Fun facts

- Introduced species from Europe
- Overwinter in protective place as adults in natural tree holes and cavities or inside buildings in attics and lofts
- Gather in large numbers by windows
- Larvae feed on earthworms
- Adults feed on plant sap, fruit, flowers
- Does not reproduce indoors

Identification

<u>Adult</u>: 3/16" long, golden-yellow hairs on thorax, checkered black and silver abdomen, wings overlap at rest

<u>Other features</u>: Strong odor when crushed like buckwheat honey

Management

• Physical exclusion - Caulk and seal holes, fix or install screening, fix weather-stripping and door seals

Cluster fly

Pollenia rudis

- Trap with sticky traps, sweep or vacuum when they become active again in the spring or warm days
- Perimeter spray of insecticide to exterior of home in the fall as they begin to enter buildings
