February 1st is 4-H Spirit Day in celebration of Nebraska 4-H Month. Wear your 4-H t-shirt!


Enroll on 4HOnline for the 2024 4-H program year https://v2.4honline.com

4-H members must re-enroll annually to maintain their membership. If you have not already done so, sign-up today. Returning families/members should not create a new family profile, but instead, log into their existing profile, update contact info and projects, and sign permissions. Dues are \$5 or \$6 for horse participants, payable to 4-H Council. For step-by-step instructions on how to enroll/re-enroll visit our "Join Cedar County 4-H" webpage. The state has made the enrollment process a little easier. You no longer have to register for a specific project, they now only have the general project areas (for example all Clothing projects would be under Textiles, Quilts & Apparel). The only projects that you must specifically sign up for are Horse and the Shooting Sports disciplines because they have an extra consent form you need to sign. Signing up for the general project areas gives us an idea as to where your interests lie.


4-H Dues for each 4-H member or clover kid will be \$5.00 with the 4-H horse project participants' dues being \$6.00. All dues will be used to pay for 4-H programming in Cedar County. The dues also cover the cost of supplemental insurance which is \$2 for horse participants and \$1 for all other 4-H members. Leaders and volunteers may also purchase this insurance coverage for the cost of \$1 if they so wish. The insurance provides coverage to and from 4-H sponsored activities as long as an adult is present, this includes 4-H club meetings. Your dues cannot be paid online. Please make checks payable to the Cedar County 4-H Council and send to the Extension Office.

Seeing i2i

The Seeing i2i project is intended to help youth gain global and cultural knowledge, judgement, and skills needed to appreciate today's increasingly culturally diverse communities.

A130001 Cultural Fine Arts – can be made of any art media but should symbolize what makes them unique. **A130003 Name Art** – should be a creative art exhibit that symbolizes or explains where your name came from and what it means. Can use any media.

A130004 Family History – depicting your family cultural history or the ethnic make-up of your community noting who were the first settlers, where did they come from, is there evidence of the background today (local celebrations, family celebrations, museum or educational displays, historical markers, etc.)

A130005 Exhibit depicting a Cultural Food – that is special to your family. Can be a story or essay.

A130006 "This is Who I Am" Poem - written by the 4-H'er that reflects who they are.

A130008 Biography – about an historical figure who has made a positive impact on our society or who has made a difference in the lives of others.

Explore your personal or community culture through one or more of the above classes and enter your project at the 2024 Cedar County Fair!

Sock Snowman
