***** Please note: If youth cancel a workshop registration, youth must notify the Extension Office at least 5 days prior to the event, to ensure that an alternate can be contacted.

If later than 5 days, youth will be billed for half the workshop fee.

2017 Club & Community Service Projects

1) Recycle Cards, Envelopes, Cancelled Stamps & Buttons

We're pleased to network with Beatrice State Developmental Center (BSDC) in the collection of greeting cards, cancelled stamps and envelopes. BSDC supports the St. Jude's Ranch and does projects with these recycled cards. They also collect buttons for recycled projects. Drop off at the Extension Office

26) Basic Entomology Workshop - June 29, 1:00 - 3:00 pm, Extension meeting room

Do you love insects? Do you want to identify insects and learn how to collect them? Nicole Stoner will teach youth

all about the world of insects and the basics of making an insect collection. Participate in the pre-fair Entomology Judging Contest and win ribbons, premium money and awards.

27) Herb Garden Workshop - TBA

If you like to garden and love herbs, this workshop is for you. Nicole Stoner presents a Herb Gardening Workshop to teach you about growing herbs, how to plant them, care for them, and display at the fair. Participants will go home with a herb garden!

28) Nebraska Native 150

The old is new again. The newest varieties of native grasses released from University of Nebraska research make up the Nebraska Native 150 project. 4-H members will receive a bucket of native grasses started by S.E. Community College horticulture students. The project information sheet will give information about the grasses, care instructions, and display information for the Gage County Fair. Maximum 22 participants. Entries will be judged with awards to the champions.

29) 2017 Statewide Garden Project: Sunburst Summer Squash

Who doesn't enjoy growing squash in the summertime? Grow something unusual in the 2017 project while learning about how to be a successful gardener. The Sunburst squash has yellow, scalloped shaped fruits with bright-green blossom ends. The plants are very productive and an All-American Selection winner for its early fruit production and for producing a large number of fruits per plant. They are as attractive as they are tasty. 52 days from planting till harvest. Pick up seed from Extension Office, May 8-12; youth will be notified of exact date. Participants receive seed packet, newsletters, harvesting and exhibiting tips. Maximum 30 participants. Fee: 50 cents/participant. NEW: Enroll Online 4-H in the Special Garden Project.

30) Big Red Zinnia

Zinnias are a classic annual flower for any garden; who wouldn't want one that is red to show your support for the Nebraska Huskers. Participants will receive a plant, started at Countryside Greenhouse in Beatrice, and information on how to grow the plants. Big Red Zinnia has Husker Red flower blooms that are 5-6" cross. The plants grow up to 3 feet tall and will bloom just a few short weeks after they are planted. The blooms last very long as a cut flower, as well, so they will be good to show at the fair in a vase. Participants will pick up plants at Extension office, May 8-12; youth will be notified of exact date. Maximum 25 participants. Fee: \$2.00.

31) Butterfly Milkweed

This year participants grow the 2017 Perennial Plant of the Year, Butterfly Milkweed, a great pollinator plant. Participants will receive a Butterfly Milkweed plant, started by SCC Beatrice horticulture students. These plants grow 12-24 inches tall and bloom orange blooms in clusters on the plant from April - July. Plants are drought tolerant and attractive to butterflies. It may not bloom the first year but participants can bring the plants in the container to the fair and then enjoy the plants for years to come. Pick up plants from Extension Office, May 8-12; youth will be notified of exact date. Maximum 20 participants. Fee: 50 cents.

32) Midori Giant Soybean

With the 2017 fair theme "Celebrate the Good Life", what better way to celebrate Nebraska than by growing plants that have grown here for many decades. One of those plants is the soybean. Participants will receive a packet of Midori Giant Soybean seeds and growing information. Plants grow 20-24" tall and produce pods with 2-3 delicious seeds per pod which make a delicious, nutritious snack. It will take 68-80 days for mature pods to develop on the plants. Participants will pick up plants from Extension Office, May 8-12; youth will be notified of exact date. Maximum 20 participants. Fee: 50 cents.

33) Ruby Queen Sweet Corn

Celebrate the 150th anniversary of Nebraska at the 2017 Gage County Fair with horticulture projects. Nicole found a Red Sweet Corn to celebrate as one of the main crops we have grown in Nebraska - and it's red for the Huskers. Participants will receive a packet of Ruby Queen Sweet Corn and growing information. This sweet corn produces sweet corn ears with red kernels. The ears are 8 inches long on 7-foot-tall plants that will be ready to harvest 75 days after planting. Participants will pick up the plants from Extension Office, May 8-12; youth will be notified of exact date. Maximum 20 participants. Fee: 50 cents.

34) Bioenergy Summer Day Camp - June 28, 10:00 am - noon, Jr. Division; 1:00 - 3:00 pm, Sr. Division, Extension meeting room

Paper Circuits - morning session for youth under age 12; Monsters or Wind Turbines - afternoon session, youth age 12 & older. Brought to Gage County 4-H members by John Hay, Nebraska Educator, Energy, and summer interns. Enroll in Engineering project.

35) 4-H Lego Special - Intermediate/Advanced

One of the most popular and best selling toys of all time around the world is Lego. It's fun for children of all age, with a history dating back over 80 years. The tallest Lego tower was 94' high and used 465,000 bricks. We're bringing the Lego fun to 4-H members here. We invested in 10 large Lego kits, funded by a Beatrice Walmart grant. Kits will be checked out, assembled by the 4-H member, and displayed at the Gage County Fair, Engineering area. Participant must exhibit Lego kit on a substantial board and bring the box back to the Extension Office. Rainbow ribbons and premium money awarded. Participants will leave kits at the fair; next year 10 more lucky kids get to participate in the Lego Special. Enroll in Engineering project.

36) Celebrate Nebraska in Wood - All Ages

We feature trees and Nebraska history in this celebration in wood. Don't miss your chance to show any aspect of Nebraska that you love. Participants will pick up a pre-cut wood state shape of Nebraska, use your creativity and imagination, and complete your fair exhibit. Must include hanger of your choice. Theme ribbons and premium awarded. Awards to champions. Maximum 30 participants. Fee: \$1.00. Enroll in Woodworking.
