# PLANT SCIENCE CONTESTS

## **GENERAL RULES -**

- **A.** 4-H members are eligible to participate in all contests regardless of projects carried except for the Fashion Show and Shooting Sports Contests. Project enrollment is required for these contests.
- B. REGISTRATION & PRE-ENTRY
  - Registration Form is required for: Communications Contest/Music Contest/Food Revue/Theater Arts Contest/Fashion Show (see deadline to register on each form)

If 4-H'er is not pre-entered as required, 4-Her may still participate but will lose premium for that event.

- C. Participants in Activities & Contests are divided into age group divisions (senior, intermediate, and junior). These age divisions differ from contest to contest so pay careful attention when registering.
- **D. RECOGNITION**: All 4-H members participating in these contests will be recognized as follows:
  - 1. A premium and ribbon will be awarded to all participants.
  - 2. The top three contestants in each class will receive medallions: Gold 1<sup>st</sup> place, Silver 2<sup>nd</sup> place, Bronze 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

### **DEPARTMENT F - DIVISION 500 - HORTICULTURE JUDGING CONTEST**

#### **COUNTY CONTEST GUIDELINES:**

- 1. Contestants will not be allowed to touch any plant material.
- 2. Members do NOT need to be enrolled in a 4-H horticulture project to participate.
- **3.** The list of plant materials is available from the Extension Office.
- **4.** Highest placing individuals in the county contest may be asked to participate on a State Fair Team, if eligible according to age.
- **5.** The skill level needed for this activity is not appropriate for Clover Kids.
- **6.** Participants will be required to participate in all of the following portions:
  - **Identification** Participants will identify 80 plant specimens by accepted common name as defined by the "Identification Answer Sheet." Participants will be given a plant list to use at the contest. The 80 specimen will include 20 flowers/indoor plants, 20 landscape ornamentals, 20 fruits/nuts/berries, and 20 vegetables. Specimens may be alive or preserved plant parts such as, but not limited to: stems, twigs, leaves, flowers, seeds, fruits, roots, bulbs, tubers, or plant products.
  - **Judging/Placing** Participants will be asked to rank two classes of items from best to worst based upon a set criteria. Each class is worth 50 points. Classes of four (4) each, will be judged on the basis of condition, quality, uniformity, true-to-type, and size. Classes can be taken from the list of four groups to be judged (fruits and nuts, vegetables and herbs, flowering and indoor plants, and woody ornamentals). Scores will be determined by a Hormel calculator. Oral reasons will not be given by contestants.
  - Exam Participants will complete a multiple choice/ true false exam worth 2 points per question. Junior and Intermediate divisions will receive a test with up to 25 questions; Senior division will receive a test with up to 50 questions. Questions will test the contestant's knowledge of cultural practices for horticultural crops, plant science, pesticides, horticultural careers and other topics related to the production, processing and consumption of horticultural crops.
