>>> 4-H FOUNDATION GRANTS

The Otoe County 4-H Foundation has allocated funding to provide grants to Otoe County 4-H Members and 4-H Clubs to strengthen 4-H in Otoe County. The mission of the Otoe County 4-H Foundation is to enhance 4-H programming, secure financial support for local 4-H programs, and to develop area youth for future generations. Successful grants would assist the 4-H Foundation in achieving its mission. Grant requests can be between \$50 and \$500. Deadlines for submitting grants are **November 30th** and **February 28th** each year.

All 4-H Clubs are encouraged to write a grant application, but 4-H Foundation policy is that 4-H Clubs are limited to submitting two grants per year. Grant application forms can be found on the <u>Otoe County Foundation</u> page of the Otoe County Extension site.

NEBRASKA 4-H PROGRAM FRAMEWORK




>>> 4-H STEM CHALLENGE





