

Nebraska Extension in Custer County is once again partnering with Adams Land and Cattle to hold an exciting and interactive Youth Quality Assurance Training the evening of Thursday, June 13. This will be an in-person event held at the Municipal Building in Broken Bow. Any Custer County 4-H member (4-H age 8-18) or FFA member who plans to show sheep, beef, swine, dairy, rabbits, poultry, and/or goats at the Custer County Fair, Nebraska State Fair, and/or Aksarben needs to be trained for Quality Assurance. 4-H and/or FFA members ages 19-21 will need to complete the online training course and NOT attend the in-person training.

Adams Land & Cattle, Merck, and Boehringer-Ingelheim are again sponsoring the in-person event at no cost to the youth. We request that you register youth by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 15. Register at:

Shirts will be provided to youth who register by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 15.

Schedule of Events for Thursday, June 13:

- -Registration begins at 6:15 p.m. at the Broken Bow Municipal Building, 314 So. 10 Avenue.
- -The program will begin at 6:30 p.m. and will last approximately 1.5 hours.
- -Parents may pick up participants at 8:00 p.m.

During the training, youth will move through a series of stations to educate them on animal Quality Assurance. All Custer County youth who need Quality Assurance training are encouraged to attend. We would like as many 4-H'ers as possible to attend this exciting and interactive Quality Assurance training.

Youth who are not able to attend the in-person training on June 13, will need to complete the online Quality Assurance Training course by June 15.

*With the changes in quality assurance going to a national training program called Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) there is a \$3 fee/participant for face-to-face trainings. This fee is being paid by Adams Land and Cattle. After the training each participant will be given a coupon with a code that will then need to be entered into the YQCA website. This coupon code will cover the \$3 fee. Instructions for entering the required information for YQCA will be given to participants the night of the training along with the coupon code.

LIVESTOCK/HORSE I.D. DEADLINES

Due May 31:

- Deadline for all 4-H Horse ID's from horse leaders or organizational leaders.
- Deadline for advancement levels testing for youth entering the State 4-H Horse Expo
- There are no District 4-H Horse Shows.

Due June 1:

- State 4-H Horse Expo Entries. State 4-H Horse Expo entry information can be found online at: https://4h.unl.edu/horse-expo-show
- Online State 4-H Horse Expo entries open May 1 and closes on June 1 at 5:00 p.m. CT.
- June 15 Deadline for eartagging market goats, breeding meat goats, breeding heifers, market sheep, breeding sheep, market swine, breeding swine, stocker-feeders, bucket calves, and submitting ID sheets to the Extension Office from leaders. Rabbits, dairy cattle, and dairy goats must also be identified. Identification forms are available at the Extension Office. (Clover Kid bucket calves DO NOT need identification forms or eartags.) See the 2024 Animal Identification Guidelines for specific eartags required on each species.
- June 15 For State Fair Exhibitors showing market and/or breeding beef, feeder calves, market and/or breeding swine, market and/or breeding sheep or market and/or breeding goats at State Fair must have a signed and sealed official DNA envelope with hair samples for DNA verification. Every animal nomination (this includes all breeding animals and feeder calves) will require a DNA submission. DNA must be turned into their county office and have completed the online nomination with payment in Show Stock Manager by June 15. Any animal carrying an 840 EID tag will require the exhibitor to obtain a Premises ID. Contact the local Extension Office for details. (It is recommended that you make a copy or a photo image of the completed envelope you turn into your county.)

4-H Organizational Leaders may make one (1) eartag order for the club or families may stop by the Extension Office to pick up their own eartags. To submit your order, the order form may be emailed, mailed, or delivered in-person.

ID forms are printable from our website for 4-H'ers to fill out and turn in to their 4-H organizational leader. If ID forms are printed at home, **please print in landscape format, if possible**. ID forms may also be picked up at the Extension Office. Organizational leaders need to turn these into the Extension Office by June 15, so please get these completed forms to them well in advance.

COUNTY DESIGNED 4-H T-SHIRTS...USING THE 4-H NAME AND EMBLEM

Many 4-H clubs are creating designs for use on 4-H club shirts. These designs usually incorporate the 4-H Name and Emblem.



The 4-H Name and Emblem is a highly valued mark within our country's history. Did you know it was granted a very unique and special status; it is in a category similar to the Presidential Seal and the Olympic Emblem? The 4-H Name and Emblem is federally protected by the Secretary of Agriculture.

What does that all mean for 4-H clubs? You must have prior approval for any design which you would like to use in print/stitching. This includes articles of clothing as well as handouts and fliers. FOCUS ON CHARACTER...RESPONSIBILITY!

What is responsibility? Webster's dictionary defines responsibility as the quality or state of being responsible as a) moral, legal, or mental accountability, b) reliability, trustworthiness; something for which one is responsible. Responsibility is the state of being reliable and the state of being accountable. Responsibility is to do what you are supposed to do, think before you act...consider the consequences, and be accountable for your choices.

4-H members/families and 4-H leaders all have responsibilities in the 4-H program. 4-H members and families are responsible for attending club meetings; meeting club/county deadlines; completing 4-H ONLINE enrollments, contest entry forms, making county fair entries, and record books which includes making sure they are given to your club organizational leader in ample time to be turned in to the Extension Office. 4-H leaders are responsible for holding 4-H club meetings (informing members of meetings scheduled and planning an agenda for the meeting) and meeting county deadlines (for example, enrollment deadline, contest entry forms, county fair entry deadline, record book deadline, and deadline for livestock ID's).

Each of us is responsible for the choices we make. And for every choice we make, there is usually a consequence. Consequences will be positive or negative, based on the choice which was made. Though others may influence us, we must take responsibility for our actions. Who we are today, is the result of choices we made yesterday. Tomorrow we will become what we choose today. To be responsible means to do your duty, to be accountable for your choices and their

ANNUAL 4-H GROUP ACCIDENT INSURANCE POLICY

Custer County 4-H is covered by an annual 4-H group accident insurance policy. The Annual Group Accident Policy through American Income Life (AIL) covers individual 4-H clubs, or county wide 4-H programs. The premiums for this insurance comes from the \$7.00/member fee each year. All enrolled 4-H members and leaders are covered under this policy. The policy covers each enrolled member and leader while participating in or attending regularly approved and adult supervised group activities. The policy offers FULL coverage for members and leaders while traveling directly to and from the member's home and the meeting place for the purpose of participating in scheduled group activity. If anyone has an accident claim to make, please contact Colleen at the Extension Office for a Claim Form. We are hoping that we have a safe and accident-free year!

The following examples are actual claims which have been paid:

A 13-year-old 4-H member was watering his calf while at the local 4-H fairgrounds when the animal knocked him against a concrete barrier. He required treatment in the emergency room for a broken wrist. AIL paid the policy maximum for medical expenses related to the injury.

A group of 4-H horse club members were practicing in the arena after a county show. One rider lost his seating and fell off. The 14-year-old was in extreme pain, so he was transported to the hospital by ambulance. X-rays found he had suffered a broken collarbone. Maximum benefits were paid under the 4-H club policy, which paid for the ambulance charge and contributed to the emergency room, hospital, and physician charges.

Due July 15:

To encourage safe handling of horses, all 4-H members enrolled in the horse project that will be riding will have passed at least Level I (Horse Project Advancement Levels) before July 15 to be eligible to show in the 2024 Custer County Fair. If a 4-H member is only going to show in showmanship or halter at County Fair, then they must pass everything in Level I except the "II. Riding" portion of the skills test by the above date.



COUNTY FAIR ENTRIES

4-H entries must be made according to the printed 2024 Custer County Fair Premium Book and entered online by 5:00 p.m. on June 28. Instructions for online entries will be emailed to 4-H families on approximately May 15. At the September 19, 2022 4-H Council meeting, the following motion was made. "Every 4-H member is eligible for a "one-time" member exemption for late county fair entries. The exemption provides the ability (one-time in a 4-H member's career) for the 4-H member to acknowledge they missed the county fair entry deadline, with a \$25 late fee charged per member."

SUMMER CAMPS

Nebraska 4-H summer camps provide all youth a place to discover, learn, and grow. Youth do not need to be a 4-H member to attend. Overnight camps, single day camps, and week long camps with a variety of activities are offered for all ages.
