



# 4-H Presentation/Demonstration Contest

An Illustrated 4-H Presentation, given by one (1) individual or a team of two (2) individuals, is a live presentation with a formal talk where youth will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something. Judge views the entire presentation and engages in a question-and-answer session following presentation.

- All 4-H Presentations topics should be related to what the 4-H youth is learning through 4-H educational experience focused on the priorities of career and college readiness, community development, entrepreneurship, food supply confidence, healthy living, leadership development, and STEM (science, technology, engineering, math). - Individuals or Teams (two members) may compete in any of the classes. There is no separate class for teams, just different time limits; individual 6-8 minutes, and 8-10 minutes for a team. Participants may be penalized if their presentation exceeds the time limit.
- 4-H Presentations should include an introduction (the “why” portion of the topic), a body (the “show and tell” portion of the topic), and a conclusion/summary (the “what” portion of the topic).
- 4-H members need not be enrolled in the project area in which they are presenting.
- Each participant is required to wear the 4-H chevron, 4-H emblem or 4-H shirt during their presentation.
- Live animals may be used in the presentation. All fair livestock health requirements must be followed. Presenters are responsible for the care and handling of animals. Animals can only remain in the presentation area while the owner is present.

Classes include:

**Class B151113 – Illustrated Presentation** - a live presentation with a formal talk where youth will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something. (6-8 minutes for individuals, 8-10 minutes for teams) Judge views entire presentation and engages in question and answer session following presentation.



**Clover Kids** – a live presentation (1-3 minutes) to show and tell others how to do something.

*Additional State Fair entry: **Class B151112 - Premier Presenter Contest.** Each County may select one individual or team (age 10 or above) from the Illustrated Presentation Class to participate in this event. Participant must be the top purple ribbon presentation. The top four outstanding presentations at the State level will receive a \$100 cash award.*

All participants age 10 and above who receive a purple ribbon at the county level are invited to participate at the State Fair.
