Exhibitor Numbers, Entry Forms, and tags may also be filled in at entry time. All items must be entered in the name of the producer/maker.

- 2. Entries are open to all Nebraska residents regardless of age unless otherwise specified.
- 3. All possible care will be taken, but the Madison County Ag Society will not be responsible for loss or damage to entries, including containers.
- 4. Each Exhibitor is permitted only one item in each class number.
- 5. Items must be clean and NOT PREVIOUSLY ENTERED, otherwise they will be disqualified. Items must be strictly grown/made by the exhibitor and completed since 2021 Fair, unless otherwise stated. For 2022 Fair, items must be grown in 2022.
- 6. All exhibitors will please note that only so much money is available for cash awards. In the event that total amount for the premiums exceed the budget, individual cash awards will be reduced by percentage to stay within budget.
- 7. NO "For Sale" signs will be permitted on entries.
- 8. Exhibits should be selected for type, uniformity, quality and maturity.
