What to Expect



During your stay at the National 4-H Conference Center in Chevy Chase, Maryland, you will have an opportunity to exchange ideas and form friendships with other youth from diverse backgrounds. Together, you will grow to understand the importance of civic and social responsibilities and how they relate to becoming better citizens and leaders.

To have fun meeting new people, you have to be comfortable talking about yourself and be able to inquire and listen to others who may be different than you. Before the trip, practice introducing yourself to others in your community or in

our delegation. Learn some discussion starters that will make meeting new people easier. For example, "Hi! My . I noticed that you are from Montana. Is it true that there isn't a speed limit in Montana? Do teens have a speed limit?"

CWF Code of Conduct

For the benefit and safety of all, a few rules are a must. Delegates attending Citizenship Washington Focus are expected to participate fully in all sessions and abide by the established rules. Rules include but are not limited to the following:

- Quiet is to be observed in sleeping room areas after specified times each night. All participants are to be in their own rooms at such times. During other hours, boys and girls may NOT be in the same sleeping room.
- The use of alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs is NOT permitted.
- All participants shall respect the property and facilities used during this event and assume financial responsibility for any damages they cause.
- All participants are responsible for attending all scheduled activities during the event. Unauthorized absences are not permitted.

All participants should have respect and show courtesy for programs and speakers in progress by remaining for the entire program. Participants also should show courtesy when taking flash photos during speeches and entertainment.

Failure to comply with the CWF or Nebraska 4-H Code of Conduct rules may result in the delegate being sent home at the parents' expense.

Terms You Should Know

Cabinet

An advisory board to the President, consisting of the heads of the 13 executive departments of the federal government.

Congressional Record

The daily record of House Floor debate and votes.

Constituents

The residents of a district represented by a member of Congress.

Engrossed

The final version of proposed legislation passed by one chamber of Congress.

Federal Government

The central government of the United States that includes the three branches of government — legislative, executive and judicial.

• Hopper

A box into which a proposed legislative bill is dropped. Once the bill has been dropped in the hopper, it is officially introduced to the House.

House Leadership

The Speaker of the House and House Majority and Minority leaders.

Impeach

To bring an accusation of misconduct against someone.



•Members-elect

People elected to serve in the U.S. House of Representatives who have not yet been administered the Oath of Office.
