4-H/FFA Swine Weigh-In for Rate-of-Gain Contest Saturday, April 27, 2024

If you are interested in the Swine Rate-of-Gain Contest, the pigs must be weighed on Saturday, April 27 at the exhibitor's home. Another leader/parent must witness the weighing and sign the paper. **The swine weights must be**

sent or faxed (402-288-5612) to the Extension Office by Tuesday, April 30^{th.} To be eligible for the State Fair, market swine must have a DNA and an EID tag. Please check the Animal Identification Guidelines for the correct ID process. Clover Kids are not eligible to participate in the Rate-of-Gain Contest. 4-H swine exhibitors are not required to participate in the Swine Rate-of-Gain Contest.



Nebraska 4-H requires all youth enrolled in livestock projects to complete an **annual** quality assurance training through the YQCA program. YQCA is a national multispecies quality assurance program focused on three core

pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. 4-H members who exhibit beef animals, dairy cattle, dairy goat, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine must have the YQCA certification completed before fair. 4-H members who exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair will need to have their YQCA training requirements met by the date of entry for those respective shows.

The annual training may be completed by one of the following:

• Face-to-Face Training with a Certified Instructor: \$3.00 each -

4-H'ers will need to register at https://yqcaprogram.org/ and pay the \$3 fee prior to the training. Each participant MUST complete a pre-test and a post-test.

- June 19, 2024 in Creighton 1:00 p.m.
- July 18, 2024 in Bloomfield 5:00 p.m.
- July 23, 2024 in Crofton 5:00 p.m.

- Online Course: \$12.00 each. Help document can be found at https://yqcaprogram.org/local/pdf/YQCA HelpDoc GettingWBTCertification 2023.pdf
- Online Test Out: This option is only available to youth in the first year of Intermediate (age 12) and Senior (age 15) age levels. There is no test-out option for Juniors. Costs are: Intermediate \$36 (\$12 x 3 years of certification) and Senior \$48 (\$12 x 4 years of certification). If you pass, you will not be required to complete the annual training requirements for the remainder of your current age level (Intermediates: 12-14; and Seniors: 15-18). Each test consists of fifty randomly selected questions and has a pass rate of 80% or better for certification. More information on the Online Test-Out option is available at https://4h.unl.edu/yqca. Nebraska State Fair Show Stock Manager – Show Stock Online Nomination Process https://showstockmgr.com/

- Now open for State Fair Exhibitors to nominate animals for State Fair.
- This is not the system to enter livestock for the State Fair only nominations.
- State Fair Livestock Dual Eligibility Females may be eligible as both market and breeding, provided a DNA envelope with hair samples has been submitted to the extension office and the family has completed the online nomination for both market and breeding along with payment by June 15. Families will need to decide if the animal will be shown in market or breeding classes by August 10.

Livestock DNA Envelopes

4-H/FFA youth planning to exhibit Market Animals, Breeding Animals or Feeder Calves at the 2024 Nebraska State Fair are required to provide a DNA sample for each animal. The State Fair is no longer using past year's envelopes. You will need to stop by the office to pick up new ones for 2024!

FSA Rural Youth Loans

The Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes loans to individual young persons, between the ages of 10 and 20 years, to start and operate income-producing projects of modest size in connection with their participation in 4-H or FFA. The project being financed with an FSA Youth Loan needs to provide an opportunity for the young person to acquire experience and education in agriculture-related skills.

AKSARBEN STOCK SHOW

Youth 9-19 years of age are eligible for the competition with no prerequisite of youth organization affiliation. 4-H animals nominated for State Fair are eligible for Aksarben. Visit https://www.aksarbenstockshow.com/ for more information. 2024 dates are September 26-29.

Premises Identification Reminder

Exhibitors of 4-H and FFA market animals (beef, swine, sheep, and goat) must have a Premises Identification Number to show at the Nebraska State Fair. Club Meeting Activity – Let's Get to Know Each Other! "Three Trues and a False"

This activity is fun and allows everyone to learn something new about one another.

Supplies: Writing utensils and a piece of paper for each participant.

Let's get started! – Have someone start by writing four facts about himself/herself on his/her piece of paper. Three of the facts should be true and one should be false. Let the 4-H'ers evaluate which ones they think are true, and which one they think is false. Then survey the 4-H'ers to learn the results and discuss each question to see what they thought about each statement. This gives everyone an opportunity to tell a little about himself/herself, and everyone will learn something new about each other. Continue this around the room until everyone has a chance to share. This gives everyone an attempt to stump each other throughout the activity.

Knox County 4-H Shooting Sports Program

The Shooting Sports projects and programs offer opportunities for youth to learn safe gun handling skills and sound fundamentals of shooting under the guidance of caring and knowledgeable adult volunteers. Knox County has certified leaders for the following projects: Archery; Air Rifle, Air Pistol, and BB Gun; Smallbore Rifle and Pistol (.22 caliber); and Shotgun.

Youth must be enrolled with the Nebraska Extension 4-H Office in Knox County before participating in the Shooting Sports Projects and Contests.

Congratulations to the Knox County 4-H Communication Event Participants

4-H members participated in the 2024 Knox County 4-H Communication Event held Monday, April 1st at the Knox County Extension Office. Participants were able to present a speech, record a PSA or deliver a presentation.

Whether speaking in person or virtually, communicating our thoughts to others is a valuable skill. Public speaking contests help youth develop skills for communicating with audiences, learn how to organize and prepare a speech, develop

speech delivery skills, learn how to present themselves to others, and develop self-confidence.

Clover Kids, youth ages 5-7, participated in a non-competitive fashion by reciting a poem or reading or telling a short story. Participants in the Clover Kid Division included: Danica Cunningham of Wausa, Dominic Cunningham of Wausa, and Tate Hanefeldt of Center. Each Clover Kid received words of encouragement from the judge and a Clover Kid rainbow ribbon for their participation.

Dayton Cunningham of Wausa presented a Prepared Speech titled "Hope for the Future". She received the Champion Trophy in the Junior Division.

The Impromptu Speech competition gives youth the opportunity to write and present a speech around a 4-H-related topic that they select during the competition, where they are given 15 minutes to develop and prepare for their presentation. The judge evaluates the subject, organization, and delivery of the speech. Dayton also presented an Impromptu Speech and received the Champion Rosette in the Junior Division.

4-H members also participated in a Radio Public Service Announcement (PSA) category in which they recorded a 60 second radio spot promoting 4-H and using the theme "4-H is a Feeling". Participating in the Junior PSA Division, Tucker Hanefeldt of Center received a purple ribbon and was awarded the Champion trophy; Intermediate PSA Division, Peyton Bratetic of Bloomfield received a purple ribbon and was awarded the Champion trophy. In the Senior PSA Division, Marshall Bratetic of Bloomfield received a purple ribbon and was awarded the Champion trophy.

To finish the evening, two presentations were featured by 4-H members. An Illustrated Presentation is a live presentation with a formal talk where youth will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something.

In the Novice Division, Jocelyn Hanefeldt of Center prepared a presentation: 'Beautiful Bouquets'. Dayton Cunningham prepared a presentation: 'How I Take Care of My Rabbit'. Jocelyn was awarded the Champion trophy. Dayton was awarded a purple ribbon.

Peyton Bratetic, Marshall Bratetic, Dayton Cunningham, Tucker Hanefeldt and Jocelyn Hanefeldt all qualify to compete in the State 4-H Premier Communications Event to be held June 17-18 in Lincoln in their respective events.

Nebraska State Fair 4-H Culinary Challenge!

The purpose of the 4-H Culinary Challenge is to:

- Demonstrate Healthy Decision Making Through Nutrition, Menu Planning, Food Prep, And Food Safety
- Apply Healthy Living Knowledge And Skills
- Showcase Skills
- Highlight Knowledge By Utilizing Technology

4-H'ers ages 8 - 18 are eligible to sign up. They will compete in teams of two. Youth do not have to participate in a county contest to sign up for the Nebraska State Fair Culinary Challenge Contest.
4-H'ers are challenged on the theme, table setting, menu, use of the 2024 challenge ingredient, the interview with the judge, and use of technology during the tableside presentation. The team will prepare one food item off the menu to present to the judge.

The 2024 challenge ingredient is **SOYBEANS**! This can be any form of soybeans used for food such as edamame, tofu, tempeh, soymilk, soybean oil, soy nuts, soy sauce, etc.

All 4-H members planning to participate in any 4-H contest must be entered in Showorks before the 2024 deadline. Each team member must register in Showorks. There is a \$5.00 fee per 4-H'er.
