2020 4-H Communication Contest – Presentations

Sunday, May 3rd 3:00 p.m.

Johnson County 4-H Building, Tecumseh

Purpose: The 4-H Presentation Contest helps youth develop skills for communicating. Through the contest, youth have an opportunity to teach others about the skills they have learned in 4-H by developing and delivering a presentation.

Rules and Regulations:

- All entries MUST be 4-H related.
- Classes
 - Clover Kid Show & Tell Non-competitive class for Clover Kids where they can show and tell about one of their favorite things.
 - Illustrated Presentation: a live presentation with a formal talk where youth will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something. Enrollment in the project are in which the participant is making a presentation is not required.
 - 4-H Film Fest (Digital Videos): Films that display the recording, reproducing, and broadcasting of moving visual images. During the contest, youth will provide a 1-minute oral introduction (name, background/goal of presentation, intended audience, where presentation could be shared, etc.) followed by the showing of their Digital Video.

Film Topic: 4-H Film Fest digital videos should engage the audience and teach them something the 4-Her is learning about science, healthy living, citizenship, or agricultural literacy. Enrollment in the project are in which the participant is making a video is not required. The following Digital Videos may be entered in 4-H Film Fest:

- **o Video Public Service Announcement:** A short video that communicates an educational message focused on a cause, activity, or event (Length: 60 seconds).
- o Narrative: A video that tells a fact or fiction story (Length: 3-5 minutes).
- o Documentary: A video that presents factual information about a person, event, or process (Length: 3-5 minutes).
- o Animation: A video created by techniques that simulate movement from individual images (Length: 3-5 minutes).
- Teams may consist of two individual 4-H members
- A LCD projector will be provided for participants.
- A computer equipped with Microsoft Office (Power Point) will be provided.
- Presentations may be brought on a USB drive.
- Participants may also provide their own computer or other equipment as needed.
- If participants will be using a file format other than Power Point please contact the Extension Office ahead of time in order to make proper arrangements.
- A 4-Her may participate in only one Presentation and one 4-H Film Fest.
- Presentations must receive a purple placing in the county contest to attend the state contest.
- Participants must be at least 10 years of age as of December 31st of the previous year to attend the state contest.
- Dress appropriately (4-H attire is not required)
- Judges will make deductions from the contestants score for presentations under or over the time limit.
- Name, 4-H Age, Division, Title of Presentation, and equipment requested are due in the Extension Office by April 27th.
