The Dan & Susan Monaghan 4-H Scholarship is offered to encourage Merrick County 4-H members to continue their education.

Application deadline is **January 15**. The top two applicants will each be awarded a \$250 scholarship. Winners will be announced at graduation time each year.

Awards will be granted upon scoring of application including review of Senior Achievement Application, essay and letters of recommendation. A selection committee composed of 4-H Council members will make the final decisions.

Eligibility Requirements

- Current 4-H member of Merrick County.
- Graduating high school senior at time of application.
- Enrolling in an accredited school (vocational or college) beyond the high school level.

Application Requirements



- Senior Achievement Application.
- A maximum three (3) page essay outlining how 4-H has helped me grow into a true leader and how I will continue to be involved in 4-H. Your story should be different from the Merrick County 4-H Scholarship application.
- One (1) photograph of applicant.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation. One (1) letter of recommendation must be different from the two (2) recommendations submitted for the Merrick County 4-H Scholarship. One (1) letter should reflect the applicant's growth and leadership through 4-H.
