

Dawes County 4-H Foundation

Purpose: The Foundation was established to provide financial support for a broad range of 4-H activities in Dawes County that will educate and develop the skills and knowledge of our 4-H members, families and leaders through the 4-H program. It may also be used to promote 4-H in the broadest sense.

Who Benefits: All Dawes County 4-H'ers and their leaders are eligible for direct monetary support from the Foundation. Indirectly, the entire community benefits from the skills, knowledge and improvements that make our county a better place to live.

What kind of Projects will be funded: Use your imagination! Any kind of project that qualifies under the broad scope of 4-H related activities is eligible. Examples of kinds of projects funded are:

Leader Training:

- Attendance at State 4-H Conference (Have attended WY Conference)
- Camp Counselor Training
- Attendance at National 4-H Leader Forum
- Attendance at Natural Resources Leadership Camps

4-H Members:

- Attendance to State Contests
- Attendance to State or Regional Shows
- Camp Counselor Training

Club Educational Tours:

- Wool Mills
- Feed Lots
- Wood Mills
- Meat Processing Plants
- Clothing Manufacturing
- Food Processing
- Metal & Steel Factory

Improvements:

- 4-H Building - Finish back room with knotty pine, insulation and lighting
- Showers and concessions
- Exhibit Space
- Beef wash rack
- Panels for arena
- Swine/rabbit/poultry building
