

2024 Livestock Identification Requirements June 15th Deadline

County Fair

- Paper ID forms will be required for county animals. (No change from previous years). Forms are available at the office or visit https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/knox/livestock-affidavits/.
- County-only animals will use the 4-H ear tags available at the Extension
 Office. The animals that are nominated for State Fair will not need county
 ear tags. The EID or Scrapie tag will be used for identification.
- Clover Kids must follow the identification requirements and have ID forms to the extension office by the June 15th deadline.
- The 2024 Animal Identification Guidelines further explains the ID requirements for each animal or it's available at https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/knox/animal-resources-id-forms-record-books-yqca/ or in the 4-H Fairbook.



- DNA nominations will be \$7.00 per envelope. Any DNA nomination sent in from the Extension Office or FFA Advisor will also be eligible for the AKSARBEN Stock Show. (Please note Aksarben's new online nomination information in this newsletter.)
- Exhibitors are responsible for submitting their animal information into the Show Stock Manager Livestock Database (https://showstockmgr.com) prior to the nomination deadline of June 15th.
- This is not the system to enter livestock for the State Fair *only nominations*.
- State Fair Livestock Dual Eligibility Females may be eligible as both market and breeding, provided a DNA envelope with hair samples has been submitted to the extension office and the family has completed the online nomination for both market and breeding along with payment by June 15. Families will need to decide if the animal will be shown in market or breeding classes by August 10.

The County Extension Office/FFA Advisors will continue to mail in the DNA samples to the AKSARBEN office by the respected deadline. The County Extension Office/FFA Advisor will validate the nominations which will then be available for exhibitors to make State Fair entries in the Showorks program.

Any animal entry not in the database or that does not have submitted DNA will not be considered nominated and eligible for State Fair.

Livestock DNA Envelopes

4-H/FFA youth planning to exhibit Market Animals, Breeding Animals or Feeder Calves at the 2024 Nebraska State Fair are required to provide a DNA sample for each animal. The State Fair is no longer using past year's envelopes. You will need to stop by the office to pick up new ones for 2024!

AKSARBEN STOCK SHOW

Youth 9-19 years of age are eligible for the competition with no prerequisite of youth organization affiliation. 4-H animals nominated for State Fair are eligible for Aksarben. Visit https://www.aksarbenstockshow.com/ for more information. 2024 dates are September 26-29.

Premises Identification Reminder

Exhibitors of 4-H and FFA market animals (beef, swine, sheep, and goat) must have a Premises Identification Number to show at the Nebraska State Fair. If an exhibitor does not have a number, you need to obtain it through the Nebraska Department of Agriculture. Visit https://nda.nebraska.gov/adt/premises.html

Aksarben Stock Show – New Online Nomination Process

Aksarben Stock Show is adding a new step to the process for the Aksarben Stock Show this year, online nomination. Youth that have purchased their DNA through your Extension Office will need to complete this online nomination to be eligible for the Aksarben Stock Show. They will not need to purchase a new DNA envelope. Aksarben will be accepting online nominations from May 1st through July 1st at 5 p.m. Refer to Aksarben website, aksarbenstockshow.com, which will have the link where to go to nominate, instructions specific for those that will be dual nominating for both shows, and frequently asked questions.

Please note, the Aksarben Stock Show online nomination system <u>will be different</u> than Show Stock Manager. 4-H/FFA families who want to be nominated for both NSF and Aksarben will only need to submit one DNA envelope but will now have to <u>submit the online nomination in two different databases</u>.



Nebraska 4-H requires all youth enrolled in livestock projects to complete an **annual** quality assurance training through the YQCA program. YQCA is a national multispecies quality assurance program focused on three core

pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. 4-H members who exhibit beef animals, dairy cattle, dairy goat, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine must have the YQCA certification completed before fair. 4-H members who exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair will need to have their YQCA training requirements met by the date of entry for those respective shows.

The annual training may be completed by one of the following:

• Face-to-Face Training with a Certified Instructor: \$3.00 each — 4-H'ers will need to register at https://yqcaprogram.org/ and pay the \$3 fee prior to the training. Each participant MUST complete a pretest and a post-test.

- June 19, 2024 in Creighton 1:00 p.m.
- July 18, 2024 in Bloomfield 5:00 p.m.
- July 23, 2024 in Crofton 5:00 p.m.

- Online Course: \$12.00 each. Help document can be found at https://yqcaprogram.org/local/pdf/YQCA HelpDoc GettingWBTCertification 2023.pdf
- Online Test Out: This option is only available to youth in the first year of Intermediate (age 12) and Senior (age 15) age levels. There is no test-out option for Juniors. Costs are: Intermediate \$36 (\$12 x 3 years of certification) and Senior \$48 (\$12 x 4 years of certification). If you pass, you will not be required to complete the annual training requirements for the remainder of your current age level (Intermediates: 12-14; and Seniors: 15-18). Each test consists of fifty randomly selected questions and has a pass rate of 80% or better for certification. More information on the Online Test-Out option is available at https://dh.unl.edu/yqca. 

Make checks payable to the Knox County 4-H Council. Membership dues must be paid by June 15 to be eligible to exhibit at the Knox County Fair or any competitive 4-H events that year. Competitive events include all Pre-Fair Contests and Shooting Sports Contests.

Knox County 4-H Shooting Sports Program

The Shooting Sports projects and programs offer opportunities for youth to learn safe gun handling skills and sound fundamentals of shooting under the guidance of caring and knowledgeable adult volunteers. Knox County has certified leaders for the following projects: Archery; Air Rifle, Air Pistol, and BB Gun; Smallbore Rifle and Pistol (.22 caliber); and Shotgun.

Youth must be enrolled with the Nebraska Extension 4-H Office in Knox County before participating in the Shooting Sports Projects and Contests.

Youth Crop Scouting Competition - Connecting Youth with Crops

Looking for a fun club project?
Want to unite your club
members? Running out of ideas
for club meetings? If you
answered, "yes" to any of these
questions, help is on the way!
Nebraska Extension is pleased to
present the 11th annual Crop
Scouting Competition for
Nebraska youth. Youth interested
in crops can learn about crop
growth & development and basic
crop scouting principles.

Don't know a lot about crops? Ask a local agronomist to assist by providing a short lesson on crop production. You can have the agronomist meet with youth

a little during each meeting or outside of the meeting. This is one way to engage those youth interested in crops.

This contest will be held at the Eastern Nebraska Research & Extension Center near Mead, Nebraska on August 7, 2024. The event will include both indoor and outdoor events. Teams of junior high and high school students (those completing 5-12th grades) from across Nebraska are invited to participate. This event is limited to the first ten teams who sign-up!

Clubs or other organizations may enter a team composed of three to five participants. An adult team leader must accompany each team of students. Team leaders could be FFA advisors, crop consultants, extension staff, coop employees, etc.

Top-scoring teams win prizes: \$500 for first, \$250 for second, \$100 for third place. Top two teams will be eligible for regional competition held in Nebraska this year.

Teams will be expected to know the basics of scouting corn and soybean fields. This includes crop staging; looking for patterns of crop injury; disease, insect and weed seedling identification; etc. Other topics many include but are not limited to, pesticide safety, nutrient disorders, and herbicide injury.
