2024 4-H Online Enrollment Update:


Starting for the 2024 program year, project selection is now optional. By successfully completing enrollment, youth will be eligible to participate in 4-H. While optional, it is encouraged for youth to select projects they are interested in exploring. Yet it will not determine participation of projects, contest, fairs, etc. This will make the enrollment process easier, and it won't limit what the members can be involved in throughout the 4-H year. (Exceptions: horse and shooting sports project members are **required** to select the projects due to parental consent required to participate in these projects).

IMPORTANT!! If you are re-enrolling in 4-H, please DO NOT create a new enrollment for youth who were enrolled last year. Use your email address and password from last year to log in and start your re-enrollment process for this year.

NEBRASKA STATE FAIR MINIMUM SHOW AGE CHANGING TO 8 FOR 2024

Nebraska 4-H lowered the age limit for participation in the Nebraska State Fair for all in-person events to nine years of age. That change increased our participation and provided more youth the opportunity to have an engaging learning experience. We had many positive comments from legacy families as well as new.

This fall, we have had follow-up conversations with many of you as well as the show superintendents and various teams that run these events during State Fair and throughout the year. Based on that feedback and our goal of increasing access, the decision has been made to change the age of eligibility in 2024 to be 8 years of age before January 1 (of the current year) for all in-person State Fair events (livestock, contests, fashion shows, contests) and other state competitions (Fonner Park State 4-H Horse Expo, PASE, communications contest). Note: there will be some events that will maintain their ages due to specific program rules (shooting sports, FIRST LEGO League Challenge robotics). Please check information on each specific event as it becomes available.

National Western Stock Show * 4-H Catch-A-Calf *

All 4-H members ages 14-18 can participate in the Catch-a-Calf program hosted at the National Western Stock Show scheduled for January 6-21, 2024. This program is designed so that successful participants catch a calf, feed it, and return with the animal one year later as a market-ready steer at the National Western Stock Show. Steers are judged on production and carcass quality, while the participants are judged on showmanship, record books, and a personal interview. The Grand and Reserve Grand Champion participants sell their steers at the Auction of Junior Livestock Champions held on the Friday of the Stock Show. 


Save the Date! Beef Weigh-in


YQCA Certification During Christmas Break


The downtime of Christmas break would be a great time to knock out your youth's 2024 YQCA requirements! 4-H (ages 8-18) and FFA (under age 19) exhibitors as of January 1, 2024, who exhibit beef, goats, sheep, swine, rabbit & poultry are REQUIRED to complete YQCA training by June 15, 2024, to be eligible to participate at the Dixon County Fair and Nebraska State Fair. (Clover Kids are not required to complete YQCA training)

Nebraska 4-H requires all youth enrolled in livestock projects to complete an **annual** quality assurance training through the YQCA program.

YQCA is a national multi-species quality assurance program focused on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. 4-H members who exhibit beef, dairy cattle, dairy goat, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine must have the YQCA certification







The annual training may be completed by one of the following:

- Face-to-Face Training with a Certified Instructor: \$3.00 each. Registrations for Face-to-Face training are to be completed and paid on the YQCA website.
- Online Course: \$12.00 each.
- Online Test Out: This option is only available to youth in their first year of Intermediate (age 12) and first year of Senior (age 15) age levels. There is no test-out option for Juniors. Costs are: Intermediate \$36 (\$12 x 3 years of certification) and Senior \$48 (\$12 x 4 years of certification).

If you pass, you will not be required to complete the annual training requirements for the remainder of your current age level (Intermediates: 12-14; and Seniors: 15-18). Each test consists of fifty randomly selected questions and has a pass rate of 80% or better for certification.

- Provide printed copies or pdf copies of your certificates. Photos must be readable. Check before sending.

Eligibility:

- Youth 14-18 years of age (age on January 1st).
- Youth will serve a two-year term (can reapply for another term).
- Enrolled as a 4-H member (Dixon County).
- Must be an active member for at least two years prior to application.
- Complete this application by October 13, 2023

General Duties

- Serve as a positive role model to all youth.
- Represent 4-H to the public-develop an elevator speech about 4-H and its positive impact.
- Write an article about 4-H for the newspapers (National 4-H Week and Nebraska 4-H Month)
- Promote 4-H to potential donors and supporters of the 4-H program.
- Assist with 4-H events at the Dixon County Fair (pass out awards during shows and special events, Achievement Programs, and other county, regional, or state 4-H events as a 4-H Ambassador).
- Assist and/or teach at 4-H Workshops (summer, etc.)
- Assist with new member recruitment by visiting elementary classrooms as well as other community events (Missouri River Expo, Back to School event, etc.).
- Must attend and be on time to the scheduled dates (please contact us if you have a conflict).
- Wear a 4-H Ambassador shirt and nametag (this will be provided) to events.
- Attend a 4-H Ambassador training (TBA).
