So how can you prepare for the fair? Read on to find out!

Pick up your pre-entry forms at the Extension Office. Pre-fair entry paperwork will not be mailed out.

On the pre-fair entry form, write the correct department, division, and class. Also include a description of the project to make it easier for us to input your registration. Find the classes in your 2018 4-H Fair Book or view the Fair Book online at https://extension.unl.edu/statewide/madison/2018%204-H%20Fairbook.pdf

Call Sarah or Kristen at 402-370-4040 if you are unsure which class best fits your project.

ONLY PRE-ENTERED PROJECTS INCLUDED ON YOUR ENTRY FORM WILL BE ACCEPTED AT THE FAIR. NO SUBSTITUTIONS.

If a pink sheet is included in your envelope, you enrolled in a clothing and textiles project and are eligible to model for the modeling judge AND the public style revue. You can model home environment textile projects, too, such as a quilt or pillow. Complete a separate pink sheet for each item and return with your pre-entry form. Those not modeling do not need to return the pink sheet.

- Pre-entry forms
- Pink sheets for style revue
- Quality Assurance
- ♦ Horse testing



Volunteer Screening Now On-line





this reason, volunteers are required to complete a screening with the Department of Health and Human Services. Madison County participated in the volunteer screening in 2016.

Nebraska 4-H is now using on-line screening. The process should be easier and the rotation schedule is now every five years instead of four years. If you have not completed this screening, you will receive an invitation with a link to the online system to fill out the application. The application should take less than 10 minutes to complete. Once submitted, it goes to the system for verification. You may receive an e-mail from DHHS.CFSCR@Nebraska.gov.

The one disadvantage is that DHHS are now charging \$2.50 for each check in Nebraska. Thankfully this year our State 4-H Office is covering the fee in 2018. So if you receive an invitation to complete this there will be no charge this year. Thank you for your time in volunteering for Madison County! Our program is a success because of volunteers like you!


2018 Design Camp

Youth Crop Scouting Competition -Connecting Youth with Crops

Looking for a fun club project to unite your members? Running out of ideas for club meetings? If you answered "yes", help is on the way! Nebraska Extension is pleased to present the 5th annual Crop Scouting Competition for Nebraska youth. Youth interested in crops have the opportunity to learn about crop growth & development and basic crop scouting principles.

This contest will be held at the ARDC near Mead, Nebraska, on July 26, 2018. The event will include both indoor and outdoor events. Teams of junior high and high school students (those completing 5-12 grades) from across Nebraska are invited to participate. Limited to the first ten teams to sign-up!

Top-scoring teams win prizes: \$500 for first, \$250 for second, \$100 for third place. Top two teams will be eligible for regional competition in August.

2018 Nebraska 4-H Online Horticulture Judging

The contest will be available from 8:00 a.m. Friday, June 8 through 8:00 a.m. Monday, June 18. It is open to all 4-H youth and adults. No password is needed; follow this link to the contest: https:// go.unl.edu/2018hortcontest

Youth must fill in all information completely. Only take the contest once. No study materials are to be used. Composed of three parts (general knowledge questions, plant part and seed identification, as well a judging portion), the contest allows participants to review the answers prior to submitting. Once submitted, the participants will see their score, but they will not be able to see which questions they missed. After June 18, the participants can request to see the answers.



To show your livestock at the Madison County Fair, Nebraska State Fair, and/or Ak-Sar-Ben, you must complete Youth Quality Assurance by June 13 at noon. See instructions below for completing your certification.

2018 Youth Quality Assurance Log In Instructions

- 1. Go to **yqca.org** from your computer browser and select Sign In/Register Tab
- 2. Sign in and register using the 4-H Online box
- 3. Select Nebraska 4-H Youth Development from the list
- 4. Use your 4-H Online user name and password to start
- 5. Select the member name taking the course
- 6. Select the age of the member in the appropriate box
- 7. When the age is selected, the appropriate courses will be selected
- 8. Select online choice
- 9. Select payment method **credit card**. Online training fee is \$12.00/exhibitor.
- 10. After completing the three courses, save and print a completion certificate and take it to the Extension Office
- 11. For swine exhibitors the number on your completion certificate will be used as the number that will be asked for by swine buyers in place of you PQA number.

If you are planning on competing at Districts and/or State this year you need to have your level 2 test done by May 1.

Level 1 needs to be complete for those showing only at the County Fair. Complete by June 13.

Showing animals? Or want to show off your 4-H pride? Buy a 4-H t-shirt! Cost is \$10.00 each. Call the Office by June 1 to order your t-shirts.

To show livestock and small animals, you must wear the 4-H emblem on either a t-shirt, armband, or chevron. Purchase 4-H chevrons or armbands at any time at the Extension Office.
