To receive the designation as a Nebraska 4-H Club of Excellence, clubs must meet the following:


- Have at least five members from at least three different families.

The 2023 Nebraska Make It With Wool contest will be held Saturday, November 18 beginning at 9 a.m. in Hastings at Adams County Extension Office, 2975 South Baltimore Avenue.

Open to youth and adults, participants model their creations in sewing, knitting, crocheting, spinning and weaving of wool fabrics and yarns. There is also a "Made for Others" category. The fabrics/yarns used for the wool contest must be 100% wool or wool blend (minimum 60% wool or specialty wool fiber). Specialty wool fibers include alpaca, angora, camel, cashmere, llama, mohair and vicuna.

Entry forms, wool samples, registration and wool testing fees are **due October 15** to Andrea Nisley, P.O. Box 757, Lexington, NE 68850.



This scholarship is available due to the generosity of *The Paul and Virginia Engler* Foundation. Paul is a native Nebraskan who through vision, hard work, sweat equity and tenacity built an exceptional career as an entrepreneur, industry leader, and dedicated advocate for building bridges for the next generation to cross.


The Engler program began in 2010 with a \$20 million gift over 10 years from the Paul F. and Virginia J. Engler Foundation. It is our honor and privilege to administer the thoughtful and intentional process of selecting scholarship recipients. However, the scholarship is only a small component of the value available to you through engagement in the Engler Agribusiness Entrepreneurship Program.

For academic year 2024-2025, the application will open on 10/1/23 and close on 1/15/24 at midnight.

The only requirements to apply for an Engler scholarship - declare a CASNR major and have participated in 4-H or FFA.

Awards range from \$1000 to \$4000 per school year. The Engler program awards approximately 80 scholarships annually. Over \$2,000,000 has been invested in students over the lifetime of the program. Students also can reapply each year during their undergrad time at UNL.

Students do not have to receive a scholarship to be involved in the Engler program. We are an open community whose mission is to empower our people on the courageous pursuit of their purpose through the art and practice of entrepreneurship.

4-H Achievement Application & Nebraska 4-H Foundation Scholarships

The Nebraska 4-H Achievement Application is a standard application form used for the selection of state award winners, including Nebraska delegates to National 4-H Congress and National 4-H Conference, as well as Nebraska 4-H Foundations scholarship recipients. The Achievement Application is for all 4-H participants ages 8-18. Applications are due to the Extension Office by December 1. The Nebraska 4-H Foundation offers 4-H members the opportunity to apply for scholarships. The Nebraska 4-H Foundation awards up to \$22,000 worth of scholarships each year to 4-H'ers from across the state. 4-H Diamond Clover Program

The Nebraska 4-H Diamond Clover program encourages 4-H youth to engage in a variety of programs, projects, and activities that will enable youth to acquire skills and abilities that will prepare them for success in the future. The program is designed to reach and recognize all youth engaged in 4-H, from club members and campers to school enrichment, afterschool, and special interest program participants.

The program consists of six levels that require a young person to plan and report a broad range of age-appropriate accomplishments. For each level, the Nebraska 4-H Diamond Clover program provides a list of accomplishments from which 4-H youth choose their goals. The accomplishments increase in quantity and difficulty for each level. At the beginning of the 4-H year, participants plan what to accomplish and at the end of the 4-H year, they report on their completed accomplishments. Successful completion of a level's Plan & Report form results in a 4-H youth earning that level of the Diamond Clover program.
