
Gosper County Bucket Calf Record Book

This record book is a required portion of the Bucket Calf (ages 8-11) Project and must be completed and turned in when your bucket calf is checked in at the County Fair.

PURPOSES of the BUCKET CALF PROJECT:

- 1. To design a cattle project fit for the physical size and maturity level of younger youth.
- 2. To teach proper health care and nutritional requirements of young cattle.
- 3. To teach basic beef management skills without a large investment.
- 4. To teach basic record keeping skills.
- 5. To provide youth (ages 8-11) the opportunity to become involved in showing livestock.

GUIDELINES:

- 1. Bucket Calf: An orphan or newborn calf, male or female, dairy, beef or cross, fed on bucket or bottle.
- 2. Begin Project: Select and/or purchase a calf born between January 1 and June 1 of the current project year within two weeks of birth.
- 3. Identification: Tag bucket calf with the family farm tag or a county 4-H tag by June 10 of current 4-H year.
- 4. Record: Complete the following information to the best of the youths ability.
- 5. Fair Classes: Calves may be shown on halter in the 4-H aged (8-11) Bucket Calf Class.
 - a. Premiums will be awarded to Bucket Calf 4-H members, please see current year Phelps & Gosper 4-H Premium Book for the information.
 - b. The Gosper 4-H Beef Committee will review the Bucket Calf record books.
 - c. The 4-H ages Bucket Calf Class will be awarded ribbons and a Champion and Reserve Champion Bucket Calf will be selected by the Beef Judge. Placings will be based on: 1. The completion of the Bucket Calf record book; 2. How the bucket calf is presented in the ring; and 3. Oral questions asked by the Beef judge in the ring.

BASIC INFORMATION:

- 1. <u>Livestock Affidavits</u>: You will need to fill out the County Bucket Calf Livestock Affidavit and turn that into the office by the June 10, current year, deadline
- 2. <u>Ear Tags</u>: For the Bucket Calf project, a farm ear tag OR a county ear tag will be sufficient for identification purposes. Please indicate the calf number on the livestock affidavit.
- 3. What has the 4-H'er learned about caring for and raising a calf?
- 4. Showing, with emphasis on how much the 4-H'er has learned and can do without help. Parental guidance IS encouraged.
- 5. Completion of record sheets to the best of the members' ability
- 6. Calf is to be washed, brushed and combed only. No clipping or other practices common to showing more mature animals are to be done.
