Signs and symptoms of Emerald Ash Borer were recently identified in the Fremont area. All ash trees within a 15-mile radius are at risk of attack as EAB spreads. Insecticide treatments are available but do cause cumulative damage to trees.

At this seminar, tree owners will learn:

- How to identify ash trees (branch samples may be brought to seminar for identification)
- Which trees are healthy candidates for treatment
- Available treatment methods and timing of applications
- Good replacement trees.
