

Livestock Quality Assurance Training & Herdsmanship Clinic

(a face-to-face instructor-led training)

Nebraska 4-H requires all youth enrolled in livestock projects (beef cattle, dairy cattle, goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine) to complete an annual quality assurance training through Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). YQCA is a national multi-species quality assurance program focused on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

Cost of instructor-led training is \$3

You will need to register online and pay this fee with a credit card **BEFORE** the training session in order for us to go in and verify that your child has completed the course.

Due to Children's Online Privacy Protection Rule (COPPA) parents will need to register children.

Parents will receive a confirmation email to validate. Add all your children needing to complete YQCA (this does not include Clover Kids) and submit. Complete the data sharing consent.

Now you are ready to purchase your YQCA training. Go to the Home Page. Scroll down and select a training you would like.

Click "Proceed to Buy" when you are finished.

Purchase course via credit card.

Complete pre-test.

Attend the training on either May 21 or June 11.
