4-H Clothing and Fashion Show Plan for 2020 Custer County Fair

Date: Thursday, July 16, 2020

Location: Broken Bow Evangelical Free Church and Challenge Center Building

Co-Superintendents: Tracy Popp and Kyla Olson

1. The judging day will not be open to the public. Allow only the 4-H'er and immediate family members (or appropriate adult) inside the building. Request that younger non-participating and younger children not attend.
2. **There will be no Public Fashion Show this year.** The number of family members that would likely attend would exceed the 50% capacity (seating capacity of the sanctuary is 350) of the church. The way the sanctuary is set for current Directed Health Measures allows for a maximum capacity of 175 people and we know that our numbers including 4-H participants and families will very likely exceed that number. We will take a video clip of each Fashion Show entry and compile a virtual Fashion Show that will be available for viewing at a later date.
3. Due to restrictions in number of people in either of the buildings at one time we will implement the following changes for this year:
 - a. Each 4-H'er will be scheduled a time to appear for Fashion Show and Construction Judging.
 - b. **Fashion Show entries will be limited to only 2 entries this year** in order to assure the judges can see and judge every entry efficiently. Construction entries will not be limited.
4. Fashion Show entries will be entered and judged in the Challenge Center building. We will provide 2 different classroom locations for changing rooms and assure that the 6-foot social distancing rules will be observed within those spaces. This will be accomplished by asking the 4-H'ers to come at a scheduled time to keep the maximum number of people in the space controlled. The use of the large gym space divided with mobile wall dividers will allow for enough room for superintendents, judges, and exhibitor to social distance.

Judging for Fashion show will happen with judge sitting at a table and 4-H'er modeling in front of the table. If more than one judge needs to be present, two tables will be provided. Tape will be applied to the floor to define the social distancing space so the 4-H'er is never closer than 6 feet from the judge. The comment writer will also sit at the table with the judge at the opposite end and on an 8-foot table a 6-foot distance can be maintained. The door monitor will be present to direct the 4-H'ers to the modeling judges and they will maintain appropriate distance as we have the whole gym space to spread out. **Comment sheets and ribbons will not be handed to the 4-H'ers at the time of judging. There will be no call backs given this year.**

Once the 4-H'er is finished modeling, she/he will move to the kitchen/classroom space where they will be recorded on video in their outfit as well as photographed in their outfit. The video and photographs will be utilized for the virtual fashion show as well as for display in the exhibit hall as needed.

A limited number of chairs will be provided at one end of the gym room to be used by family members who are waiting for 4-H'ers.

5. Clothing Construction entries will be entered and judged in the Multipurpose Room at the Church building. We will utilize the 4 classrooms, 2 childcare rooms around the multipurpose room and the conference room in the hallway for judging. Judges and comment writers will sit at an 8-foot table on opposite ends to maintain social distance. We will utilize a second 8-foot table so that the 4-H'er can also sit 6 feet from the judge. Hand sanitizer will be provided for the judge to use after handling the items they are judging. 4-H'ers will leave their items in the judging room. Comment sheets and ribbons will not be given to the 4-H'er at this time, they will be stapled to the storage bag containing the items at the end of judging.

Seating will be provided in a divided social distancing format for those 4-H'ers and families waiting to be judged. The space in the multipurpose room will allow for us to set up approximately 9 groups of no more than 6 chairs in each group and each group can be occupied by one family group at a time.

6. 4-H'ers with their entries will be placed on a time schedule to control the number of people present in each of the buildings at one time. The 4-H'er will be encouraged to appear for the Fashion Show judges first, then be videoed and photographed in their outfit. Next they will move to the construction judging. If a 4-H'er only has items to judged for construction, they do not need to see the Fashion Show judge or be videoed or photographed.
7. **4-H Clubs WILL NOT pick up dry cleaner bags at the Extension Office.** The dry cleaners bags that are used to protect the clothing exhibits will be available at construction judging and will be placed over garments after they are judged which will reduce the number of on and off and multiple touches of the garment and bags. Having the bags only available at the judging table will lessen their contamination.
8. Volunteers, staff, superintendents, and judges will wear a mask/facial cover or maintain 6 ft physical distancing. Hand sanitizer available.
9. We will provide hand sanitizing stations located near the entry tables in both the gym and multipurpose rooms.
10. We will provide prepackaged lunches for judges, staff and volunteers during a scheduled break, utilizing the multipurpose room seating for social distancing or by having the judges return to their judging rooms with their food. We will provide only bottled water or other beverages.
11. Group photos of winners will not be taken, due to the need to social distance. Any photos taken will be of individual exhibitors.
12. All exhibits will be held at the end of the day as we usually do and those items will have comment sheets and ribbons attached to them and then transported to the exhibit halls for the fair.

1. Social distancing for spectators per current health regulations.
2. Will allow enough room for volunteers, superintendents, judges, and exhibitors to social distance.
3. Orange cones placed 6' apart may be used to show where exhibitors and dogs need to stand with long sits, long downs, and while waiting for examination by the judge.
4. "Posts" will not be actual people. Superintendents will find something for "posts".
5. Volunteers, staff, superintendents, and judges in the showring will wear a mask/facial cover or maintain 6 ft physical distancing. Hand sanitizer available.
6. An examination table will not be used if judges cannot touch the animals. If they judge touches the dogs, both the judge and the exhibitor would need to wear a face mask, and the judge will need to sanitize in between touching each dog.
7. Dog Show programs will be emailed to the competitors. Dog Show programs will only be available for show staff/volunteers.
8. Agility Equipment:
 - a. Only have 4 people touch/move equipment. They use hand sanitizer after each person handles.
9. We may livestream or video the show. The video will then be placed on Facebook or YouTube.
10. Group photos of winners will not be taken, due to the need to social distance. Any photos taken will be of individual exhibitors or exhibitors in a household unit.

4-H Goat Show Plan for 2020 Custer County Fair

- 1) Weigh regular time on Sunday (sanitize between families) and set classes.
- 2) Stalling - Details on stalling will be announced at a later date.
- 3) Wash rack, regular use but with social distancing.
- 4) Will email and have programs on website.
- 5) Volunteers, staff, superintendents, and judges in the showring will wear a mask/facial cover or maintain 6 ft physical distancing. Hand sanitizer available. Cones or small flags will mark where kids line up.

- 2) Weigh regular time on Sunday. Weigh by families. Schedule times for each family to weigh. Sanitize scales and hands between families. Superintendents will make the classes.
- 3) Check in breeding sheep by family. Superintendents will walk around to pens to see what breeding animals were brought to the fair.
- 4) Stalling - Details on stalling will be announced at a later date.
- 5) Use the wash racks normally, but with social distancing.
- 6) Print show programs for the superintendents, judge, and volunteers. Email programs to sheep families and post programs on website.
- 7) We may livestream or video the show. The video will then be placed on Facebook or YouTube.

4-H Shooting Sports-Firearms Event Plan for the 2020 Custer County Fair

1. The County Fair shooting matches will be **CANCELLED** in-person events due to these factors:
 - a. Will not be easy to social distance by competitors, coaches who are not from the competitors household, and stat office.
 - b. Would have to make the match only open to the competitor and coach...no spectators, due to space and the rated occupancy of the building.
 - c. Clubs have not been able to practice. The new members to the program may not have even had the opportunity to practice yet. This is a safety issue.
 - d. Not sure we can get enough volunteers needed to help with the event because of the need to social distance and volunteers/judges that are considered high-risk for COVID-19.
 - e. Would not be able to eliminate the many common touch surfaces needed to check-in and approve equipment, moving of target boxes, placement of target on backstops, etc.
 - f. We feel that shooters may need to wear a mask if their coach is not from the same household. This may prove to be a safety issue if competitors are not used to wearing a mask while shooting.
 - g. Would need to limit the number of disciplines that competitors could participate in due to the need to leave 2 empty shooting lanes between exhibitors to social distance. It would take twice as long or more to shoot the number of exhibitors who would like to compete. The matches have been two full days as it has been.
 - h. The need to sanitize all shared equipment and firing points between competitors.

2. A "Postal Match" will be offered instead of an in-person county fair event this year.
 - a. Certified club instructors in the specific disciplines offered at the county fair would conduct a match with their own club members.
 - b. The match must be conducted as an actual competition style match, using the same rules as stated in the premium book, range commands, time limits (including prep times), shooting distances, etc., as is used at a county fair.
 - c. The competitor would be required to shoot all of their positions for a particular discipline once they begin their match. Example: Competitors would not be able to shoot BB Gun prone position on one day, then shoot their BB Gun kneeling at another time.
 - d. Club instructors would pick up the targets needed for their exhibitors from the Extension Office, along with the office target stickers.
 - e. By conducting a "postal match," competitors would not be limited to the number of disciplines they could compete in.
 - f. Exhibitors would still need to enter on their Entry Forms by June 26, and complete the Shooting Relay Form.
 - g. **Club "postal matches" must be shot between August 1 and November 1, 2020.**

- h. Certified club instructors could shoot their club “postal match” at their shooting practice facility or contact Michelle Nelson to schedule the Shooting Sports Building. It is strongly encouraged for all groups to shoot their matches at the Shooting Sports Building, as all distances are already marked.
- i. Targets must be turned in to the Extension Office from certified club instructors by November 2, 2020.
- j. A scoring committee will meet soon after November 2 to score all of the targets.
- k. All club “postal matches” and scoring will be conducted using social distancing, sanitizing, and face masks (if social distancing is not possible), according to the HDM and CDC guidelines on their contest date.
- l. More specific details of scoring will be compiled at a later date by superintendents and shared with competitors.
- m. Final scores could be emailed to competitors and placed on a website for review
- n. Awards would be bundled by club for leaders to pick up after the scoring process has been completed.

4-H Small Animal Pet Show Plan for the 2020 Custer County Fair

1. **Show will not be open to the public.** Allow only immediate family members inside the building. Arrange seating for households to social distance.
2. Will have a waiting area, with chairs on the north side of the building where there is shade, for exhibitors and families when the maximum capacity has been reached inside the building.
3. Set up 3 tables at the west end of the room for judging. Will allow enough room for superintendents, judge, and exhibitor to social distance.
4. If it is not possible to social distance, masks will be required to be worn. The judge will wear a mask when interviewing the exhibitor. Exhibitors are encouraged to wear masks, but optional as long as the judge and superintendents are wearing masks when they can't social distance.
5. The microphone will be sanitized between anyone speaking.
6. Each exhibitor should provide their own carpet square for the show. This carpet could be used by multiple exhibitors in the household.
7. Showmanship and the animal will be judged at the same time to minimize contact between the judge and the exhibitor.
8. Programs will be emailed to exhibitor families.
9. Will avoid sharing of pens, pencils, clipboards between superintendents and judge.
10. One superintendent will be in charge of the scoresheets and one superintendent will be in charge of handing out ribbons and awards.
11. Judges are not to touch the animals. If the judge needs to touch the animal, hand sanitizer will be used by the judge between inspection of animals. That is a practice that has always been used at the Small Animal Pet Show.
12. To sanitize, we may have wipes made with the UNL hand sanitizer.
13. We will livestream or video the show, since the show will not be open to the public, if we can find someone with the equipment needed and is willing to do that. The video will then be placed on Facebook or YouTube.
14. If we can't find a judge who is willing to judge in-person, we will conduct a virtual show via ZOOM. Exhibitors will need to come to the Shooting Sports Building for the ZOOM.
15. Group photos of winners will not be taken, due to the need to social distance. Any photos taken will be of individual exhibitors.

1. Extend judging times on Wednesday, July 22 ...9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Schedule times for families to arrive for interview judging.
2. 4-H'ers will enter the **4-H Building** on the north side. Someone will be at the door allowing exhibitors in as judges are available. Will have a waiting area on the north side of the building where there is shade, for exhibitors and families when all of the judging tables are occupied. Families may wish to bring lawn chairs. When judging is completed, the 4-H'er will exit through the front south doors of the 4-H Building.

4-H'ers with judging in the **Exhibit Hall**, will enter the west door. Someone will be at the door allowing exhibitors in as judges are available. Will have a waiting area on the west side of the building for exhibitors and families when all of the judging tables are occupied. 4-H'ers may wait on the north side of the 4-H Building if judges are busy. Families may wish to bring lawn chairs. When judging is completed, the 4-H'er will exit through the east doors of the Building.
3. Set up judging tables around the inside perimeter of the building to better be able to social distance. The only persons at the judging tables will be the judge and the 4-H member...possibly an assistant to record ribbon placings. Judges will write their own comments. Siblings will not be allowed in the buildings. Parents will be allowed, only if needed.
4. Hand sanitizer will be located at each judging table. Judges and assistants will sanitize between 4-H members.
5. Ribbons will be attached to exhibits by only designated people, to avoid touch surfaces. Ribbons will be attached in the small room of the 4-H Building and at a specified table in the 4-H Exhibit Hall.
6. Restrooms in the 4-H Building will be closed to the public. Staff, volunteers, and judges will be allowed to use the restrooms in the 4-H Building. They will be sanitized every 2 hours.
7. If it is not possible to social distance, masks will be required to be worn. The judge will wear a mask when interviewing the exhibitor. Exhibitors are encouraged to wear masks, but optional as long as the judge and superintendents are wearing masks when they can't social distance.
8. Will avoid sharing of pens, pencils, clipboards between superintendents and judge.
9. Lunches for judges and volunteers will be provided as a sack-type lunch and bottled water.

Saturday, July 25, 2020 - Interview Judging (Foods)

1. Extend judging times on Saturday, July 25 ...9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. Schedule times for families to arrive for interview judging.
2. 4-H'ers will enter the 4-H Building on the north side. Someone will be at the door allowing exhibitors in as judges are available. Will have a waiting area on the north side of the building where there is shade, for exhibitors and families when all of the judging tables are occupied. Families may wish to bring lawn chairs. When judging is completed, the 4-H'er will exit through the front south doors of the 4-H Building.
3. Set up judging tables around the inside perimeter of the building to better be able to social distance. The only persons at the judging tables will be the judge and the 4-H member...possibly an assistant to record ribbon placings. Judges will write their own comments. Siblings will not be allowed in the buildings. Parents will be allowed, only if needed.
4. Hand sanitizer will be located at each judging table. Judges and assistants will sanitize between 4-H members.
5. Ribbons will be attached to exhibits by only designated people, to avoid touch surfaces. Ribbons will be attached in the small room of the 4-H Building.
6. Restrooms in the 4-H Building will be closed to the public. Staff, volunteers, and judges will be allowed to use the restrooms in the 4-H Building. They will be sanitized every 2 hours.
7. If it is not possible to social distance, masks will be required to be worn. The judge will wear a mask when interviewing the exhibitor. Exhibitors are encouraged to wear masks, but optional as long as the judge and superintendents are wearing masks when they can't social distance.
8. Will avoid sharing of pens, pencils, clipboards between superintendents and judge.
9. **Food will be discarded after judging. Food exhibits will be displayed, however, all exhibits will be disposed of at the end of the fair, except:**
 - a. **Gingerbread Houses**
 - b. **Food Preservation Exhibits in sealed canning jars.**
 - c. **Decorated Cakes, Cupcake Cakes, and Decorate Your Cupcake exhibits will be thrown away. Any separator tiers, cake boards, etc., will be saved for the 4-H member to pick up.**
 - d. **4-H'ers will still be responsible for picking up the ribbons for all foods exhibits on Release Day.**
10. **To avoid waste of food items, the following quantities have been revised for exhibits from what is printed in the premium book:**
 - a. **Cookies - 2 on a paper plate in a self-sealing bag**
 - b. **Quick Breads**
 - i. **Muffins - 2 on a paper plate in a self-sealing bag**
 - ii. **Coffee Cake - 4" x 4" piece displayed on a paper plate in a self-sealing bag**
 - iii. **Cornbread - 4" x 4" piece displayed on a paper plate in a self-sealing bag**
 - iv. **Quick Bread Loaf - ¼ of the loaf, including one end in a self-sealing bag**
 - c. **Yeast Breads - ¼ of a loaf, including one end, in a self-sealing bag**
 - d. **Shortened Cake - ¼ of cake in a self-sealing bag**
 - e. **Pie - 1 slice (1/8 of the entire pie...not the whole pie) in a self-sealing bag**
 - f. **Candy - 4 pieces or ½ cup on a paper plate in a self-sealing bag**
11. Lunches for judges and volunteers will be provided as a sack-type lunch and bottled water.

The only persons at the judging tables will be the judge and the 4-H member...possibly an assistant to record ribbon placings. Judges will write their own comments. Siblings will not be allowed in the buildings. Parents will be allowed, only if needed.
3. 4-H'ers will enter the 4-H Exhibit Hall (Building 13) on the west side. Someone will be at the door allowing exhibitors in as judges are available. Will have a waiting area on the west side of the building for exhibitors and families when all of the judging tables are occupied. Families may wish to bring lawn chairs. When judging is completed, the 4-H'er will exit through the east doors of the Building.
4. Hand sanitizer will be located at each judging table. Judges and assistants will sanitize between 4-H members.
5. Ribbons will be attached to exhibits by only designated people, to avoid touch surfaces.
6. If it is not possible to social distance, masks will be required to be worn. The judge will wear a mask when interviewing the exhibitor. Exhibitors are encouraged to wear masks, but optional as long as the judge and superintendents are wearing masks when they can't social distance.
7. Will avoid sharing of pens, pencils, clipboards between superintendents and judge.
8. Garden produce will be discarded at the end of the fair. 4-H'ers will still be responsible for picking up the ribbons for all garden produce exhibits on Release Day.
10. Lunches for judges and volunteers will be provided as a sack-type lunch and bottled water.

Exhibit Displays

1. Building Sitters will be needed for the 4-H Building and 4-H Exhibit Hall (Building 13) on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. **The buildings will be open to view 4-H exhibits 12:00 -6:00 p.m., as long as building sitters are available.** 4-H Clubs will be asked to provide building sitters.
2. Building Sitters may be asked to sanitize high touch surfaces when they watch the buildings.
3. Building sitters are encouraged to wear masks when they can't social distance.
4. **Release of Exhibits** will be on Thursday, 8:00 a.m. until noon. Families will not complete the exhibit check-out sheets in 2020.

Awards Presentation Night (Wednesday evening) - There will **NOT** be a 4-H Awards Presentation program on Wednesday evening. Award winners will pick up awards at the Extension Office after the county fair.

1. Everything the same as in the past, but with social distancing, masks, and sanitizing per current DHM for that day. Families will weigh in and stall Sunday afternoon and evening using a staggered schedule (see 1.3.1) to limit density while stalling overnight in the barn.
 - 1.1. **Ultrasound Scanning & Swine Estimated Carcass Contest Merit has been cancelled.**
 - 1.2. Herdsmanship - Exhibitors are expected to keep their stalling areas clean. However, there will be no judging of Herdsmanship for 2020.
 - 1.3. Weighing and stalling
 - 1.3.1. Barn: animal "weighing" and stalling will occur Sunday afternoon through evening with designated time slots for families to reduce density (i.e. family last names A-C weigh in and stall 4:00-5:00 p.m., D-F at 5:00-6:00 p.m., etc.); This may require another scale to be acquired due to sharing with the sheep and goats.
 - 1.3.2. Wash rack. Keep stall/pen in between families and taking turns exiting to the wash area; disinfect between family uses allowing 5 minutes for product to dry. (i.e. suggested "Kleen M Up")
 - 1.3.3. A modified show ring will be used. Volunteers, staff, superintendents, and judges in the showing will wear a mask/facial cover or maintain 6 ft physical distancing. Hand sanitizer available.
2. Stalling - Details on stalling will be announced at a later date.
3. Social distancing for spectators per current health regulations.
