President Viola McShannon called the meeting to order at 9:00am with 19 members present and one guest, Kate Pruitt. She thanked Laurie Larson and Emmalene Raasch for treats.

Mary Lux/Joyce Eucker motion to accept May minutes. Motion passed.

Treasurer Karen Zierke noted the treasurer's report was the same as in the newsletter (\$7,891.02).

#### Old Business

Discussion that was tabled at the May meeting ensued about deadlines for sponsors to submit their payments to be included in pre—Plant Fair advertising. Motion by Robin Jones/Kathy Duval: Sponsor payments due by March 1 to be included in flyer and advertisements. If sponsors pay after March 1, they can still be a sponsor/advisor but not in the flyer. This is then fair to those who do pay by the early deadline. Motion passed.

Elkhorn Valley Museum volunteers worked very hard but there is a long way to go. Libby, director at the museum was going to contact people to get mulch. At this time there is no mulch so can't move forward with some other tasks. There is water and the code to access the hose in the shed is OCN.

Seed Library has no seeds for the fall, but seeds are sought for the spring. Viola will try to organize monthly spring classes at the library.

#### **New Business**
