2024 4-H Online Enrollment Update:

Starting for the 2024 program year, project selection is now optional. By successfully completing enrollment, youth will be eligible to participate in 4-H. While optional, it is encouraged for youth to select projects they are interested in exploring. Yet it will not determine participation of projects, contest, fairs, etc. This will make the enrollment process easier, and it won't limit what the members can be involved in throughout the 4-H year. (Exceptions: horse and shooting sports project members are **required** to select the projects due to parental consent required to participate in these projects).

IMPORTANT!! If you are re-enrolling in 4-H, please DO NOT create a new enrollment for youth who were enrolled last year. Use your email address and password from last year to log in and start your re-enrollment process for this year.

Save the Date! BEEF WEIGH-IN

Beef Weigh-in will be Saturday, February 10, 2024, 10:00 AM to Noon, at the UNL Haskell farm. We will be using new DNA envelopes, so any unused envelopes in your possession will be obsolete and should be recycled. EID tags and county tags are \$2.64 each and will be available that day. Those enrolled in Beef projects will receive paperwork beforehand.

YQCA Certification



The downtime of Christmas break would be a great time to knock out your youth's 2024 YQCA requirements! 4-H (ages 8-18) and FFA (under age 19) exhibitors as of January 1, 2024, who exhibit beef, goats, sheep, swine, rabbit & poultry are REQUIRED to **complete YQCA training by June 15, 2024**, to be eligible to participate at the Dixon County Fair and Nebraska State Fair. (*Clover Kids are not required to complete YQCA training*)

Nebraska 4-H requires all youth enrolled in livestock projects to complete an **annual** quality assurance training through the YQCA program.

YQCA is a national multi-species quality assurance program focused on three core

pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. 4-H members who exhibit beef, dairy cattle, dairy goat, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine must have the YQCA certification completed before fair. 4-H members who exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair will need to have their YQCA training requirements met by the date of entry for those respective shows.



The annual training may be completed by one of the following:

- Face-to-Face Training with a Certified Instructor: \$3.00 each.

 Registrations for Face-to-Face training are to be completed and paid on the YQCA website.
- Online Course: \$12.00 each.
- Online Test Out: This option is only available to youth in their first year of Intermediate (age 12) and first year of Senior (age 15) age levels. There is no test-out option for Juniors. Costs are: Intermediate \$36 (\$12 x 3 years of certification) and Senior \$48 (\$12 x 4 years of certification).

If you pass, you will not be required to complete the annual training requirements for the remainder of your current age level (Intermediates: 12-14; and Seniors: 15-18). Each test consists of fifty randomly selected questions and has a pass rate of 80% or better for certification.

• Provide printed copies or pdf copies of your certificates. Photos must be readable. Check before sending.







2024 Nebraska State Fair: August 23 - September 2

NEBRASKA STATE FAIR MINIMUM SHOW AGE CHANGING TO 8 FOR 2024

Nebraska 4-H lowered the age limit for participation in the Nebraska State Fair for all in-person events to nine years of age. That change increased our participation and provided more youth the opportunity to have an engaging learning experience. We had many positive comments from legacy families as well as new.

This fall, we have had follow-up conversations with many of you as well as the show superintendents and various teams that run these events during State Fair and throughout the year. Based on that feedback and our goal of increasing access, the decision has been made to change the age of eligibility in 2024 to be 8 years of age before January 1 (of the current year) for all in-person State Fair events (livestock, contests, fashion shows, contests) and other state competitions (Fonner Park State 4-H Horse Expo, PASE, communications contest). Note: there will be some events that will maintain their ages due to specific program rules (shooting sports, FIRST LEGO League Challenge robotics). Please check information on each specific event as it becomes available.

Planning is in full swing for the **2024 Nebraska State Fair**. While the complete and detailed schedule is a work in progress, a tentative schedule overview was shared to help exhibitors plan ahead. The 4-H State Dog Show will be held on Saturday, August 24, 2024, at the Heartland Event Center, Grand Island. More info to come! https://4h.unl.edu/state-fair-dog-exhibitor

2024 Nebraska State Fair 4-H Livestock

All livestock in contention to exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair will be required to submit a DNA nomination. This includes all 4-H and FFA breeding livestock, market livestock, and feeder calves. Any DNA nomination submitted



through Show Stock Manager will also be eligible for exhibition at the Aksarben Stock Show. DNA nominations will be \$7.00 per animal. All animals will automatically be eligible for both breeding and market—no additional fees or double payments will be required.

DNA nominations for the Nebraska State Fair are due on June 15, 2024.

Any 4-H member planning to exhibit livestock at the <u>Nebraska State Fair</u> must complete the appropriate livestock identification requirements for each potential animal. This process

nominates the animals for the 4-H livestock shows at the Nebraska State Fair and provides evidence that the animals are part of the youth's livestock projects. The process makes an individual animal eligible for entry at the Nebraska State Fair.

Please note that completing the state identification requirements does not automatically enter the animal or exhibitor for the Nebraska State Fair. The exhibitor must still complete the separate online State Fair entry process. Animals that are not identified and nominated using the appropriate state requirements by the deadlines below will not be eligible to be entered or shown at the Nebraska State Fair.

Family Responsibilities:

- 1. Exhibitors will be required to enroll in 4-H by the county deadline in 4H Online.
- 2. Exhibitors will review their species fairbooks.
- 3. Exhibitors showing market and/or breeding beef, feeder calves, market and/or breeding swine, market and/or breeding sheep or market and/or breeding goats at State Fair must have a signed and sealed official DNA envelope with hair samples for DNA verification. Every animal nomination (this includes all breeding animals and feeder calves) will require a DNA submission. DNA must be turned into their county office and have completed the online nomination with payment in *Show Stock Manager* by June 15. Any animal carrying an 840 EID tag will require the exhibitor to obtain a Premises ID. Contact the local Extension Office for details. (It is recommended that you make a copy or a photo image of the completed envelope you turn into your county.)
- 4. Exhibitors will be required to complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) for the enrolled livestock projects by the August 10.
- 5. Exhibitors will confirm that the ear tattoo and/or identification tag matches the animal nomination submitted by June 15 for confirmation of legibility and/or accuracy.
- 6. Exhibitors will notify the County Extension Staff of any retags that may occur up to time of check-in at the State Fair.
- 7. Exhibitors will select which animal nominations they have chosen to show at State Fair on the State Fair entry website by August 10. All nominated and validated animals will be automatically listed as a choice option for entry registration.
- 8. Exhibitors will be required to bring the breed registration association paperwork to check-in at State Fair for animals wanting to show in a breed class. The registration papers must show the exhibitor's name or a co-owner who is an immediate member of the exhibitor's family and is listed with the online nomination in Show Stock Manager.

County Staff Responsibilities:

- 1. Submit an 840 EID tag order for beef and swine animal projects.
- 2. Schedule and publish weigh-in and/or tagging dates if offered in your county.
- 3. Request, distribute and collect DNA collectors for families. 840 EID tags should not be distributed without the premise ID being recorded in 4H Online. It is optional but recommended to record on the DNA envelope.
- 4. Inform families of the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training options available to them (in person and online).
- 5. Collect all beef, swine, lamb, and goat DNA envelopes by June 15. Families will submit payment online in *Show Stock Manager*. Copy all DNA envelopes for your county records and mail all completed DNA envelopes to the Aksarben Stock Show office by **June 21**.
- 6. Remind families to confirm that the ear tattoo and/or identification tag matches the animal nomination submitted by June 15 for confirmation of legibility and/or accuracy.
- 7. Collect Premises ID numbers from exhibitors and input those into 4H Online.
- 8. Review and validate all online livestock nominations in *Show Stock Manager* for each exhibitor by **July 1.**
- 9. Input nomination edits in to Show Stock Manager for your families. Edits will be corrected by the Show Coordinator. For retags, directly notify Brandy Schulze <u>bschulze@unl.edu</u> and/or input the change in *Show Stock Manager*.
- 10. Inform families that all nominations have been validated and are available for entry at the Nebraska State Fair entry website https://www.statefair.org/ when the system is open.

Additional Information

- County offices can accept paper ID sheets for their own record keeping but these <u>will not be accepted as a form</u> <u>of identification for State Fair</u>. Each exhibitor may nominate a total, between 4-H and FFA, as follows: Market Beef (20), Market Lambs (20), Market Swine (40), and Market Goats (20).
- There are entry limits for each of the individual species. Exhibitors cannot exhibit more than the following for each species to State Fair: Beef (5), Swine (6), Sheep (4), Goat (4), Poultry (6), Rabbit (6).
