CASS COUNTY 4-H NOTES



- 4-H enrollment will open mid October you must re-enroll each year. Please update your email, phone numbers or address when re-enrolling if needed. Enrollment deadline is June 15 - This is a State 4-H deadline we can not change this.
- **4HOnline** is where you enroll in 4-H and select all the project areas you are interested in.
- **Showorks** is fair project entry. Showorks normally opens the end of June beginning of July. Livestock entry closes about a week before Static entries.
- Static Entries are all non-animal exhibits, they are entered, judged and displayed in the 4-H Exhibit Hall.
- All youth showing Beef, Dairy Cattle, All Goats, Sheep, Swine, Poultry and Rabbits must complete YQCA training. Watch for more information in the 4HFridayNewsBlast.
- Livestock/Animals will need to be tagged or tattooed depending on species requirements.
- The Cass County 4-H Premium Book is not the same as Cass County Fair Open Class Book. While there are similarities, they are different. Cass County Open Class also puts out a tri-folder calendar of fair events, mainly Open Class events and times. The Cass County 4-H Premium Book is only available at the Cass County Extension Office and online.
- Cass County Extension Staff **DO NOT** judge any contests, static projects or livestock projects. We hire judges from the 4-H State Office list of approved judges.
- Judges placings are final and can not be protested.
- Registration for contests, and most workshops will be done in 4HOnline using the "Events" tab. You must be registered to participate in the contest or workshop.
- Deadlines to register, submit paperwork, etc. will be enforced. If you have problems let us know, do not wait until the deadline has past. Late registration and/or late paperwork may result in being docked a ribbon placing or not being able to participate in the event.
- 4-H Cake Auction is for regular 4-H age youth (8-18) **No Clover Kids**. 4-Hers must enter at least one exhibit in the 4-H section of the Cass County Fair to participate.
- The 4HFridayNewsBlast is a weekly newsletter emailed out every Friday, **PLEASE** read this email, it contains updates, deadline dates, changes that need to be made and other important information. Please check your spam folder as it may be sent there. If you do not receive the 4HFridayNewsBlast please email Tammy @tcavanaugh2@unl.edu.
- Once 4-H projects are on display in the 4-H Exhibit Hall **do not handle the projects or ribbon packets**. Our volunteers spend a great deal of time and effort staging the 4-H Exhibit Hall to look great. Let's keep it that way!
- Remember 4-H is a process, it is HIGHLY recommended that you start a project at Level 1 and work your way up as years go by. Once you exhibit in Level 3, you are not eligible to exhibit in Level 1 or Level 2 during your 4-H career.



4-H Expanded Learning Opportunities



What are 4-H Expanded Learning Opportunities? Expanded Learning Opportunities are learning experiences offered to students during school and after school hours, by local 4-H educators. 4-H clubs, Homeschools are also welcome to participate in these programs. These programs are designed to enhance the subject matter being studied in the classroom, provide hands-on education, introduce a new topic to students, or spark a new interest!

What do the 4-H ribbon colors mean?

In 4-H, we use the Danish System of recognition to recognize and reward young people for their efforts and projects. This system uses colors to signify different award levels.

Purple = Superior

A purple is awarded to entries that meet and far exceed the average standards established for that particular class. The exhibit or workmanship is outstanding with minimal flaws.

Blue = Excellent

A blue is awarded to entries that exceed the average standard. The exhibit and workmanship meet the standards of the purple ribbon but have a few flaws.

Red = Good

A red is awarded to entries that meet or are slightly below the average standard established for that class. The exhibit and workmanship meet expectations but have multiple flaws.

White = Fair

A White ribbon is the most misunderstood ribbon in 4-H competition. A white ribbon means the exhibit does not meet all minimum standards and improvements are recommended. It DOES NOT mean the exhibit isn't worthwhile!

Ingredients:

- 4 Pita Pockets or Pita bread
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1. Pre-heat your oven to 350.

- 2. Spread both sides of each pita with butter.
- 3. Sprinkle sugar & cinnamon on one side of each piece of pita.
- 4. Cut into small pieces using a pizza cutter or knife.
- 5. Spread on a baking sheet, do not overlap.
- 6. Bake for 10 minutes, remove from oven and ENJOY!
