Start hog show at 9:30 am CT. Estimated end time is 11:00 am CT.

Need to know for hog show:

- Please pull up in weigh-in order to the northwest door of the hog barn. Please have a family member move the trailer to the east parking area immediately after unloading. **ONLY ONE FAMILY MAY UNLOAD AT A TIME.**
- Please bring your hogs show-ready with spray bottles/buckets ready for quick touch-ups when you arrive. The wash vat will not be available without special permission from Extension staff for extreme situations that may come up during hauling.
- We will be very pressed for time between weigh-ins and show time, so please keep on weigh-in schedule and we will have the show order available as quickly as possible. Please be completely show-ready by 9:30 am regardless.
- After each family weighs in, we will sanitize the scale. Your hogs will be taken by a team of volunteers to their pens next to the show ring. 4-H members and 1-2 adults will have designated space by the pens to wait in. It is critical that we minimize the number of people in this space this year.
- There will be no bleachers set up, please plan to bring camp chairs to minimize cleaning needs. Sit in pods no larger than 8 people who are in the same household/close contact group. Maintain 6 feet between spectator pods.
- As long as you maintain 6 feet distance between non family/close contact groups outside the ring, masks are encouraged but not required.
- Youth will need to wear a mask while in the show ring. Judges, ring stewards, etc. will do the same. Some will be available but you are encouraged to bring/use your own.
- Ribbons will be placed in packets throughout the week and given out at the end of Fair instead of during the shows.
- **All livestock shows are “show and go” events. Unless you have other market animals to show that day, you are asked to load out the hogs prior to the goat/sheep show.** We have set aside approximately one hour to do this. The Livestock Committee will provide any needed details on this process at show time, depending on final set-up/entries.
- After the show, go into your sale profile and add your weights and placings!

- **All participants must follow “blow and go” regulations for this year’s event.** Please see the attachment for “blow and go” rules set by the Nebraska State Fair that we will be following.
- We will be very pressed for time between weigh-ins and show time, so please keep on weigh-in schedule and we will have the show order available as quickly as possible. Please be completely show-ready by 12:00 pm regardless.
- After each family weighs in, we will sanitize the scale.
- **For youth who do not need to also show hogs/beef, your sheep and goats will be asked to stall on or around your trailer until show time. Please contact Michelle if you have any special requests related to this situation.**
- There will be no bleachers set up, please plan to bring camp chairs to minimize cleaning needs. Sit in pods no larger than 8 people who are in the same household/close contact group. Maintain 6 feet between spectator pods.
- As long as you maintain 6 feet distance between non family/close contact groups outside the ring, masks are encouraged but not required.
- Youth will need to wear a mask while in the show ring. Judges, ring stewards, etc. will do the same. Some will be available but you are encouraged to bring/use your own.
- Ribbons will be placed in packets throughout the week and given out at the end of Fair instead of during the shows.

Need to know for market beef show:

- Please bring your market beef show-ready. The wash vat will not be available without special permission from Extension staff for extreme situations that may come up during hauling.
- **All participants must follow “blow and go” regulations for this year’s event.** Please see the attachment for “blow and go” rules set by the Nebraska State Fair that we will be following.
- We will be very pressed for time between weigh-ins and show time, so please keep on weigh-in schedule and we will have the show order available as quickly as possible. Please be completely show-ready by 2:00 pm CT regardless.
- After each family weighs in, we will sanitize the scale.
- **You will have the choice to stall on/around your trailer or a marked space in the barn will be available. If you plan to stall in the barn, please arrive in plenty of time to place your fans (no “butt” fans allowed due to liability concerns).**
- There will be no bleachers set up, please plan to bring camp chairs to minimize cleaning needs. Sit in pods no larger than 8 people who are in the same household/close contact group. Maintain 6 feet between spectator pods.
- As long as you maintain 6 feet distance between non family/close contact groups outside the ring, masks are encouraged but not required.
- Youth will need to wear a mask while in the show ring. Judges, ring stewards, etc. will do the same. Some will be available but you are encouraged to bring/use your own.
- Ribbons will be placed in packets throughout the week and given out at the end of Fair instead of during the shows.
- Beef showmanship will happen both Wednesday during the market show and Friday between the stocker feeder and breeding beef show. Overall winners will be chosen for each age level as usual. Video will be taken on Wednesday in case the judge needs to refer back as overall selections are made. If possible, please let us know ahead of time which day you plan to participate in showmanship.

- **All participants must follow “blow and go” regulations for this year’s event.** Please see the attachment for “blow and go” rules set by the Nebraska State Fair that we will be following.
- We will be very pressed for time between weigh-ins and show time, so please keep on weigh-in schedule and we will have the show order available as quickly as possible. Please be completely show-ready by 9:00 am CT regardless.
- After each family weighs in, we will sanitize the scale.
- **You will have the choice to stall on/around your trailer or a marked space in the barn will be available. If you plan to stall in the barn, please arrive in plenty of time to place your fans (no “butt” fans allowed due to liability concerns).**
- There will be no bleachers set up, please plan to bring camp chairs to minimize cleaning needs. Sit in pods no larger than 8 people who are in the same household/close contact group. Maintain 6 feet between spectator pods.
- As long as you maintain 6 feet distance between non family/close contact groups outside the ring, masks are encouraged but not required.
- Youth will need to wear a mask while in the show ring. Judges, ring stewards, etc. will do the same. Some will be available but you are encouraged to bring/use your own.
- Ribbons will be placed in packets throughout the week and given out at the end of Fair instead of during the shows.
- Beef showmanship will happen both Wednesday during the market show and Friday between the stocker feeder and breeding beef show. Overall winners will be chosen for each age level as usual. Video will be taken on Wednesday in case the judge needs to refer back as overall selections are made. If possible, please let us know ahead of time which day you plan to participate in showmanship.
- **All livestock shows are “show and go” events. You are asked to take your animals home as soon as possible after the show.**

M. GROOMING OF LIVESTOCK: Preparation and grooming of an animal should be the primary responsibility of the State Fair exhibitor; however, assistance may be provided by other State Fair 4-H or FFA exhibitors, immediate family members or another person acting in a mentoring and teaching capacity. The intent of this policy is to promote and foster positive youth development and a high-quality learning experience which are core values of 4-H and FFA. **All livestock shows will be “Blow and Go”. Animals may be clipped, blown, and brushed or combed to enhance their appearance.**

(FOR THE 2020 CHERRY COUNTY FAIR WE ASK THAT ALL CLIPPING BE DONE PRIOR TO ARRIVAL AT THE FAIRGROUNDS.)

1. All animals will be shown free of any adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products.
2. Any compounds that have adhesive qualities that when applied cannot be combed or brushed through or alter the color of the animal are forbidden. These products include but are not limited to commonly used adhesives and colorants such as Prime Time, EZ Comb, Tail Adhesive, Natural Hold, Ultra White Touch-Up, Black Touch Up, Black Finisher, black show foam, and baby powder.
3. Alcohol, water, oil, foam or any water or alcohol-based products with no adhesives or glue qualities, or artificial colorings are permitted. These products include conditioners and commonly used sprays such as Kleen Sheen, Revive, Final Bloom, Pink Oil, white show foam, Freshen Up, Silk, and Sudden Impact. Paint will be allowed on the hooves and dewclaws only.
4. Any animal found to have prohibited products applied (adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products) will be disqualified from competition. Any premiums (physical or monetary) will be forfeited and no refunds will be made. All animals will be subject to visual inspection and/or toweling (before and/or after entering the show ring) using a disposable blue shop towel for the presence of adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products. Toweling of the animal may include, but is not limited to, the topline, legs, chest, belly, flank, and cod/udder areas. If, after inspection, the animal is found to have adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products applied it will be disqualified from competition. Any premiums (physical or monetary) will be forfeited.
