Speakers-Viola McShannon has 3 confirmed-Marilyn Schmidt on troubleshooting growing houseplants; Pam Bergstrom on pollinator habitats and edible landscapes; and Kelli Feehan. She is working on another speaker.

Postcards-Vicki Rundell has ordered new postcards and is ready to mail the postcards from last year once we know some more details like speakers and vendors. Karen will get stamps when needed.

Credit Card reader-Diane Lukens reported that the scanner is working. We will add a charge of \$1 again for credit card sales. Kurt Schrant will be at the Ag Complex all day Friday to help.

Banners-sites discussed were 13th St. and Benjamin Ave., Victory Rd. and Benjamin Ave. and Benjamin Ave. and Hwy 35 and somewhere along 13th Street.
