The ATV / Tractor Driving Contest will take place on Saturday, August 3rd at the fairgrounds. The contest registration will be from 8:00-8:30 AM, practice time with the equipment will be from 8:30-9:30 AM, and the contest will begin at 9:30 AM. **Riders will be required to demonstrate all safety guidelines before, during and after driving.**

ATV / Tractor Driving Dress Code:

- blue jeans and a Long-sleeved shirt
- protective eye wear
- gloves
- safety helmet
- shoes with a 1" heel

4-H attire is required for the TRACTOR DRIVING contest.

All Junior or non-experienced ATV drivers are encouraged to take the free ATV safety course at <u>https://atvsafety.org</u>. Click on "Sign-up for the ATV Ecourse" as you scroll down the page. You do not need to pay for the certificate of completion.

Livestock divisions will have weight requirements for premium sale eligibility. Livestock not meeting minimum or maximum weight requirements will not be eligible for premium sale.



Practices and the competition will be held near the restrooms at Rotary Lake. Two practices will be offered before the competition. Participation in one rifle practice this season is required to be able to participate in the competition. Participants must provide their guns and ammunition or arrange to use club equipment. We require closed toed shoes and long pants. Youth will shoot in 4 positions so please bring a mat or blanket for the ground. Practices will be outside so please plan accordingly.

Awards for Archery and BB Gun will be given out during the fair on Wednesday, August 14th at 3:00 PM in the Open-Air Building.

Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Certification Workshop Offered in Falls City

A Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Certification Workshop is scheduled for mid-August in Falls City. It will be held August 17-18 in Falls City. The early bird deadline to register for the workshop is August 9th.

Volunteers will have the opportunity to become certified as an adult (21 years and older) or apprentice (14-20 years old) leader. Four project areas will be offered at the Falls City Workshop – rifle, pistol, shotgun, and archery.

There is a minimum number of participants needed to offer these disciplines at the workshop. Workshop participants will learn under expert instruction from members of the Nebraska State 4-H Shooting Sports Training Team.

The registration fee is \$90 per person for initial certification or those individuals adding an additional discipline except for Apprentice Instructors. The registration fee for Apprentice Instructors (14 to 20 years of age) is \$80 for this workshop. The late registration fee is \$160 for both levels. This fee includes meals, supplies and program materials. Participants must make their own lodging arrangements. Registration on Saturday runs from 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.

While participants might need to bring limited, if any, equipment to the in-person discipline training site, there are a series of four National 4-H Shooting Sports online modules which individuals **MUST** complete prior to the training to become eligible for certification. Information on the modules and how to enroll, **4-H Shooting Sports Online User Guide,** can be accessed by using the link found on the Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports website under Calendar of 4-H Shooting Sports Events at https://4h.unl.edu/shooting-sports, under the "Falls City Workshop" - this provides step-by-step instructions on how to sign up for and complete the entire series of modules before the workshop. Individuals who have already completed the Online User Guide, they will be asked to choose a payment method. Participants are responsible for the \$20 one-time (per person) registration fee. The entire series of modules will take approximately 3-4 hours, so please plan some time accordingly.

Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Update Session Offered in Falls City – August 17th A Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Leader Update Session is scheduled for mid-August in Falls City on August 17th, 9am to noon, in Falls City. The early bird deadline to register for the Update training is August 9th.

The time has come to provide an update for all Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Instructors who received their training in <u>2018 or before</u>. Over the years there have been numerous curriculum changes, updates, and additions, with some major curriculum adjustments in the last few years. **Individuals who were certified in 2018 or prior must attend to keep their discipline certification**.

This Update Session is for adult or apprentice 4-H volunteer instructors who have previously attended a 4-H instructor training workshop in 2018 or prior years. This is a required update for existing instructors, NOT a training for new instructors. You MUST be a currently enrolled Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports volunteer leader in your county to attend.

Four disciplines will be offered for the morning session including archery, rifle, pistol, and shotgun sessions. Registration is at 8:30am and the program starts at 9am. Lunch is provided at noon. There is a minimum number of participants needed to offer each discipline session.

Registration fee must be paid by August 12th. Early bird registration by August 9th is **\$35** for the session. Late registration fee, after August 9th, is **\$60**. Fee includes program materials and lunch for the Update session. It does not include lodging.

Pre-Fair Judging – Friday August 9th INTERVIEW JUDGING - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

All static exhibits, except horticulture which will be entered on Sunday, will be brought to the 4-H Building by the exhibitor on Friday, August 9th. Each exhibit (including horticulture) will be interview judged with the exhibitor taking the item to the judge and discussing their exhibit. An adult may go with a 4-H'er for support, but the 4-H'er is expected to do the interview. It's the perfect opportunity for the 4-H'er to share their exhibit with the judge and exchange ideas.

In order to reduce wait time, interview judging must be scheduled. To make an appointment, <u>call the Extension Office at 402-274-4755 to set up your time to interview judge</u>. You will need to know how many exhibits you are bringing and the Division and Class Number for each exhibit. Appointments will be made on a first come, first serve basis. The office will use the division & class information to print entry tags. <u>These tags will be available for pick up in the office August 6th-8th</u>. If you can't pick them up, they will be waiting for you at the 4-H Building on Friday, the 9th. Plan to arrive 10 minutes before you are scheduled to interview.

CLOVER KID exhibits will also be entered on Friday, August 9th. (See Fair Book pages 115-116 for classes). Call the office to let us know which classes you are doing so we can print cards for you. Entry is from 3:00 – 7:00 PM. No appointment is necessary for Clover Kids, however they will be interviewed about their exhibits. **Clover Kids should bring horticulture exhibits with them on Friday, August 9th**.

Horticulture exhibits, (other than Clover Kids) will be judged on **Sunday**, **August 11th**, **from 3:00 – 6:00 PM**. (this includes Beautiful Buckets). Procedure is the same; you must <u>call the office to schedule an interview time for horticulture entries</u>. Large heavy Beautiful Buckets can be brought to the fair earlier and placed around the fairgrounds. The exhibitor and judge will go to the exhibit during judging. Smaller containers that can be handled easily should be left outside the 4-H Building and the 4-Her will place them on the fairgrounds after being judged.

What if a 4-H'er cannot be present to interview judge? Exhibits can still be brought to the 4-H building and will be judged. Exhibits will earn ribbons & premiums and be eligible for State Fair. They will <u>not</u> be eligible for TOP Awards. Please call the office with Division and Class Numbers so we can create tags for your entries.

Remember, you can still bring static exhibits to the 4-H Building even if you have NOT pre-entered them or scheduled an appointment. Just bring them to the 4-H Building on Friday, August 9th, from 3:00-7:00 PM. We will use a blank tag and you will need to wait for an open spot for interview judging.

DON'T FORGET – 4-H Attire is required for Interview Judging!

Procedure for Pre-Fair Judging

In an effort to eliminate wait time, interview judging will be by appointment. Our goal is always to get everyone through in a timely manner and as quickly as possible. (Our superintendents do their best to stay on schedule but sometimes that isn't possible. We ask for your patience if we fall behind.)

- 1. 4-H'ers should arrive 10 minutes prior to their first appointment time. Upon arrival, check-in at the registration table in the 4-H Building. Preprinted tags will be handed out if they haven't been picked up at the office. (If printed tags are not available, the 4-H'er must fill out blank tags.)
- 2. 4-H'ers take their exhibits to the table marked with the area in which it will be judged. (Example: food projects to the foods table and general areas items to the general areas table.)
- 3. After 4-H'ers have set their projects down at the corresponding tables, they will PROCEED to a designated waiting area where they will wait to be called to their appointments.
- 4. Once all their exhibits are judged, the 4-H'er is free to leave.
- 5. We want to have a quiet atmosphere for the judges to be able to concentrate while they are judging exhibits and selecting award winners. We must present the best conditions we can for them to do their job. Only persons working on committees and families waiting to be interviewed should be in the building. Cell phones should be shut off or on silent.

Interview Judging enhances the learning our youth experience with their projects!

4-H STATIC EXHIBIT SUPPORT AUCTION

4-H'ers who exhibit 5 or more static exhibits in the 4-H Building have the opportunity to place one of their static items on the 4-H Static Exhibit Support Auction. Two items are eligible if 10 or more static exhibits are entered with a max. of 2 items. 4-H'ers entering 2 animals in the Premium sale are not eligible to enter the 4-H Static Exhibit Support Auction. 4-H'ers entering 1 animal in the Premium sale are eligible to enter 1 item in the 4-H Static Exhibit Support Auction. The item to be placed on the 4-H Static Exhibit Support Auction is recommended to be one of their best items. Youth have the option to maintain ownership of their item or transfer ownership. The 4-H Static Exhibit Support Auction will be a silent auction where the items selected will be placed in a special area for display.

Exhibitors have until **10:00 AM on Monday** of the fair to contact the Extension Office by emailing or calling and leaving a voicemail, if they want to enter the 4-H Static Exhibit Support Auction. Youth must provide the following information:

- Which item you want to place on the auction
- If you want to retain ownership or transfer ownership
- What is the starting bid if transferring ownership

Those who do not contact the office by the deadline will not be a part of the auction. The auction will begin at 5:00 PM on Monday, and end at 5:00 PM on Wednesday.

4-H Static Exhibit Support Auction Bidding Guidelines:

- Bidders sign-up for a bidder number at the Hostess Table in the 4-H Building during the fair. Bidder must provide first and last name, address, email, and phone number.
- Minimum bids for items where the youth will retain ownership will start at \$5.00 per item. When ownership is transferred, the 4-H'er will determine the starting bid, to ensure cost recovery.
- All items on the auction will be assigned a number.
- Bidders can bid on a desired item number in the 4-H building at the hostess table.
- Bidders with the highest bid will be contacted and sent an invoice following the Nemaha County Fair requesting
 payment within a week.
- Items on the auction that are transferring ownership will be brought to the Extension Office after the fair and held there until the payment is received from the winning bidder. Once payment is received the item will be available for pick-up by the winning bidder.
- Cash or check payment can be taken. Please make checks payable to the Nemaha County 4-H Council.
- Support Auction checks will be held until a written thank you(s) to your buyer(s) is brought to the Extension Office addressed with a stamp and <u>READY</u> to be mailed by the Extension staff.
- All perishable items placed on the auction will be remade or picked fresh and delivered by the 4-H'er.
- A 5% commission is kept by the Nemaha County 4-H Council to be used to benefit the 4-H Youth Development Program in Nemaha County.


