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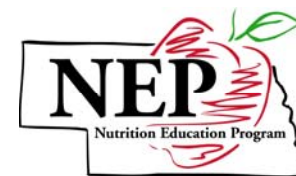
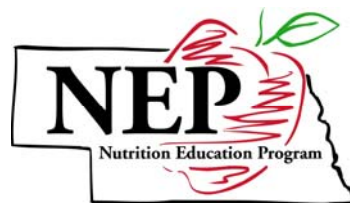

Nutrition Education Program

Are you tired of...

- fixing the same foods day after day and week after week?
- running out of grocery money before the end of the month?
- wondering what to feed your family?

If you answered “yes” to any of these questions, NEP can help. NEP is a free nutrition education program that helps families on a limited budget to eat healthier and save money.



Who can enroll?

- Adults with children
- Individuals using an EBT card
- Individuals receiving WIC vouchers
- Individuals whose children receive free or reduced price school lunch
- Pregnant women & teens
- Senior adults

In Nebraska, SNAP-Ed and EFNEP make-up a program called NEP. Adult participants are taught a set number of lessons by a NEP assistant within their community. After completing the lessons, the participant will receive a free cookbook that includes many quick, easy and healthy recipes. NEP is **free** to all participants who meet income guidelines or are receiving SNAP benefits.

SNAP-Ed

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program-Education (SNAP-Ed) provides nutrition education and food budgeting information to help limited resource families be more healthy.



EFNEP

The Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program is a nutrition education program that targets limited resource families who have one or more children living at home or pregnant women.

NEP assistants teach adults and youth with limited resources how to select and prepare nutritious food.

Lesson topics include:

- MyPyramid
- Meal planning and shopping for food
- Grain group
- Fruit group
- Vegetable group
- Milk group
- Meat & beans group
- Breakfast
- Healthy snacking
- Prenatal nutrition
- Feeding your infant/child
- Eating right and moving more



Programs are delivered:

- Individually or in small groups
- At agency, school or community sites
- In the home through mail and internet lessons, or phone visits
