	<b>Nebraska 4-H Senior Achievement Application</b>	4-H Members ages 15-18 This application is used for the selection of county and state awards including the selection of delegates to the National 4-H Congress and National 4-H Conference and selection of recipients of Nebraska 4-H Foundation Scholarships.
	<b>Nebraska Diamond Clover</b>	4-H Members ages 8-18 This Program consists of six levels that require a 4-Her to plan and report a broad range of accomplishments from their goals. The accomplishments increase for each level. At the beginning the 4-Hers set their goals and report on their accomplishments. Successful completion of a level's Plan & Report form result in the 4-H youth earning that level of the Diamond Clover Program.

	<b>Junior &amp; Senior Outstanding Citizenship Award</b>	Tell about service projects done and/or any other information that displays good citizenship. Junior – 11 to 13. Senior – 14 or older.
	<b>Junior &amp; Senior Outstanding Volunteer Award</b>	Tell about the number of hours volunteered and the different volunteer service activities you performed. Junior – 11 to 13. Senior – 14 or older.

<b>Memorable 4-H Experience Award</b>	Choose any area of 4-H and tell why your experience will never be forgotten.
<b>4-H Flop Award</b>	Projects other than livestock/animals. Tell what project flopped or was unsuccessful and why. What did you learn?
