






2023 Livestock Identification Requirements June 15th Deadline

County Fair

- Paper ID forms will be required for county animals. (No change from previous years). Forms are available at the office or visit https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/knox/livestock-affidavits/.
- County-only animals will use the 4-H ear tags available at the Extension Office. The animals that are nominated for State Fair will not need county ear tags. The EID or Scrapie tag will be used for identification.
- Clover Kids must follow the identification requirements and have ID forms to the extension office by the June 15 deadline.
- The 2023 Animal Identification Guidelines further explains the ID requirements for each animal or it's available at https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/knox/animal-resources-id-forms-record-books-ygca/ or in the 4-H Fairbook.



- DNA nominations will be \$7.00 per envelope. Any DNA nomination sent in from the Extension Office or FFA Advisor will also be eligible for the AKSARBEN Stock Show.
- Exhibitors are responsible for submitting their animal information into the Show Stock Manager Livestock Database (https://showstockmgr.com) prior to the nomination deadline.

The County Extension Office/FFA Advisors will continue to mail in the DNA samples to the AKSARBEN office by the respected deadline. The County Extension Office/FFA Advisor will validate the nominations which will then be available for exhibitors to make State Fair entries in the Showorks program.

Any animal entry not in the database or that does not have submitted DNA will not be considered nominated and eligible for State Fair.



2023 enrollment/re-enrollment MUST be completed by June 15th to exhibit at the Knox County Fair or any 4-H Contests.

Nebraska 4-H requires all youth enrolled in livestock projects to complete an **annual** quality assurance training through the YQCA program. YQCA is a national multi-species quality assurance program focused on three

core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. 4-H members who exhibit beef animals, dairy cattle, dairy goat, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine must have the YQCA certification completed before fair. 4-H members who exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair will need to have their YQCA training requirements met by the date of entry for those respective shows.

The annual training may be completed by one of the following:

- Face-to-Face Training with a Certified Instructor:
- 4-H'ers will need to register at https://yqcaprogram.org/ and pay the \$3 fee prior to the training. Each participant MUST complete a pre-test and a post-test.

Last Knox County Face-to-Face training:

- June 15, 2023 in Niobrara 10:00 a.m.
- Online Course: Visit the YQCA login page to begin. The cost of the online course is \$12.00 each. See instructions at https://4h.unl.edu/yqca to register. Please visit https://yqcaprogram.org/local/youth parents.php for more information.
- Online Test Out: This option is only available to youth in the first year of Intermediate (age12) and Senior (age 15) age levels. There is no test-out option for Juniors. Costs are: Intermediate \$36 (\$12 x 3 years of certification) and Senior \$48 (\$12 x 4 years of certification). If you pass, you will not be required to complete the annual training requirements for the remainder of your current age level (Intermediates: 12-14; and Seniors: 15-18). Each test consists of 50 randomly selected questions and has a pass rate of 80% or better for certification. More information on the Online Test-Out option is available at https://4h.unl.edu/yqca.

Knox County 4-H Shooting Sports Program



The Shooting Sports projects and programs offer opportunities for youth to learn safe gun handling skills and sound fundamentals of shooting under the guidance of caring and knowledgeable adult volunteers. Knox County has certified leaders for the following projects: Archery; Air Rifle, Air Pistol, and BB Gun; Smallbore Rifle and Pistol (.22 caliber); and Shotgun.

Youth must be enrolled with the Nebraska Extension 4-H Office in Knox County before participating in the Shooting Sports

Projects and Contests.

Archery Practice Dates

Practices will be held every Monday night in June and July. *A parent, grandparent and or guardian needs to be present with shooters under the age of 16.* All practices start at 7:00 p.m. and will be held at the Bloomfield Airport. All shooters must attend at least 2 practices each year to participate in the official contest. BB Gun, Air Rifle & Air Pistol Practice Dates

Practices will be held on June 19 and 26 and July 10, 17, 24, and 31. There will not be a practice on July 3rd. Practices will start at 7:00 pm and will be held at the Bloomfield Airport, 54240 880 Rd. All shooters must attend at least 2 practices each year to participate in the official contest.

.22 Rifle, .22 Pistol Practice Dates

Practices will be held every Thursday night in June, July, and August, **starting June 15**th and ending August 3rd. All .22 Pistol & .22 Rifle practices will start at 6:30 pm. Both will be held at the Knox County Fairgrounds in Bloomfield. **All practices will end at 8:30 pm, NO EXCEPTIONS.** All shooters must attend at least 2 practices each year to participate in the official contest. If there is any question about the weather on a given night, call Craig Steffen at 402-358-0642.

Shotgun Practice Dates

Practices will be held every Thursday night in June and July. All Shotgun practices will start at 6:30 pm and will be held at the Knox County Fairgrounds in Bloomfield. **All practices will end at 8:30 pm, NO EXCEPTIONS.** All shooters must attend at least 2 practices each year to participate in the official contest. The Food Revue Contest is open to all 4-H members including Clover Kids. The Food Revue Contest is a fun way to learn how to properly set a table, plan nutritious meals, express originality and creativity in choosing a theme, and express knowledge of food, nutrition, and food safety.



If your recipe lends itself to be shared, we encourage you to participate in the Public Sample Line following the contest. Contestants share sample sized portions of their food for others to try and answer questions about their exhibit. Please think about how you will serve your samples, small plates and napkins will be provided for those tasting!



The Cook-Off Contest is only available to 4-H members (ages 8 and over) and the entry must include at least one pound of beef, pork, or poultry per four servings. You prepare your exhibit at home and bring the entire dish ready to serve, the entire recipe, the menu and a plate to serve a sample to the judge.


