Youth ages 8-18 who will show beef, sheep, swine, goats, market broilers or market fryer rabbits at any fair are required to complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training each year. Training can be completed face-to-face or online. Go to <https://yqca.learnrow.io/account/login> to register for face-to-face training or to complete online training. Age divisions are as follows: junior 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18. Youth must be registered in 4-H before it will allow them to register for YQCA trainings. Greeley at 8:30 am; the Valley County Fair Grounds in Ord at 1:30 pm; and at St. Josaphat's Parish Hall in Loup City at 6:00 pm.

A Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Leader Certification Workshop is scheduled for April 6-7 at the Merrick County Fairgrounds in Central City. The deadline to register for the Central City training is March 27<sup>th</sup>. Volunteers have the opportunity to become certified as an adult (21 years and older) or apprentice (14-20 years old) leader. Six project areas will be offered at the Workshop - rifle, shotgun, and archery. The registration fee is \$110.00 per person for initial certification and those individuals adding an additional discipline and \$90 for apprentice training. This fee includes meals, supplies and program materials. The registration fee after March 27<sup>th</sup> is \$160.

Participants must make their own lodging arrangements. Registration on Saturday runs from 8:00 a.m. to 8:45 am

For animals to compete at State Fair/AkSarBen, they must be nominated at [www.showstockmgr.com](http://www.showstockmgr.com). You will pay a \$7 fee online for market animals and there is a \$2 online fee for breeding animals. The fees are to be paid online. Nebraska Extension and the Nebraska Corn Board are offering the seventh Innovative Youth Corn Challenge contest. This contest, open to 4-H members (age 10 & older as of Jan. 1st) or FFA members (in-school members), guides participants through all aspects of corn production, as well as agricultural careers related to corn production. As a team (2 or more participants), youth will be challenged to implement a production practice different than normal to determine if they increased their yield. Economics and sustainability of the practice will also be considered. Yields, cropping history, and production information will be collected in the Corn Yield Challenge management summary. Cash prizes and plaques are given. First place receives \$1,000, second place receives \$500, and third place receives \$250. Sustainability, crop scouting and “extra mile” awards are also given as cash awards. To participate in 2019, youth must complete and return an entry form by March 15<sup>th</sup> to the Fillmore County Extension Office in Geneva, NE. Through [Farm Credit Services of America's Working Here Fund](http://www.fcsamerica.com/workingherefund), organizations in Nebraska can apply online for community involvement grants. Grants are awarded of up to \$2,000 and \$10,000 each for projects and organizations that make a positive, long-term impact in the areas of Agriculture Education, Young and Beginning Producers, and Hunger and Nutrition. Applications can be completed online at [www.fcsamerica.com/workingherefund](http://www.fcsamerica.com/workingherefund). Grants are determined based on the specific selection criteria. The second grant application period for the \$2,000 grants will run January 1 through March 31, 2019, and the \$10,000 grant application period will run January 1 through June 30, 2019.

The Aksarben Stock Show will transition to junior livestock show format in 2019. Under the junior show model, youth from nine to 19 years of age are eligible for the competition with no prerequisite of youth organization affiliation. This allows for more junior exhibitors to show at Aksarben. Rules for the 2019 event will be written by Aksarben Stock Show management, versus the previous system of rules within each state operating independently.
