- ◆ All motor vehicles entering Ft. Robinson must have a Park Entry Permit (\$6/day or \$31/annual - NE vehicles) (\$12/day or \$61 annual—Non Residents)
- ◆ A camping permit is required for overnight guests. There are limited full-hook ups, electric only, and primitive camping at the Mare Barn Complex.
- ◆ All permits are available at the lodge as you enter Ft. Robinson State Park.

- ◆ **Nebraska 4-H Participant Permission and Health Forms are required of ALL Youth participants.**
Nebraska 4-H'ers may use a copy of their online enrollment permission/health questionnaire.
- ◆ While horse health papers are not required, all campers are advised to have properly vaccinated their animals and not bring an equine exhibiting signs of illness. A camp veterinarian will be on hand for inspection and will request unhealthy animals be removed from the premises.
- ◆ **What to bring:** Hay/feed for horses, shavings for stall, buckets, feed pans, bed rolls, towels, tents, toiletries, campers, all-weather boots, clothing (wet/dry, cold/hot), flashlight, a smile, baling wire, thingamajig, rope, hammer, camera, helmet, pitchfork, and a horse you can handle.
Swimming available at Crawford and Ft. Robinson.
- ◆ **Participants are responsible for most of their own meals and all lodging arrangements on Thursday and Friday. A meal will be provided Friday night and Saturday morning.**
- ◆ Please remember there is to be no tent camping or sleeping in trailers unless located in a designated and reserved spot.
