.**

There is a \$10 entry fee per participant and \$10 office fee per exhibitor. Event shirts are also available for pre-order. All orders, fees, and entry forms must be submitted online by March 6, 2023. Entry forms and more information can be found at 4-H Horse Stampede.

2023 Communication Event

Contests: Speech, PSA, Presentation, Video

Event Date & Time: Sunday, March 26, 2023; 4:00 p.m.

Location: West Education Center, Room 205, Central Community College, Columbus

Registration: Pre-registration required. Deadline to register is March 1, 2023.

Speech Contest

Age Categories, Time Limits, Topics:

1. Clover Kid (ages 5 - 7 on January 1, 2023)

3 minutes or less. Talk about anything! You may read a poem or a favorite story.

2. Novice (ages 8 – 9 on January 1, 2023)

3 minutes or less. Talk about anything! You may read a poem or a favorite story.

Should only be 1st or 2nd year speakers.

3. Junior (ages 8 - 9 on January 1, 2023)

1 – 3 minutes. Must be an original speech relating to 4-H.

4. Intermediate (ages 10 - 13 on January 1, 2023)

3 – 5 minutes. Must be an original speech relating to 4-H. (State Event Qualifier)

5. Senior (ages 14 - 18 on January 1, 2023)

5 – 8 minutes. Must be an original speech relating to 4-H. (State Event Qualifier)

Contest Guidelines:

- All speeches must be original and include 4-H as the major component of the speech.
- Many speakers in the Public Speaking Contest have given speeches in other contests. This is fine; however, previous speeches may not be used verbatim for the 4-H contest. It is okay to use the same ideas from a speech previously delivered in competition, but it must be 4-H related. Enough changes should be made to make that speech new to the speaker and the audience. 4-H public speakers may not use an old speech written by a sibling, other 4-H member, or anyone else.
- Acknowledge the source of information used in the speech. For example, an article from a magazine may be used for reference but should not be quoted directly unless you tell the audience your source.
- Organization: Introduction, body and conclusion.
- Use of visual aids and props are not allowed. Notes may be used for Clover Kid & Novice categories.
- Delivery: Eye contact, timing, gestures and posture.
- Voice: Clear tones, correct volume and good pronunciation.
 - Dress appropriately. Do not wear costumes or special effect clothing. 4-H Chevron required.
- No team speeches are allowed.
- 4-H'ers who are 10 years old and older as of January 1 of the current year will be eligible for Premier Communication Event (State Contest). Youth must be selected at County Contest to compete in the Premier Communication Event.







Public Service Announcement (PSA) Contest

Age Categories, Time Limits, Topics:

1. Clover Kid (ages 5 - 7 on January 1, 2023)

3 minutes or less.

2. Novice (ages 8 – 9 on January 1, 2023)

3 minutes or less.

3. Junior (ages 8 - 9 on January 1, 2023)

1 - 3 minutes.

4. Intermediate (ages 10 - 13 on January 1, 2023)

3 – 5 minutes. (State Event Qualifier)

5. Senior (ages 14 - 18 on January 1, 2023)

5 – 8 minutes. (State Event Qualifier)

Contest Guidelines:

- All PSA's are 60 seconds in length.
- The state theme for the 2023 Public Service Announcement is "Discover Your Spark in Nebraska 4-H!" and should be incorporated in the PSA.
- All radio PSA's must promote 4-H and be general enough to be used anywhere in Nebraska at any time of the year.
- All 4-H PSA's must include the following tag line within the last ten seconds of the PSA:
- "Learn more about the Nebraska Extension 4-H Youth Development Program at 4h.unl.edu." The tag line is included in the 60 second time limit.
- Sound effects and public domain music may be used. Copyrighted material may not be used.
- All PSA's must be the original work of the presenter. Contestants may not use PSA's written and provided by the state or national staff.
- No team PSA's are allowed.
- Scoring is based on the content of the material and delivery.
- Appearance and gestures are not judged.
- County Contest Only: Participants may read their PSA at the contest or submit a flash/jump drive to be played at the contest.
- If selected to go onto Premier Communication Event (State Contest), radio PSA's will be submitted electronically as a .wav or .mp3 audio format. No CDs accepted.

Presentation Contest

Categories:

Show 'n Tell (County Only)

- **Description**: A live presentation with a formal talk where youth will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something.
- Age: Clover Kids Only
- Time Limit: up to 5 minutes individual, no team presentation available for this class

Illustrated Presentation (Premier Communication Event Eligible)

- **Description**: An Illustrated Presentation involves one or two 4-H'ers giving a live presentation with a formal talk where the presenter(s) will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something. All presentation topics should be related to what the 4-H youth is learning through 4-H educational experiences.
 - Age: 9 18 as of January 1st
 - Time Limit: 6-8 minutes individual, 8-10 minutes team

Contest Guidelines:

- All 4-H Presentations should be related to how the 4-H youth is learning about through their
 4-H education experiences focused on the priorities of college and career readiness, community development, entrepreneurship, food supply confidence, health living, leadership development, and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics).
- Presentations must include an introduction (the "why" portion of the topic), a body (the "show and tell" portion of the topic) and a conclusion/summary (the "what" portion of the topic).
- Each participant is required to wear the 4-H chevron, 4-H emblem or 4-H shirt.
- All categories require the presence of the contestant.
- The judge views the entire presentation and engages in a question-and-answer session following the presentation.
- 4-H'ers who are 10 years old and older as of January 1 of the current year will be eligible for Premier Communication Event (State Contest). Youth must be selected at County Contest to compete in Premier Communication Event.

 - Time Limit: 60-90 seconds individual only

Your Spark in Nebraska 4-H!"

- Sound effects, public-domain music, and graphics can be used. Copyrighted materials may not be used
- For county contest only, the 4-H'er must be present to play video. If selected to go onto Premier Communication Event (State Contest), the video will be electronically submitted as MP4 files.






