

SHOTGUN 2023:

<u>Practice:</u> - Sunday, September 3rd from 2-4 PM, Tuesday, September 5th from 6-8 PM, Sunday, September 10th from 2-4 PM & Tuesday, September 12th from 6-8 PM

*Remember participation at **3** practices is required to be eligible to participate at the Shotgun Contest.

Participants must provide their own Firearm, ammunition, eye & ear protection, hat, jeans, boots, and range bag or shooting vest. Firearms need to be transported in a case.



*All practices and the contest are held at the Otoe County Wildlife Club west of Nebraska City.



Shooting Sports Instructor Certification Workshop

A Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Certification Workshop is scheduled for late October in Kearney. It will be held October 28-29 in Kearney. The early bird deadline to register for the workshop is October 18th.

Volunteers will have the opportunity to become certified as an adult (21 years and older) or apprentice (14-20 years old) leader. Six project areas and ambassador training will be offered at the Kearney Workshop – coordinator, rifle, pistol, shotgun, hunting skills, archery, and ambassador. Ambassador training will be held in conjunction with instructor's workshop and up to eight teens will be accepted at the training session. Please help recruit qualified teen leaders, ages 14-18, who are excelling in their shooting sports projects.

There is a minimum number of participants needed to offer these disciplines at the workshop. Workshop participants will learn under expert instruction from members of the Nebraska State 4-H Shooting Sports Training Team.

The registration fee is \$85 per person for initial certification or those individuals adding an additional discipline except for Apprentice Instructors and Ambassadors. The registration fee for Apprentice Instructors (14 to 20 years of age) and Ambassadors (14-18 years of age) is \$75 for this workshop. The late registration fee is \$150 for both levels. This fee includes meals, supplies and program materials. Participants must make their own lodging arrangements. Registration on Saturday runs from 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.

While participants might need to bring limited, if any, equipment to the in-person discipline training site, there are a series of four National 4-H Shooting Sports online modules which

individuals <u>MUST</u> complete <u>prior to the training</u> to become eligible for certification. Information on the modules and how to enroll, *4-H Shooting Sports Online User Guide*, can accessed by using the link found on the Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports website under Calendar of 4-H Shooting Sports Events

at https://4h.unl.edu/shooting-sports, under the "Kearney Workshop" - this provides step-by-step instructions on how to sign up for and complete the entire series of modules before the workshop. Individuals who have already completed the Online modules are not required to complete them again.

As individuals follow each of the instructions in the Online User Guide, they will be asked to choose a payment method. Participants are responsible for the \$20 (per person) registration fee. The entire series of modules will take approximately 3-4 hours, so please plan some time accordingly.

Achievement Night Awards

Question: How does a 4-H'er receive awards at Achievement Night?

Answer: Complete an Application

It's that time of year again when 4-H'ers are encouraged to record achievements and learning experiences from the past 4-H year so their achievements can be recognized.

At the State Level the 4-H Achievement Application is a standard application form used by senior 4-H'ers, age 15-18, for the selection of state award winners, including Nebraska delegates to National 4-H Congress and National 4-H Conference, as well as Nebraska 4-H Foundation scholarship award recipients.

At the County Level these applications are available for all ages, Junior, Intermediate and Senior, and will be used to award project medallions & pins along with top achievement trophies for each age division. Seniors will be eligible for the Fred Lockwood Outstanding Jr Leader Award. The Leadership Experiences part of the application will be used to determine the recipient of this award. (This award can only be won once.)

Clover Kids also have a record sheet they can complete to be eligible for an award.

Completion of the 4-H Achievement Application is also an opportunity to earn Bonus Bucks. <u>The Awards Committee will award Bonus Bucks and Camp Scholarships (maximum \$150) based on the Achievement Application. Don't miss this opportunity.</u> Bonus Bucks can be used to purchase 4-H t-shirts, and armbands and pay for workshop fees, camps, and CWF. Submit your Achievement Application to the Extension Office by SEPTEMBER 25 (paper copy to the office by 5:00 pm or email electronic copy by 11:59 p.m.)

ADDITIONAL AWARD OPPORTUNITIES

- -Character Counts! Award Requires a form and essay. Winner receives a small plaque and his/her name is added to a plaque that is hanging in the Extension Office. (This award can only be won once.)
- -**Diamond Clover Award** This program consists of six levels that require 4-Hers to plan and report a broad range of age-appropriate accomplishments. These awards are given out at the Achievement Celebration.
