Static Exhibit Pre-Entry Forms due June 21!

Now that you have completed all entry information for any animals you plan to exhibit at the Cedar County Fair, it is the time to specify what static exhibits (non-animal) you plan to bring from within those project areas you signed up for on 4HOnline. You will need to print your fair pre-entry forms from the webpage according to the project areas you have enrolled in through 4honline. Go to www.cedar.unl.edu, then hover your mouse over “Cedar County 4-H” in the red navigation menu at the top of the page, then click on “Cedar County Fair & Pre-Fair Resources” in the drop down menu, then click on “Pre-Fair & Fair Forms Resources” link. All events and exhibits you wish to take part in or bring to the fair must be listed on these forms. **Fair entry tags will be made-up according to these forms.** See the static pre-entry forms instruction page on the following pages of the newsletter for more detailed instructions. If you have any questions on how to fill these out, please contact our office. **Paper copies can be picked up at our office or mailed. The pre-entry forms are due in our office on or before Friday, June 21** (our office is open until 4:30). You may mail, email, or leave your entry forms in the courthouse drop box on the north side of the courthouse. Included with the newsletter is a copy of the static exhibit pre-entry form, all other pre-entry forms (Clover Kid, Fashion Show forms, etc) can be found on the website. **Clover Kids** do not need to list their exhibits, their form assists our office in knowing what events and exhibits they plan to participate in and as to if they will or will not stall their animals at the fair. We will be glad to accept completed pre-entry forms any time before the 21st.

LATE FORMS WILL BE ASSESSED A LATE FEE

This will allow exhibitors to still show without being penalized a ribbon placing.

You will need to refer to your Cedar County Fair Exhibitor’s Guide (Fairbook) to fill out your pre-entry forms! If you have not received your 2019 Fairbook contact your club leader, or independent families can pick-up a copy at the Extension Office or view online on our Cedar County 4-H webpage under the Fairbooks & Scoresheets tab. Be sure to thoroughly read through the project directions to see what is required for the exhibit. Several exhibits require some kind of supporting information.

Recommendation when filling out you pre-entry forms

Depending on which search engine you are working in, you will need to **download** the form then save it to your computer, then type-in information needed, save, then print off or attach to an email to send to our office. (Note: We have the least problems with our forms when working in Google Chrome.)



ATTENTION!

For the fair, ALL livestock must be in their stalls by 6:30 pm Thursday evening and livestock weigh-in will be Friday morning July 19 from 6:00 – 7:30 a.m.






Cow/Calf Exhibitors

Your score will be based on 20% of your oral presentation and 80% on presentation of animals.

Release Time: All livestock and static exhibits will be released **following** the Livestock Premium
Recognition/Static Awards Program on Sunday, July 21. Youth may pick-up their fair premium money
at this time also. The 4-H building will be open Monday from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. for exhibits
still needing to be picked up. **NO EXHIBITS (static or livestock) MAY BE REMOVED BEFORE
SUNDAY** unless approved by the council for livestock health reasons.

Do You Have A Large Item To Exhibit??

Members having large items to exhibit are asked to notify the Extension Office in advance, so the
superintendents can plan their exhibit area. This includes furniture, picnic tables, etc.

Clover Kids Information



Clover Kids exhibits will be entered at the same time as the static exhibits. Entry times may either be Tuesday evening, July 16th, from 5:30 – 7:00 p.m. or Wednesday morning, July 17th, from 7:30 – 9:00. Junior Leaders or 4-H representatives will be available to visit with the Clover Kids about their projects on Tuesday evening ONLY.

Entry (identification) tags will be attached, and the exhibits will be arranged for display. The Clover Kids will receive a participation ribbon and a certificate with the number of entries they brought to the fair. Clover Kids are encouraged to be creative in their projects for the 2019 Cedar County Fair. They are encouraged to exhibit entries that fit into the five educational priorities of 4-H which include: Agricultural Literacy, 4-H Science, Career Development and College Readiness, Citizenship and Leadership, and Healthy Living. Please see the purple clover kid page in the back of the fairbook for explicit examples. We remind Clover Kids that they are allowed to bring a **maximum of twelve exhibits** (including events participated in prior to and during the fair) to the fair in any combination from the projects they are enrolled in within the five priority areas and from Clover Kid Camp projects. A pre-entry form for Clover Kids can be found on our Cedar County 4-H webpage under the “Pre-Fair & Fair Resources” section to let our office know what your child is planning to participate in, and if exhibiting an animal, do they plan to stall or pen it at the fair or take it home.

Since they are increasing their skills and their learning each year as Clover Kids, they should not duplicate the exhibits that they brought last year. The only exception will be the animal projects. They may bring their cat, rabbit, or other small pet if they choose. The animals must be confined (kennel, leash, etc). The pets come **only** for the interview judging process and then are to be returned home. Please use your own judgment; bringing pets is **not** required. However, please bring a picture of the child and the pet for display. **This is not a competitive process. Under NO circumstances do Clover Kids participate in any 4-H fair activities that include the judging process. It is important for these children to feel that they are a part of the fair activities, but it is participation only!**

Also, families with only clover kids are asked to help patrol the 4-H static exhibit building for an hour or two. If you have a specific time that would work for you to patrol please contact Jackie at jsteffen2@unl.edu. It's a great opportunity to get ideas for projects as your child becomes 4-H age.

2019 Static Pre-Entry Information

Cedar County Fair


The 2019 Cedar County Fair is fast approaching. Fair dates are July 17th – 21st. If you do not have a Fair Exhibitor's Guide (fairbook), you can find it on the Cedar County 4-H webpage or pick one up at the Extension Office. You will need to refer to it for Class Numbers to fill out your static pre-entry form. Please remember, **you are only eligible to enter exhibits based on the project areas in which you are enrolled.**

Pre-entry Forms will be printed from our Cedar County 4-H webpage. Go to www.cedar.unl.edu, then hover your mouse over "Cedar County 4-H" in the red navigation menu at the top of the page until the drop down menu appears, then click on the "Cedar County Fair & Pre-Fair Resources" then click on "Pre-Fair & Fair Resources". All events and exhibits you wish to take to the fair must be listed on these forms. Fair entry tags and show programs will be made-up from these forms. We recommend you download/save them to your computer, then type your information into them and print-off or save and attach to email to our office. **All pre-entries are due to the Extension Office no later than 4:30 p.m., Friday, June 21st** unless other arrangements have been made. We will be glad to accept your completed pre-entry form any time before the 21st. In fact if you already know what you are bringing to the fair, hand it in right away please!

Clover Kids are asked to fill out a pre-entry form to assist the office in knowing what events and exhibits your Clover Kid plans to participate in and as to if they will or will not stall their animals at the fair.

Static Exhibit Pre-Entries: Please list all static exhibits you plan to bring to the fair on the "4-H Static Exhibits" form except for Clover Kids, Fashion Show, Livestock, and Contests which have their own separate pre-entry forms. **All exhibits must be pre-entered.** List the entry number for each exhibit you are planning to bring to the fair. The entry numbers can be found in the fairbook. The entry number consists of department letter, division number and class number (example – Picture Story Display is in department B, division 180, class 902 – put together is B180902). The project areas are printed in the table of contents. Once you find the project area, the entry number can be found in front of the specific item that you are exhibiting. Please use the description column on the entry form to describe the item you are entering (if you were looking for the item in a display, how would you describe it?). This is helpful if the entry tag happens to get separated from the article. For horticulture and floriculture exhibits this is where you would list their variety name. Even though you may not be sure at this time about some of your exhibits, if you think there is any possibility you might bring them, list them on the entry forms, but please be reasonable in the amount of entries listed and the likelihood that you will be bringing them to the fair. The entry tags will be printed from the information you provide to us on your entry forms. Entry tags can be picked up at the Extension Office by July 6th. Entry tags must be attached to all exhibits for Pre-Fair Day and before bringing any exhibits to the 4-H exhibit building. All FFA static exhibits must also be pre-entered. Be sure to mark them as FFA entries.

Horticulture Exhibits: Pre-entry will be required on garden and flower exhibits. You may not know what some of your fair exhibits are at this time, so we are asking you to pre-enter all possible exhibits, but please be reasonable in the amount of entries listed and the likelihood that you will be bringing



them to the fair. You are limited to bringing to the fair a maximum of 10 entries per person in classes G773201 - 286; but, only one entry per class number. In addition each 4-H'er may also exhibit one entry per class in classes G773290 - 294. The **cultivar or variety name must be included on all entry cards for Floriculture and Horticulture**, except the educational exhibits.

Interview Judging: Interview judging involves a 4-Her visiting with a judge about their exhibit. It is meant to be an educational experience for the 4-H member. It is an opportunity to practice communication and interview skills that will be used in the future. Cedar County would like to start the tradition of having 4-Hers interview judge their favorite exhibits. 4-Hers are invited to interview judge up to 3 of their static exhibits at the Cedar County fair on Wednesday, July 17 from 9:30-11:00 in the 4-H Static Building. No need to schedule a time, just stop by during that time frame. In order for superintendents to know that you will be interview judging specific projects, please make a notation on your entry form in the left margin or on the bottom as to which exhibits you wish to interview judge.

Exhibits Entered As A Club: Please contact your leader if you are interested in any club entries. Example: Club Exhibit, Beef or Dairy Club Group of Three, etc. All clubs are automatically entered in the Herdsmanship Contest.

Open Class Livestock Exhibits: Any open class large and small animal exhibits must be pre-registered with the Extension Office by June 21st so that stall assignments can be completed. Open Class entry forms are available at the Extension Office.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE HAVE CORRECT INFORMATION!

All pre-entry forms must be filled out completely. All the pre-entry forms are due in the Extension Office by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, June 21st!

LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ASSESSED A LATE FEE.

Livestock Premium Recognition

The Livestock Premium Recognition will be held on **Sunday, July 21st**, following the Round Robin Contest, at approximately 2:30 p.m. in the Open Class Building. All 4-H & FFA youth exhibiting beef, swine, horse, dairy, goat, sheep, bucket calves, poultry and rabbits are eligible for a premium recognition. Refer to the 2019 Fair Exhibitor's Guide, page 8 for guidelines. Please review them. You must be **present and in your show attire (from your head to your toes) to be eligible**. Club t-shirts do not meet the show attire requirement and will result in disqualification. If you are not present, you will forfeit your livestock premium. It is the 4-Her's responsibility to follow the guidelines in order to receive a premium. 4-H members need to be at Open Class Building at least 15 minutes prior to the program beginning so there is ample time to line up. If you have questions please see the Extension Educator or President of 4-H Council.

Livestock Bedding

WOOD SHAVINGS are the ONLY acceptable material to be used for bedding at the fair. It is up to each 4-H/FFA member to bring their own. Don't wait until the last minute to purchase your shavings!! Not all businesses keep a big supply on hand. The exhibitor will be responsible for cleaning and removing the waste to a designated site throughout the fair

FASHION SHOW

Fashion SHOW entry forms are due in the Extension Office by 4:30 P.M. on Friday, June 21st. **The narration must be submitted ELECTRONICALLY for EACH entry to jsteffen2@unl.edu no later than July 2, 2019.** Narrations the day of the Fashion Show will **NOT** be accepted and 4-H members will not be allowed to model the garment. Since the schedule will depend on participation, the office will make the schedule for the Fashion Show after the narration deadline. The schedule times will be emailed no later than July 5th. **Note:** Clothing Construction judging runs from 9:00-11:30. Judges will **NOT** be available during Fashion Show judging. Please plan accordingly.

All MODELS and PARENTS are strongly encouraged to attend an informational modeling meeting at 12:30. This will help ensure that the Public Fashion Show runs smoothly and new models will learn how to properly model in front of a judge. Fashion Show judging will begin at 1:00.

Following the individual modeling, all members of each project will be asked to return to the judges as a group. This is only for the benefit of ribbon placing and choosing division winners. Members must model their garments at the Public Fashion Show at 5:00 Saturday, July 6th, at the Trinity Lutheran Church Hall, or your style revue premium money and awards will be forfeited.

CLOTHING CONSTRUCTION

Clothing Construction interview judging is “First Come, First Serve” as we cannot guarantee time slots. There will be four separate judges and judging will run from 9:00-11:30. Please plan accordingly.

The 4-H member must accompany their garment and will have the opportunity to discuss their project with the judge. All exhibits must have an entry tag attached. The 4-H Council reminds you that if you are unable to interview, contact the Extension office for an exempt form; interview judging exemption forms can be picked up at the Extension Office or one can be printed off of our Cedar County 4-H webpage under the “Pre-Fair & Fair Resources” section. It must be filled out and returned by 4:30 P.M. on June 21st with a detailed letter explaining why you cannot attend Pre-Fair Day. The information will be presented to the 4-H Council at their meeting for approval. (With their approval, garments will not be dropped a ribbon placing.) **All exhibits must have an entry form attached. Check the exhibitor’s guide for any supporting information required.**

CONSUMER EDUCATION PROJECTS (Shopping in Style) Notebooks/Posters for Shopping in Style must be in the Extension Office no later than 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, July 6th, if you are not modeling. You may bring your notebook/poster in at your scheduled modeling time. Modeling will be scheduled with the Fashion Show schedule. All exhibits must have an entry tag attached. Check the exhibitor's guide for more information. If you are modeling a Shopping in Style outfit, you will also be required to complete a written report with narration. This report is 50% of their fashion show scoring. **You may bring in the report at your scheduled modeling time, but a copy of the narration section must be submitted ELECTRONICALLY to jsteffen2@unl.edu no later than July 2nd.**

\$15 SHOPPING CHALLENGE entry must be a complete outfit. All parts of the outfit must be purchased. Accessories already owned can be used to complement/finish the outfit. Cost of outfit must be \$15 or less, not including shoes, accessories or undergarments. **Complete the written report with narration** found on our Cedar County 4-H webpage under the "Pre-Fair & Fair Resources" section or contact the Extension Office for a form. **You may bring in the report at your scheduled modeling time, but a copy of the narration section must be submitted ELECTRONICALLY to jsteffen2@unl.edu no later than July 2nd.**

FIBER ARTS – KNITTING, CROCHETING & SEWN QUILTS

All knitting and crocheted items and sewn quilts will be judged on Pre-Fair Day and must be entered by 9:00 A.M. on Saturday, July 6th, if not interview judging. Interview Judging is not required, but **strongly encouraged**. **All exhibits must have an entry tag attached. Check the Exhibitor's guide for supporting information required.**

STEAM CLOTHING NON-SEWN EXHIBITS

All STEAM Clothing non-sewn exhibits will be judged on Pre-Fair Day and must be entered by 9:00 A.M. on Saturday, July 6th. Interview Judging is not required, but strongly encouraged. All exhibits must have an entry tag attached. Check the Exhibitor's guide to see if supporting information is required.

PHOTOGRAPHY

All Photography will be entered and judged at the Extension Office on Saturday, July 6th. Photography not being interview judged will need to be entered by 9:00 A.M. on Saturday, July 6th. The Interview Judging Process will take place from 9:00 until 11:30 with a **limit of 3 exhibits** per exhibitor to be interviewed so that interviews will be completed before the Fashion Revue judging begins. This does not limit the number of classes that you may exhibit only the number of exhibits to be interviewed. Those who are interview judging may bring their exhibits with them. Photography will be kept in the Extension Office until Wednesday (entry day of fair) when they will be moved to the 4-H Building on the Fairgrounds for display. **All exhibits must have an entry tag attached. Check the exhibitor's guide for supporting information required on data tags and mounting requirements.**

CLOVER KIDS

Clover Kids are invited to participate in the Fashion Show. They will not participate in the judging process in the afternoon, but are invited to model at the Public Fashion Show at 5:00 on Saturday, July 6th. They **do not** need to submit a narration ahead of Pre-Fair Day. Parents will be asked to complete a generic narration upon arrival at the Public Fashion Show. Clover Kids modeling are asked to arrive by 4:30 so they may line-up and parents have time to complete the generic narration form.

PUBLIC FASHION SHOW & MUSIC CONTEST

The Public Fashion Show and Music Contest will be held on Saturday, July 6th, at 5:00 P.M., or following the Fashion Show Contest, at the Trinity Lutheran Fellowship Hall.

CAT, DOG, AND COMPANION ANIMAL SHOW
