#### 4-H/FFA Swine Weigh-In for Rate-of-Gain Contest Saturday, April 29, 2023

If you are interested in the Swine Rate-of-Gain Contest, your pigs must be weighed on Saturday, April 29 at the exhibitor's home. Another leader/parent must witness the weighing and sign the paper. **The swine weights must be** 

sent or faxed (402-288-5612) to the Extension Office by Tuesday, May 2nd. To be eligible for State Fair, market swine must have a DNA and an EID tag. Please check the Animal Identification Guidelines for the correct ID process. Clover Kids are not eligible to participate in the Rate-of-Gain Contest.



Nebraska 4-H requires all youth enrolled in livestock projects to complete an **annual** quality assurance training through the YQCA program. YQCA is a national multi-species quality assurance program focused on three

core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. 4-H members who exhibit beef animals, dairy cattle, dairy goat, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine must have the YQCA certification completed before fair. 4-H members who exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair will need to have their YQCA training requirements met by the date of entry for those respective shows.

The annual training may be completed by one of the following:

• Face-to-Face Training with a Certified Instructor:

4-H'ers will need to register at <a href="https://yqcaprogram.org/">https://yqcaprogram.org/</a> and pay the \$3 fee prior to the training. Each participant MUST complete a pre-test and a post-test.

Knox County Face-to-Face trainings:

- May 30, 2023 in Center 1:00 p.m.
- June 15, 2023 in Niobrara 10:00 a.m.
- Online Course: Visit the YQCA login page to begin. The cost of the online course is \$12.00 each. See instructions at <a href="https://4h.unl.edu/yqca">https://4h.unl.edu/yqca</a> to register. Please visit <a href="https://yqcaprogram.org/local/youth">https://yqcaprogram.org/local/youth</a> parents.php for more information.
- Online Test Out: This option is only available to youth in the first year of Intermediate (age12) and Senior (age 15) age levels. There is no test-out option for Juniors. Costs are: Intermediate \$36 (\$12 x 3 years of certification) and Senior \$48 (\$12 x 4 years of certification). If you pass, you will not be required to complete the annual training requirements for the remainder of your current age level (Intermediates: 12-14; and Seniors: 15-18). Each test consists of 50 randomly selected questions and has a pass rate of 80% or better for certification. More information on the Online Test-Out option is available at https://4h.unl.edu/ygca.

#### **FSA Rural Youth Loans**

The Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes loans to individual young persons, between the ages of 10 and 20 years, to start and operate income-producing projects of modest size in connection with their participation in 4-H or FFA. The project being financed with a FSA Youth Loan needs to provide an opportunity for the young person to acquire experience and education in agriculture-related skills.

#### **Premises Identification Reminder**

Exhibitors of 4-H and FFA market animals (beef, swine, sheep, and goat) must have a Premises Identification Number to show at the Nebraska State Fair. If an exhibitor does not have a number, you need to obtain it through the Nebraska Department of Agriculture. The Shooting Sports projects and programs offer opportunities for youth to learn safe gun handling skills and sound fundamentals of shooting under the guidance of caring and knowledgeable adult volunteers. Knox County has certified



leaders for the following projects: Archery; Air Rifle, Air Pistol, and BB Gun; Smallbore Rifle and Pistol (.22 caliber); and Shotgun.

Youth must be enrolled with the Nebraska Extension 4-H Office in Knox County before participating in the Shooting Sports Projects and Contests.



#### **2023 Online Horticulture Judging Contest**

Do you know what it takes to pick the best fruit and vegetables out at the grocery store? Or do you know what judges are looking for when they judge your plants at the county fair? Have you ever wondered, what plant is that!?! We are excited to offer the opportunity to learn these and other important horticulture skills through the Online Horticulture Contest. The contest will be available June 2-16, 2023 at: <a href="https://go.unl.edu/online4hhortcontest">https://go.unl.edu/online4hhortcontest</a>.

Horticulture judging contest consists of three parts. The first is identification of plant material. Participants identify the plants by common name from a plant list. Specimens may be alive or preserved plant parts like stems, twigs, leaves, flowers, seeds, fruits, roots, bulbs, tubers, or plant products.

The second is a knowledge portion, usually in the form of a true/false or multiple-choice quiz. Questions will test the contestant's knowledge of cultural practices for horticultural crops, plant science, pesticides, horticultural careers and other topics related to the production, processing and consumption of horticultural crops.

The last portion is judging or placings. This is where four different plants, plates of vegetables, or containers flowers are ranked from best to worst based on a set of criteria. Classes are judged on the basis of condition, quality, uniformity, true-to-type, and size.
