Central IV offices have moisture meters available for homeowners to borrow to monitor the moisture content of flooded material.

Youth ages 8-18 who will show beef, sheep, swine, goats, market broilers or market fryer rabbits at any fair are required to complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training each year. Training can be completed face-to-face or online. Go to <https://yqca.learn-grow.io/account/login> to register for face-to-face training or to complete online training. Instructions on how to sign up for all the trainings are posted at <https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/central4/4hforms/>. Age divisions are as follows: junior 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18. Youth must be registered in 4-H before it will allow them to register for YQCA trainings. Face-to-face trainings with Doug Anderson are on **April 22** at the Central Valley School in Greeley at 8:30 am; the Valley County Fair Grounds in Ord at 1:30 pm; and at St. Josaphat's Parish Hall in Loup City at 6:00 pm.

The Animal Science Department of UNL is excited to introduce dog camp, Fur Your Information! Through three sessions (June 3, 10, & 17), this camp will offer students (ages 8-18) the opportunity to learn and practice showmanship, rally obedience, and

The PASE/Life Challenge contest is June 17-18 at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's East Campus. PASE events include livestock skillathon, livestock quiz bowl, meats judging, poultry judging and livestock judging. Life Challenge events include the food and nutrition challenge, design or human development challenge and the ESI challenge. Youth must be age 10 before January 1, 2019. BB gun practice is at the shooting sports building on the fairgrounds in Ord on Mondays from 4:30-5:30 with air rifle/pellet gun practice immediately after. They follow the Ord school calendar. When there is no school on Monday, there is no practice.

Archery practice is held at the shooting sports building on the fairgrounds in Ord at 7:00 p.m. each Tuesday evening.

There will be a workshop on growing African violets and streptocarpus (close relatives of the African violet) on April 27th at the community center in Arcadia, beginning at 10:00 am. The workshop will teach participants all aspects of growing and caring for these flowering houseplants and everyone who participates will take home 2 or 3 plants to grow on their own. This is a free workshop and should last less than an hour and a half depending on class size. You must preregister with the extension office by April 22 and the class will be limited to 20 participants. Just for Valley County 4-H'ers: come county fair time, participants will be expected to bring their best plant or plants to the fair to be judged. Special awards will be given out at that time for the top specimens.

Join us for an afternoon of fun June 19 in Wolbach as we use elements and principles of design along with canvas and vinyl to create one of a kind reverse canvas projects from 1-3 pm. Age for the workshop participants is 8 and above. Cost is \$15. There

will be a class limit of 12. Youth will choose a design from the office and cut it out ahead of time to bring to the workshop.

Greeley County will host a beginner's riding clinic so bring your horse for basic showmanship, western pleasure and western horsemanship on Sunday, May 19 from 1:30-3:30 pm at the Greeley arena. Parents are asked to attend to help reinforce at home what the kids learn that day.
